A long time popular former resident of Wickepin, Juli Auld, married Allan Beard in Geraldton in July. All the family was present and a happy time was had by all.



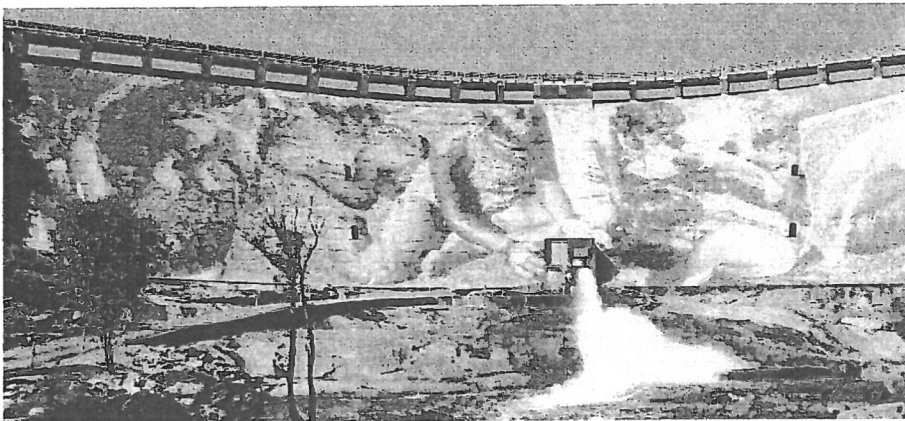
Tuesday morning August 17 saw the Wickepin Health Centre bus out and about fairly early in the day. Chris L and Helen Bunter gathered up some seniors to take to Collie.

We travelled straight to Wellington Dam where we had a sumptuous morning tea then were able to drive down and across the front of the dam and park where we had a good view of the murals.

The 6.500 sq metre mural is part of Collie's Mural Trail. It was done using a special platform and is done in Sepia color.

Back to Collie and to the Federal Hotel for lunch before going to the Anglican church which was built in the early 1900's with a donation from a widow, Mrs Noyes, in England. This has another large but old mural. Down the street to the Woolworths precinct where there was another spray painted large mural. 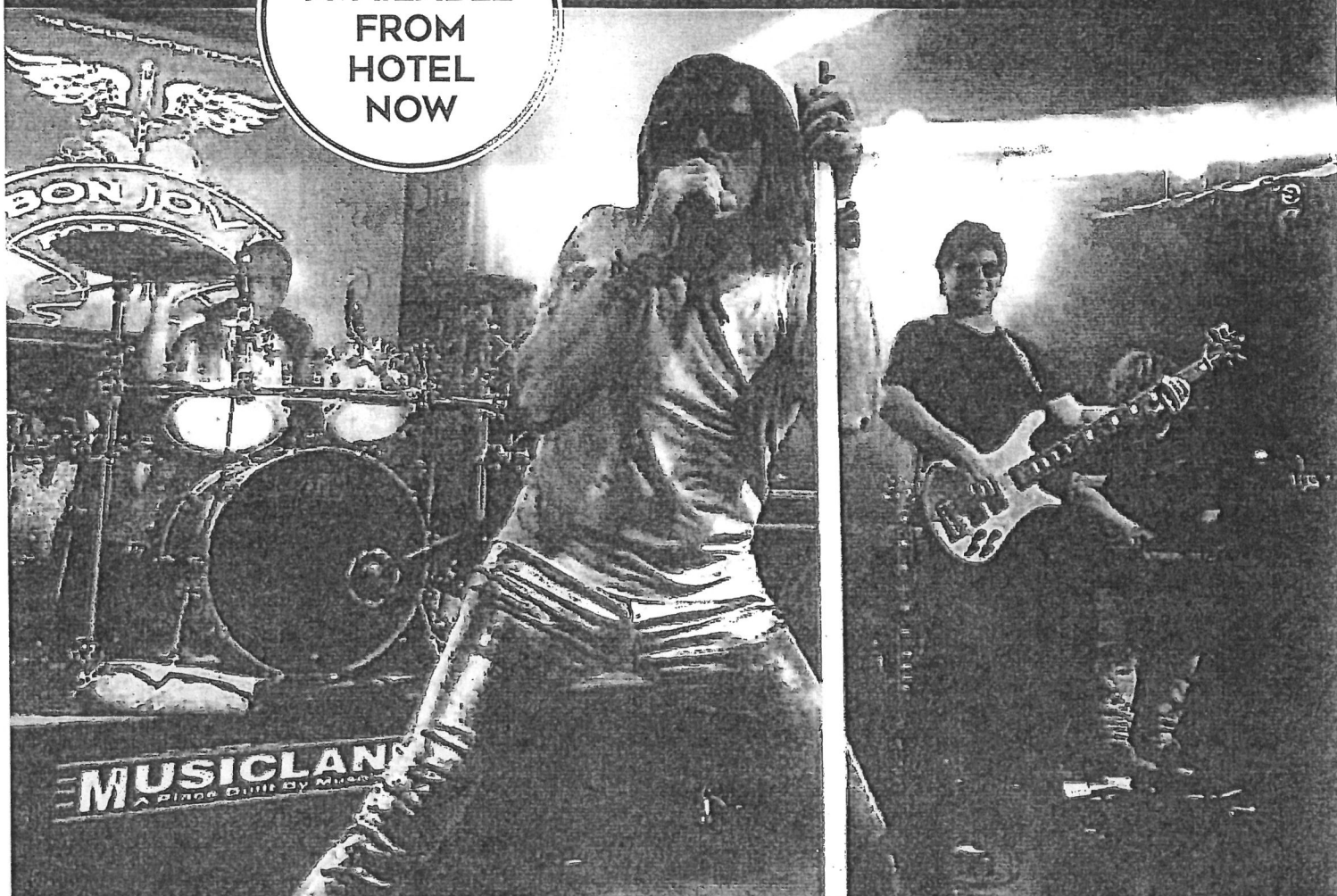

