

Although WA has now moved to Phase 4 and COVID restrictions are easing, we please ask the public to still adhere to the signs upon entry to the office and follow the 1.5m social distancing measures in place and practice personal hygiene.

#### 2020/21 Rates Notices

Shire of Wickepin rates will be issued following the August ordinary meeting of council. To ensure you receive your rates notice and to alleviate possible interest charges on late payments, please make sure we have your correct postal address on record and advise if any changes of ownership are required.

#### **Pensioner Rebate**

If you hold one of the following cards, are a property owner, and were living at that property as your "ordinary place of residence" as at July 1 of the rating year, you may be eligible for a State Government rebate on your Rates and Emergency Services Levy.

- Pensioner Concession Card;
- · WA State Seniors Card;
- Commonwealth Seniors Health Card and WA State Seniors Card; or
- State Concession Card

You may also be entitled to a rebate if you have life tenancy under the terms of a will.

If you have already registered, the rebate will be shown on your notice as "State Government Rebate".

If you were previously registered for a Seniors Rebate and you now have a Pensioner Concession Card or Commonwealth Seniors Health Card, you should complete a new application to receive an increased rebate amount.

If you have purchased a new property and you had a rebate last year on the property that you sold, the rebate does not automatically transfer to your new property. You must complete a new application.



# IN THE KITCHEN

#### Winter warmers

Try this Thai Recipe to help keep you feeling creative in the kitchen!

#### Instant Pot Thai Curry Chicken

A simple delicious recipe for Curry Chicken and veggies. Fast, healthy and full of incredible Thai flavour!

#### **Ingredients**

- 1 tablespoon oil
- 2 shallots, chopped (or 1 onion)
- 2 teaspoons fresh ginger, finely chopped
- 4 garlic cloves, rough chopped
- 750 gm Boneless, skinless chicken thighs or breasts, cut into one-inch pieces.
- 2–4 tablespoons Thai red curry paste.
- 1 x 400ml can coconut milk.
- 1 cube chicken stock
- · 2 tablespoons fish sauce
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar.

- 4 kefir lime leaves (optional)
- optional veggies (4-5 cups) cubed potatoes, carrots, cauliflower, capsicum, snow peas, peas, green beans, asparagus or even fresh pineapple chunks! - separate slow-cooking veggies from quick-cooking veggies
- 2 tablespoons lime juice
- garnishes lime wedge, bean sprouts, ¼
   cup fresh basil (a must) and Thai basil really
   elevates this!

#### Instructions:

- Set your grain to cook on the stove. Quinoa, rice or noodles!
- In a heavy base pan, heat oil and add shallot, ginger and garlic, and saute until fragrant and golden, about 2-3 minutes. Add chicken, stir, and just give a quick sear, just 2-3 minutes. Add red curry paste (I like about 3 tablespoons for medium spicy), cook one minute, then add coconut milk, chicken stock cube, fish sauce, brown sugar and optional kefir lime leaves.

Give a stir to combine. At this point, add any veggies that need <u>longer cooking</u>—like potatoes, parsnips, carrots, cauliflower (cut into larger, 1 inch chunks).

- Simmer sauce down a bit to reduce it, add any quick-cooking veggies- snow peas, capsicum, asparagus and simmer for 3-4 minutes or until veggies are just tender, yet still bright and snappy.
- Add lime juice. Taste, adjust salt and heat (add more curry paste for more spicy).
- Serve over your grain, topping with fresh basil, lime wedge and bean sprouts!

Garden Snippets....



..Bird Haven..

Encourage Native Birds to your garden by installing a BirdBath to keep them cool and hydrated...

All birds enjoy bathing. They love the opportunity to splash, roll and play in puddles of water, and they also need plenty of water to drink all year around, and especially in hotter months.

Clean, cool water under a leafy tree is a great kindness to them, and can sometimes be one of the hardest necessity for birds to find.

#### So, Install a Birdbath....


Many people believe that water will attract more birds to your garden than a feeder will, so a birdbath is one of the easiest ways to bring birds up close where you can have a good look at them.

Make sure you keep your birdbath either on a pedestal or hung from a tree to make it easier to clean, and also keep birds safe from predators.

It is very easy to create and make your own using a few rocks, bricks, wrought iron legs of somesort, or other such item for the pedestal, with a suitable sized shallow bowl for the water container.

Place your birdbath amongst shrubbery, for shade, and use a small sprinkler for the water to create a most inviting cool spot for birds to gather.

You will soon have a menagerie of birdlife flitting around your garden.





# CANCELLATION OF THE 2020 KULIN BUSH RACES 03/06/2020

#### **KULIN HOLDS THE REINS ON 2020 BUSH RACES EVENT**

After a complete sell-out in 2019, the Kulin Bush Races Committee has regrettably announced the cancellation of its iconic regional event in 2020 due to COVID-19 restrictions.

