EULOGY
JAMES RAYMOND HALLIDAY
24.9.1928 – 10.2.2022



James Raymond Halliday, also known as Doc, was born on 24th September 1928 in Wickepin hospital to Michael Bruce and Margaret Kathleen Halliday (nee Hosking) a younger brother to Bruce. Sister Irene was born in 1930 and younger brother Doug in 1934.

When Ray started school they lived on Hoskings farm (now Geoff Simms) and it was a 3 mile ride on horse and cart to church corner on the North Toolibin road. This he did for 2 years and then they moved to Wickepin opposite the school.

They then moved to what would be the Halliday farm, Brooklands, when he was 12 and he caught the bus to Wickepin.

He left school at the end of 1941 to help on the farm with harvest due to the war.

They moved to Pip McCauliffes farm to manage it while Pip was at war and they managed both farms.

Ray started shearing and also contract seed grading for 3 months a year for Hannafords. He shored with Ben Ballard for 3 years and then worked with Neil Whyte, Ian Knox and Eddie Reynolds.

From 1948 to 1952 Ray contract carted bags of grain to Toolibin on a V8 Ford truck he leased. Sometimes in tandem with Peter Elson and as far as Ray knew he and Peter set a record of loading 110 bags in 11 minutes.

Ray went to Bunbury on holidays with Neil Whyte and Brian Phoebe in 1950 or '51 where he met the love of his life, Betty Margaret Mitchell at a dance. They became engaged for 12 months and married in Bunbury on 6th February 1954. They were married for 68 years. One of Betty's best friends was Gay Goodwin and her husband Alan became Ray's best friend.

Ray went share farming on Fred Doney's in 1953.

After Ray and Betty were married they stayed on the Doney farm for 3 years, some of this time was on Maurie Doney's.

During this time son Rodney was born in November 1954. They moved back to the Halliday farm for a few months until daughter Shirley was born in March 1957. A few weeks later they moved to Bunbury where Ray commenced work at Dorsett Motors Ford Dealership working in second hand parts and car wrecking. Cellio Novell was a panel beater there and they were to become best of friends. Ray later transferred to the service station side of the business.

The family moved back to Wickepin late 1959 to a house on Collins street. They then purchased a house in Johnston street where they were to remain.

In 1960 Ray purchased an International truck and then went to Perth and purchased a semi trailer.

Doug made a sheep crate for it and Ray did sheep carting for about 6 years when an employee rolled the truck on Cuballing corner and the sheep crate was destroyed. Also taking the crate off he would cart bags of super back from Kwinana.

Ray's father Bruce purchased a block of land at the back of the farm for Ray when he was about 16 for about 2 shillings an acre. Brother Bruce also had a block next door. Ray started clearing his block before going to Fred Doney's in 1953 and Bruce was doing clearing while Ray was in Bunbury. While Ray was truck driving he was also clearing the land and he planted his first crop in 1962 or '63.

Ray purchased Bruce's farm in 1964 and took his first load of sheep to the block with George Black in 1964.

Ray leased the original Halliday farm, Brooklands, for 3 years in 1972 from his mother and Doug and then purchased. All 3 blocks were adjoined and gave the farm approximately 3800 acres.

Ray employed Stan Kirby to assist on the farm about 1966/67. Rodney finished school at the end of 1969 and went to work on the farm in time to assist with harvest. Stan stayed on the farm for a few more years.

Ray and Rodney ran the farm until the end of 1984 when it was leased out for 3 years and then sold.

In 1978 Shirley married Rick Elson and they had 3 children, Amanda in 1979, Tegan 1982 and Brendan 1984.

Rodney married Denise Mitchell in 1992 and had 2 step daughters, Nicole and Hope. Ray and Betty doted on their grandchildren and later 15 great grandchildren.

Rodney divorced in 2008. He met Heather Blanch in 2012 and they are still together. Heather had 2 sons and a daughter, Barry, Jason and Christine.

Ray enjoyed his sport and played football, tennis, golf and bowls and he also enjoyed the social side of sport.

SYDNEY II: LOST AND FOUND

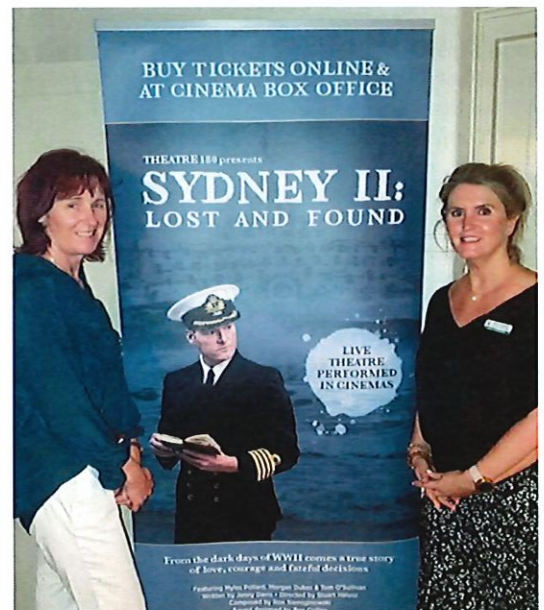
Theatre 180 returned to Wickepin to kick off their regional tour of HMAS SYDNEY II: Lost and Found and they did not disappoint the audience.

