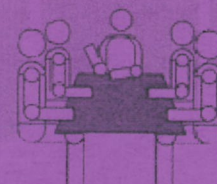

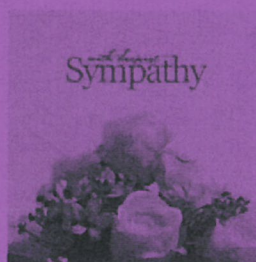


The Wickepin History Group is very short of photos for our displays. At the moment we are targeting the main street and photos that we may not have gained from other places.

The Black family were long time farmers in the Tincurrin District.

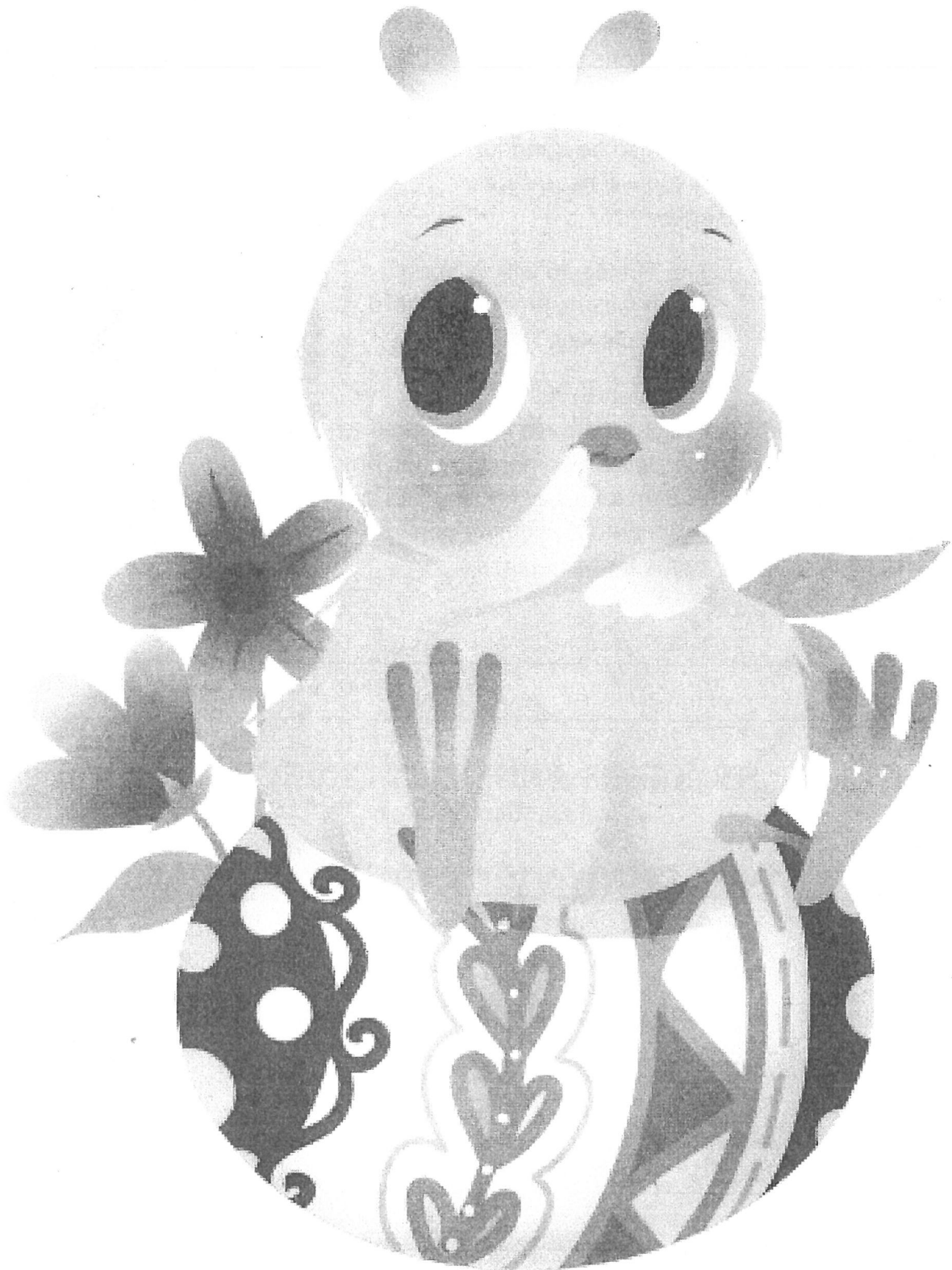
The funeral is at 1pm this Thursday at Christ Church, cnr Scholl and Pinjarra Rd, Mandurah.