BUDGET 2021/22

Council adopted its 2021/2022 budget on 18 August 2021 and resolved to increase the GRV rates by 2% and UV rates by 2% on 2020/2021, levying a total of \$1,520,267. With properties being re-valued in 2021/22 some properties with valuation increase may have a rate rise. Minimum rates have risen to \$500.

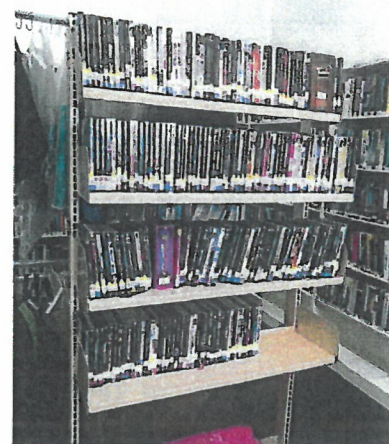

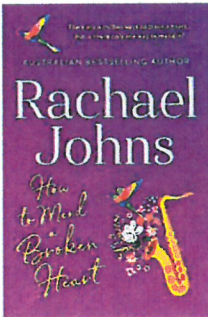

Felicity Bell has struggled to move on after her marriage broke down. Her ex has found love again and it's beginning to feel like her only comfort comes from her dog and her job as a taxidermist. So when Flick gets an offer to work in New Orleans, she's drawn to the chance to make a fresh start. Zoe is ready to start a family with her husband, but when he betrays her, she's left shattered and desperate for a change. As they attempt to head off the cataclysm, Jeannine does what she can to sustain Aleq, who shoulders both a crushing guilt and the hopes of a world searching for answers.



