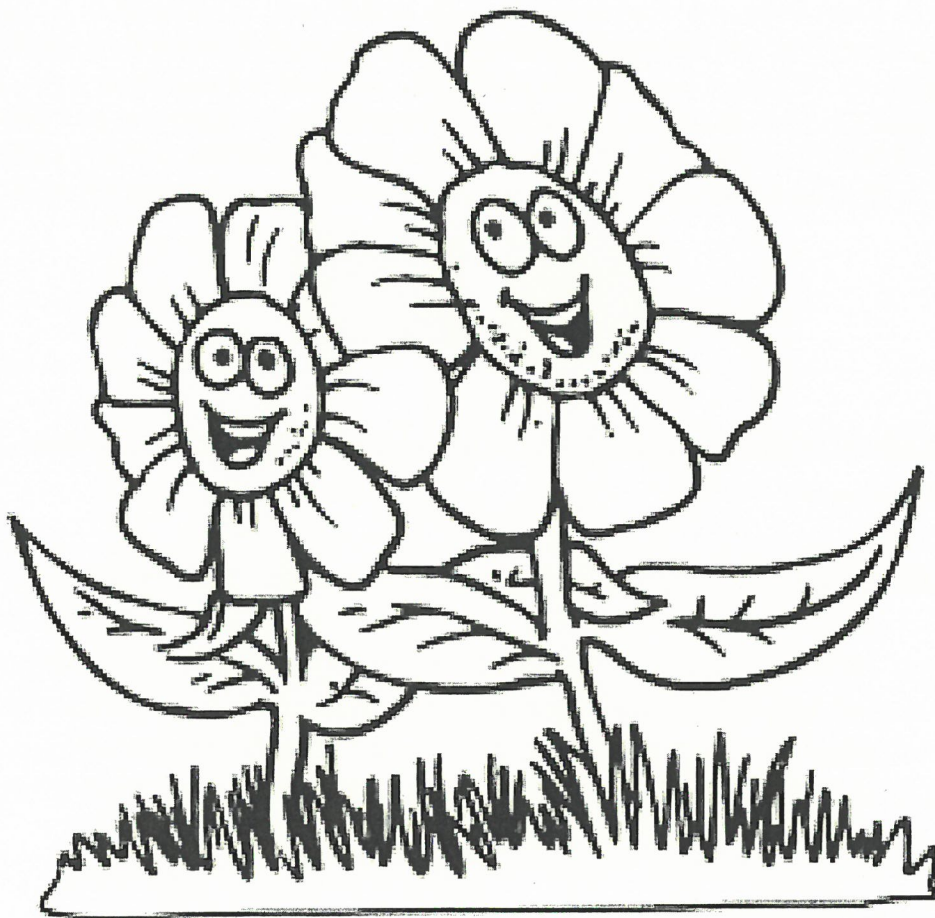



Nominations are called for the Shire of Wickepin Election to be held on Saturday 19 October 2019 to fill four (4) vacancies on Council for a four (4) year term.

Nomination Time and Place

- Nominations for all vacancies open on Thursday 5 September 2019
- Nominations must be lodged by 4.00pm Thursday 12 September 2019

Nominations must be lodged with the Returning Officer, Mr Mark Hook, at any time during the above period at the office of the Shire of Wickepin, 77 Wogolin Rd, Wickepin 6370.

Nomination Requirements

Candidates are required to lodge with the Returning Officer:

- A completed nomination in the prescribed form, signed and witnessed. This form is available from the office of the Shire of Wickepin or via www.wickepin.wa.gov.au
- A single A4 page profile containing not more than 150 words of biographical information about the proposed candidate and statements of the candidate's policies or beliefs
- A nomination deposit of \$80 (cash, or postal order, or bank cheque subject to Returning Officer approval)
- A recent passport-sized photograph (optional)
- Candidates are also required to complete a short online induction before submitting nomination

Where an agent lodges a nomination on a candidate's behalf, it must be in the prescribed form with a written authorisation signed by the candidate.

The documents may be hand delivered, posted or emailed to the Returning Officer and must be received by the close of nominations.

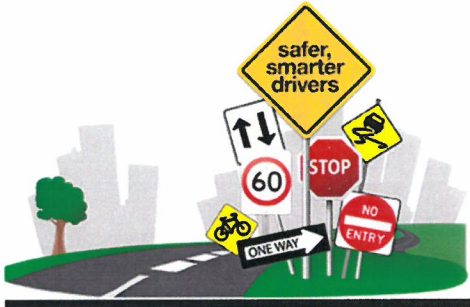

Maintenance works are in full swing and construction on the Harrismith Road will begin at the end of October. Road users are reminded to be cautious on all roads and drive to conditions.