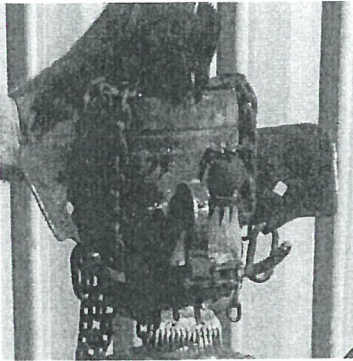


Shedanigans

The Wickepin She Shed He Shed members have been busy again preparing for the forthcoming **Market Day/Car boot sale on the 11th of May.**

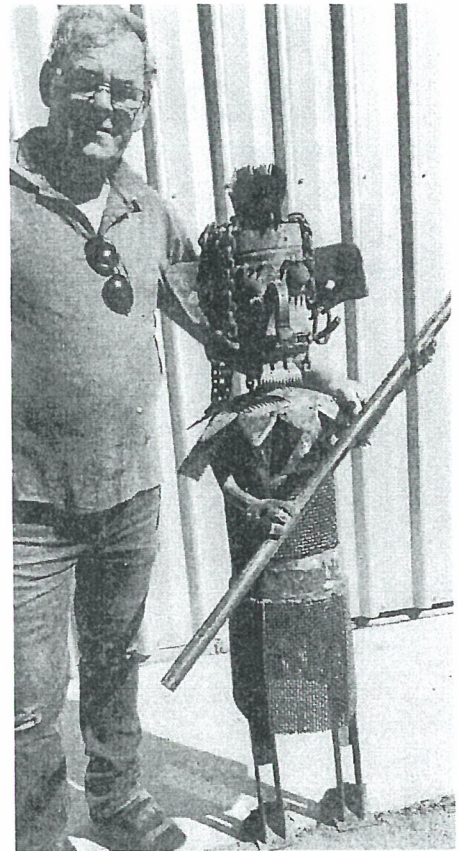

GUEST SPEAKER SHIRLEY HOWELL

Shirley Howell will be guest speaker at the upcoming ANZAC Service.

Shirley is the author of ***Beyond Hellfire and Back*** which has been accepted into the Australian War Memorial Library in Canberra. It is a memoir documenting the stories and experiences of WWII veteran Joe Pearce, a wheat and sheep farmer from Moulyinning (near Dumbleyung) and a Swan Districts WAFL player before and after the war.

Joe was captured by the Japanese and endured three gruelling years as a Prisoner of War. He survived Changi and Burma Railway while weathering wounds including shrapnel which lodged into his back.

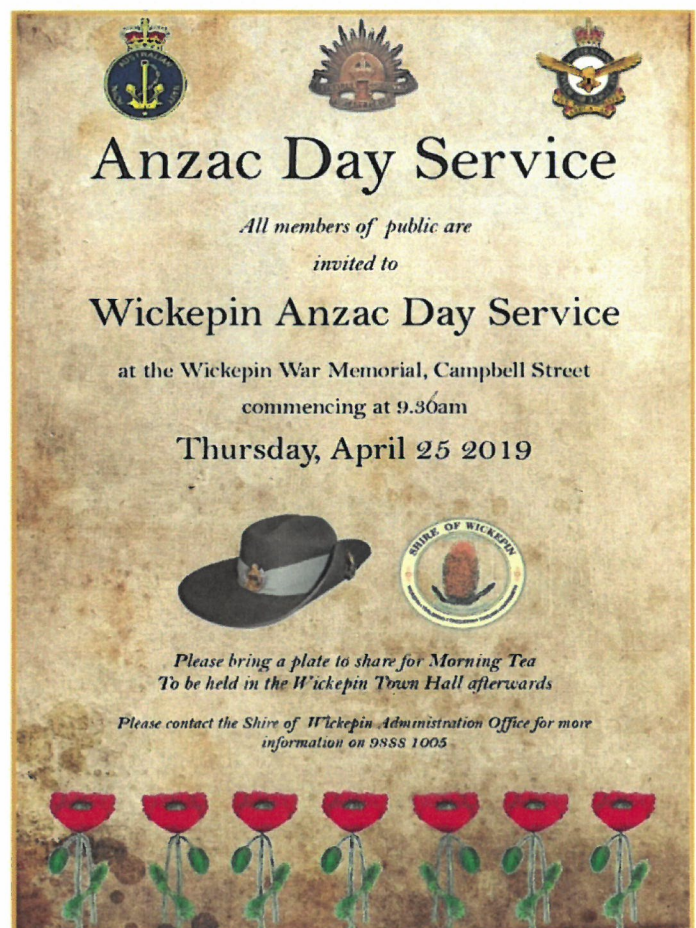
Both Shirley and her husband are ex-military, she joined the Women's Royal Army Corps while her husband was a member of The Duke of Edinburgh's Royal Regiment. Their son completed a ten year term with the Australian Navy serving time in the Gulf.