For the past 25 years, the not-for-profit event, which is held every October, has attracted around 4,000 punters to the small Wheatbelt community. The event has raised much needed funds for local projects and communities in Kulin, such as, medical facilities, youth programs, the RFDS and other community facilities.

The Kulin Bush Races Committee, a group of local voluntary community members, waited for as long as possible in the hope that circumstances may have allowed them to bring yet another amazing race experience. However, with the uncertainty surrounding COVID-19, a decision was made at their last meeting to formally suspend what would have been their 26th event.

The newly elected Chairman, Tom Murphy, said, "Whilst the committee was incredibly disappointed, the strange new world was forcing the Kulin community and committee to slow down and use this break to focus on other important aspects of our event. We are putting our efforts into a new website and refreshing our branding, as after 25 years, both of these need a facelift and it will also create a better online experience for our race-goers."

Other initiatives would include getting involved in town projects and revamping some of the race-track amenities. Most importantly, the committee were continuing their planning of how to come back bigger and better in 2021.

"The whole reason for the Bush Races is to make Kulin a better place to live and visit," stated Tom.

"We want our patrons to be well looked after when they visit and whilst our committee have already been working tirelessly on an event we will have to cancel, some of the team are actually looking forward to a year off after 25 busy years!"

In the meantime, they urged Western Australians to get out and explore our amazing region, support local businesses and most importantly, start planning their trip out to Kulin in October 2021 because the community would be ready for them!

Tom Murphy said, "From a personal perspective, it has been a bizarre situation, as I have just taken over the reins from Graeme Robertson who, after 25 years of service to the committee as Chairperson, stepped down after the 2019 event."

"I would never have thought I'd have to cancel my first event as chairperson!"

"But it's such a privilege to be part of a dedicated and community minded committee who, given the opportunity to have a year off, just want to keep going."

Former Chairman Graeme Robertson said, "In all honesty, it has been a difficult decision for all involved, but the committee and community would learn some great lessons from this and would only add to its resilience."

And on reflection of his decision to hand the gauntlet to Victorian-born Tom, Graeme laughed that, "Regardless of COVID -19, the committee has learnt a really valuable lesson in handing over the chair to a Victorian!"

"But in all seriousness, we love running such an iconic event and seeing the joy it brings to our patrons, so bring on 2021!"

In the meantime, the Kulin Bush Races Committee are urging people to keep an eye on their social media as they still have a bit of fun planned for later in the year. They also encouraged all event goers, past and future, to stay safe and they looked forward to welcoming them back to Kulin in the near future.

#### STOP PUPPY FARMING BILL HAS TAIL THAT WAGS THE DOG

Member for Roe, Peter Rundle says the State Government's Stop Puppy Farming bill has turned into a dog's breakfast after amendments to recognise farmers' needs for working canines were rejected by Labor.

Mr Rundle said he strongly supported stamping out intensive puppy farming.

The proposed legislation however, caught too many in its net, including farmers who, if the bill is passed, will have to get local government approval to breed pups and ensure a supply of working dogs.

"Puppy farming is reprehensible – it is important we push for improved welfare for all animals and despite what the Premier claims, The Nationals don't oppose this bill, we just want to make it better," he said.

"However, this bill presented by the Labor Government impacts on farmers' ability to breed the specific type of dog needed in their work.

"By ensuring farmers could be granted exemptions to produce farm dogs, which is what The Nationals were seeking, WA would be in line with other States and the legislation would also recognise the vital role working dogs play in our agricultural sector.

"A working dog can be worth as much as \$40,000 to a farm business so the changes were critical to ensuring breeding stock wouldn't be compromised by the legislation.

"While the amendments were defeated last night we will continue to fight for these changes in the Upper House."

Mr Rundle said it was disappointing greyhounds were specifically mentioned in the proposed legislation but the same courtesy wasn't extended to farm working dogs.

The Nationals WA Local Government spokesperson Shane Love put forward the amendments in Parliament after consultation with Dogs West, Pastoralists and Graziers Association WA, WA Farmers Federation and WA Local Government Association.

Mr Love wanted the legislation to exempt working dog owners and Dogs West members from being forced to become registered breeders. Farm dogs would also not be required to be sterilised after two years of age to allow mature breeding.

"Dogs West owners and breeders represent the highest possible standard of dog ownership in Western Australia," he said.

"They already have rigorous processes in place to ensure their membership has the highest standards of animal welfare in place, including restrictions on the number of dogs a person can own and the number of litters a dog can safely have.

"None of these animal welfare standards exist within the Labor Party's proposed legislation.

"In addition, the Minister hasn't engaged with Local Government properly to ensure ratepayers don't bear the financial burden of this legislation."