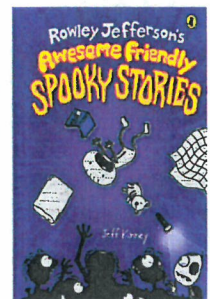
DVD Adult Comedy **Baby Done**

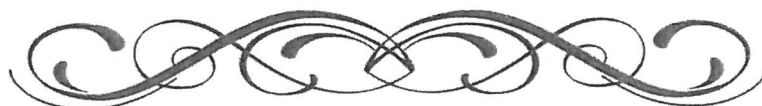

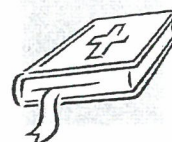

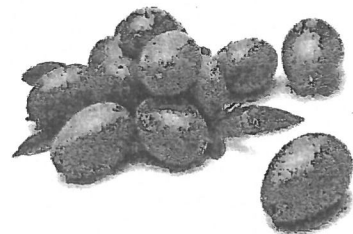

DID YOU KNOW?

STORING CUMQUATS



Cumquats start to deteriorate from the moment they are picked, so use them straight away. Or, if necessary, store them in a cool place, in a single layer on kitchen paper, disposable cloths or clean old tea towels, for no more than 24 hours.

IN THE KITCHEN

Honey Prawns



Ingredients

2 tsp cornflour
1/2 cup Chicken Liquid Stock
1/3 cup honey
1 1/2 tbs peanut oil
1 kg green prawns deveined peeled
1 carrot cut diagonally medium peeled
1 garlic clove crushed
2 tsp sesame seeds
150 g snow peas
4 spring onions cut into strips
2 cups rice to serve

Method

Mix cornflour with a little stock until smooth, then stir in remaining stock and honey. Heat wok over medium-high and add 1 tablespoon oil. Stir-fry prawns in batches for 2-3 minutes, or until just turning pink, set aside. Heat remaining oil in wok and stir-fry carrots for 3-4 minutes until just tender. Add garlic, honey mixture, sesame seeds and spring onions. Stir-fry for 2 minutes until sauce thickens.

Brekky banana splits

7 Ingredients

2 Method Steps

Serves 2

2 large bananas, peeled, halved lengthways
Corn Thins
130g (1/2 cup) vanilla yoghurt
1 tbsp natural sliced almonds, toasted
Fresh berries, to serve
1 tbsp natural sliced almonds, toasted
1 tbsp pepitas
Maple syrup, to serve

Peel and halve bananas lengthways and arrange on 2 serving plates. Cut 1 Corn Thin into wedges and crumble the other. Divide yoghurt between the plates. Top with mixed fresh berries, pepitas and the crumbled Corn Thins. Add the Corn Thins wedges and drizzle with maple syrup.