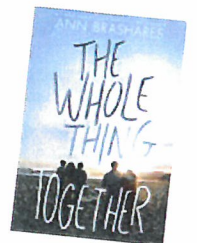
ADULT DVD

Swap the pistachios for almonds or macadamia halves for a different flavour.

MAKES: 15

- ❖ 250g (9oz) butter, plus extra for greasing
- ❖ 250g (9oz) self-raising flour
- ❖ 250g (9oz) caster sugar
- ❖ 4 eggs
- ❖ 2tbsp milk
- ❖ 350g (12oz) tinned

- cherries, drained
- ❖ 100g (3 1/2oz) pistachio nuts, chopped
- ❖ 10 sugar cubes, crushed

Preheat the oven to 190C/ Gas 5. Grease and line a 20 x 30cm (8 x 12in) tin with baking paper. Beat together the butter,

flour, sugar, eggs and milk. Stir in 3/4 of the cherries and pistachios, spoon the mixture into the tin and level the surface.

Top with the remaining cherries, pistachios and the sugar cubes, and press lightly into the mixture.

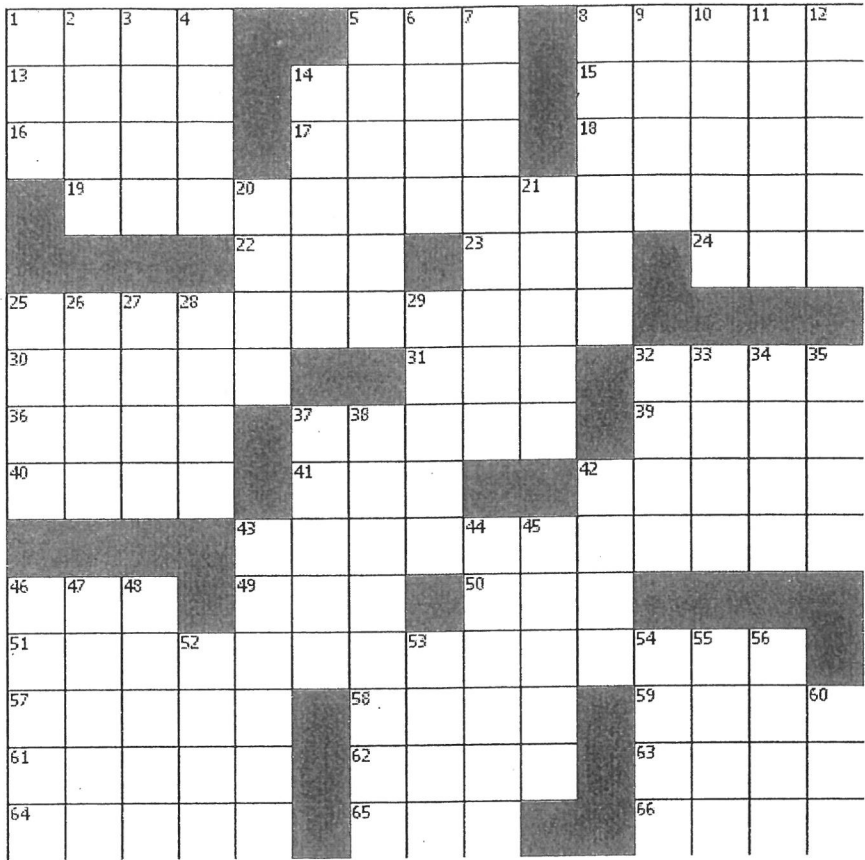
3 Bake in the centre of the oven for 35-45 mins until the cake is risen, golden and just firm to the touch.

4 Remove from the oven, allow to cool slightly, then turn out onto a wire tray. When completely cool, cut into 15 squares and serve.