When HMAS Sydney II was sunk by the German Raider HSK Kormoran in November 1941 off the coast of Western Australia in November 1941, it took with her the entire crew of 645 men, along with the hopes and dreams of a nation as the war arrived on our doorstep. Among the Sydney's crew was a young Western Australian Able Seaman, Allan Rowe. Recently wed, Allan had only just learned that he was to be a father. For 66 years, Allan's wife, Jessie, and their daughter, Ellen, hoped that one day the wreck of The Sydney would be located. In 2008, due to the persistence of the volunteer Directors of the Finding Sydney Foundation, that dream became true.

This epic story of love and loss, fear and courage, and the resolution of a mystery for those who persisted and never gave up hope, encapsulated the audience as they were taken along the journey. The audience was amazed at the acting ability of the artists as they transformed from one character to the next, faultlessly. Combined with the cinematic background, along with the sound and lighting, made this production engaging for the audience who may not have usually attended live theatre.

At the end of the show, the leaving audience expressed their gratitude and commented on how much they enjoyed it. Along with this, half the audience remained seated for the Q & A's that continued for approximately another hour after show. The intimate environment allowed the audience to feel comfortable to ask questions and to get to know the crew. Thank you to Theatre 180, the audience very much appreciated this level of engagement.

A special thank you must go to Libby Heffernan for assisting with setting up the Hall and making the Theatre 180 crew feel so welcomed. Libby's creative flare ensured the Hall was set to the era of WW2. Libby's passion and dedication to the arts and community is an admirable quality and is appreciated amongst your peers.

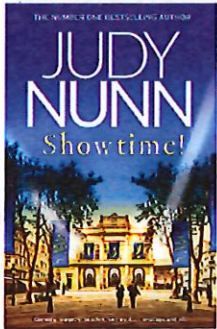
ADULT FICTION **FIONA PALMER - THE LONG WEEKEND**

If you answered YES to any of the above – collect a free pulse oximeter from your local government today!

What is a pulse oximeter?

It is a small, peg-like device that clips onto your fingertip to read your heart rate and blood oxygen level. It takes only one minute to work, is reusable and can be shared between other people in your household.



Why do I need one?

If you become COVID-19 positive, you may need to be remotely monitored through the WA COVID Care at Home program. By having a pulse oximeter already in your home, a health professional can assess you and provide health advice from the comfort of your home.

Where do I get one?

Visit the **Wickepin Community Resource Centre** to collect a free pulse oximeter for you and your household

(each eligible household can receive one pulse oximeter but supplies are limited).

Do **not** pick up a pulse oximeter if you are already COVID-19 positive. If you have already received a positive COVID-19 test result, the Department of Health will contact you and provide further information.

Cooking with chocolate

White Chocolate Macadamia biscuits

Ingredients

1 ½ cups plain flour
½ teaspoon bicarbonate soda
¼ caster sugar
1/3 cup brown sugar
125g butter, melted
½ teaspoon vanilla extract

1 egg
180g white choc bits
¾ cup roasted macadamias, chopped



Method

Preheat oven to 200c. Line two large oven trays with baking paper.
Sift flour, soda and sugars into a large bowl. Stir in butter, vanilla and egg, then chocolate and macadamias.
Bake biscuits for 10 minutes or until golden brown. Cool on trays.
Tip: To roast macadamias- spread nuts evenly on a baking tray and place in 180c oven for 5 minutes, or stir them in a heavy based fry pan over low heat; their natural oils will turn them golden brown.

Choc Brownies with sour cream frosting

Ingredients

125g butter, chopped
185g dark chocolate, chopped coarsely
1 cup caster sugar
2 teaspoons vanilla extract
2 eggs, lightly beaten
1 cup plain flour
½ cup coarsely chopped pecans

Sour cream frosting

100g dark chocolate, coarsely chopped
¼ sour cream



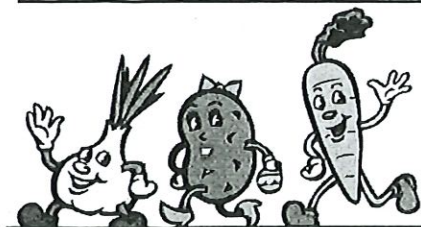
Method

Preheat oven to 180c. Grease a deep 19cm square cake tin, line base & sides with baking paper.
Stir butter & chocolate in small saucepan over low heat until melted. Put mixture in a large bowl: stir in sugar & vanilla, then eggs, sifted flour & pecans. Pour mixture into pan.
Bake brownie for 30 minutes until top is firm & skewer inserted in the centre comes out with moist crumbs attached. Cool brownie in the pan.
Turn brownie out of pan, spread frosting over top. Refrigerate until set before cutting into pieces.

Sour cream frosting

Melt chocolate in heat proof bowl over small saucepan of simmering water (make sure water doesn't touch the base of the bowl). Add sour cream: stir constantly until mixture is smooth and glossy.

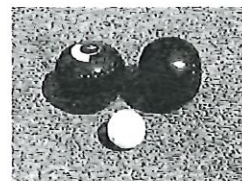