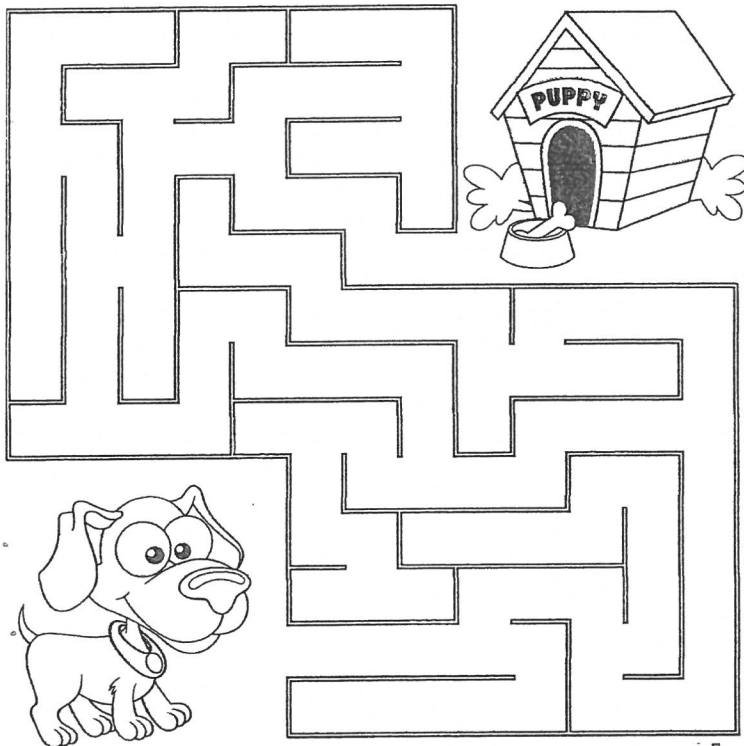

GUIDELINES

In my role as your local State Member, I am always pleased to support local community groups through donations and sponsorship. In addition to those groups I support throughout the year at their request, I've created "Mia's Local Hero Grants", designed to provide small donations to not-for-profit community groups within the Central Wheatbelt electorate. Grants of up to \$250 each will be made available, by application, to support those organisations working hard to enrich and support our communities.

Who can apply?

Not-for-profit community groups based in the electorate of Central Wheatbelt (see attached electorate map). Groups do not need to be incorporated, but must have been in operation for a minimum of 12 months.

How often can a group apply?

Eligible groups can submit one application per round. Applicants that are successful cannot apply again within the same year.

How much can a group apply for?

Grants will be up to \$250, inclusive of GST. There will be a limit on the number of grants allocated in each round so get creative and wow me with your application!

Grant dates

This grant round will open on Monday 16 August and close Friday 10 September at 4pm.

Successful groups will be notified as soon as possible following the closing date. The awarding of the funds will be at the discretion of Hon Mia Davies MLA, Member for Central Wheatbelt.

How to apply

Tuesday 10th August 2021,

On the passenger seat next to me in my car I had dropped the latest issue of the Watershed News with the saying 'Today is going to be awesome' on the cover. I was about to leave Wickepin at 10.30am to drive to Perth, it was pouring rain.

Drive to Perth, look out for fallen trees, water over the road and driving through heavy rain with minimal visibility, on the road from Wickepin to Pingelly with which I was not really familiar. The rain stopped just out of Wickepin, the sun shone and the scenery was just spectacular. The sun catching the yellow canola crops, interspersed with green crops, water everywhere, running off everything. Intermittent more showers and numerous slowdowns for water over the road.

One truck was bad enough but three in a row and driving blind hoping the car in front of me hadn't stopped because I couldn't see anything. My hands were holding on tight to the wheel, my heart was pounding and I was thinking, this is madness.

Really glad to get to Armadale sun was shining and I couldn't believe the line up at the first drive through coffee stop. I counted 12 cars in line as I drove past. Just as well I don't drink coffee because I wouldn't have the patience to line up.

Stopped at Bullcreek Shopping Centre for the inevitable bathroom visit and get something to eat. When leaving the centre to return to my car, heavy rain caused a few of us to stop and wait until the shower passed. Struck up a conversation with a woman also waiting, as I am inclined to do, she told me she wasn't in a hurry because she was waiting to visit her daughter who was in hospital having an operation to have both breasts removed. This woman also told me that her grandmother, mother and she had had a breast removed. For once I was lost for words, but she reassured me that the family were grateful for the technology that had been developed for early diagnosis of the "wrong gene", her words, and that her daughter's decision to have the operation was hopefully to prolong her life.

We parted and getting back into my car, I noticed the Watershed News on the passenger seat and the word 'awesome' jumped out and I thought how extremely humbling the conversation had been and that there are truly 'awesome' people and amazing nature out there.

The drive home the next day was vastly different as far as weather was concerned, there was water over the road everywhere and the fallen trees made the trip slower than usual, but I couldn't get the Mother at Bullcreek out of my mind and I can only hope all goes well for her and her daughter.

The rink winners were Steve Strahan, Jim Williams (Yealering), John Melvin, Peter Bransby, Dave Astbury and Bob Read.

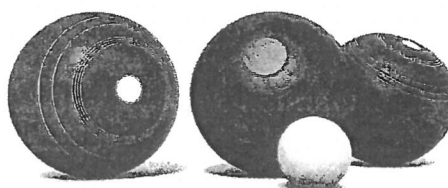