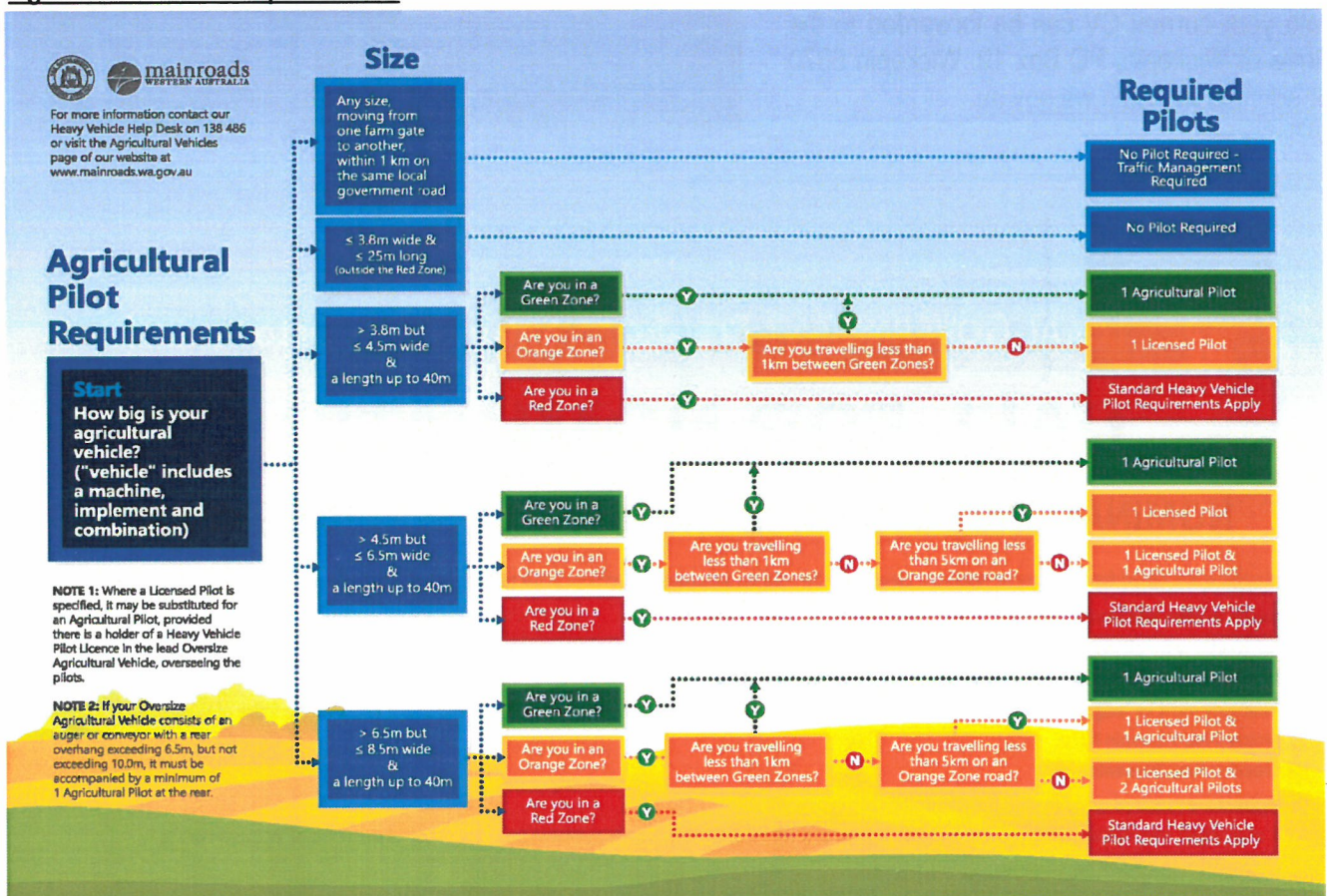


Proposed Wogolin Road Playground

Lemon and honey chicken salad

Zest and juice of 1 lemon, (plus 1 tablespoon lemon juice, extra)
2 tablespoons honey
1/4 cup extra virgin olive oil
1 cup mint leaves, half the leaves finely chopped
4 x 200g chicken breast fillets, each sliced into thirds
200g fresh or frozen broad beans
Preheat grill to medium-high.

1/2 (200g) garlic ciabatta loaf, halved lengthways, torn into small pieces
Large handful of baby spinach
400g can chickpeas, rinsed, drained
125g cherry tomatoes, halved
1/2 cucumber, finely chopped
1/4 cup flat-leaf parsley leaves, chopped
2 teaspoons wholegrain mustard

Combine lemon zest and juice, honey, 1 1/2 tablespoons oil and chopped mint in a large bowl. Season with sea salt and freshly ground black pepper. Add chicken, stir to coat, then place in the refrigerator for 10 minutes to marinate.

Meanwhile, blanch broad beans in boiling water for 1-2 minutes. Drain and refresh under cold running water. Remove tough outer skins. Set aside.

Place ciabatta on a baking tray and grill for 4-5 minutes until golden and crisp. Preheat a chargrill pan to high.

Cook chicken for 2-3 minutes each side until caramelised and cooked through.

Toss broad beans, ciabatta, spinach, chickpeas, tomatoes, cucumber, parsley and whole mint leaves in a large bowl.

Whisk together mustard and remaining 2 tablespoons oil and 1 tablespoon lemon juice. Season. Divide the salad among plates, pour over dressing and top with chicken to serve.

Strawberry shortcake

2 cups plain flour
1 tablespoon baking powder
1/4 cup caster sugar
125g unsalted butter, chilled, chopped
1 egg

2/3 cup pure cream
1/2 x 300ml tub double cream
250g strawberries, hulled, sliced
Icing sugar mixture, for dusting



Preheat oven to 200°C/180°C fan-forced. Grease and line base of a 6cm-deep, 20cm (base) round cake pan with baking paper.

Sift flour and baking powder into a large bowl. Add sugar. Using your fingertips, rub butter into flour until mixture resembles breadcrumbs. Whisk egg and pure cream in a jug. Add egg mixture to flour mixture. Mix with a flat-bladed knife until a soft dough forms.

Place dough in prepared pan. Using fingertips, press evenly over base of pan.

Bake for 15 to 20 minutes or until golden. Cool in pan for 5 minutes. Turn out onto a wire rack to cool.

Using a serrated knife, cut shortcake in half crossways. Spread double cream over cut-side of base. Top with strawberries. Sandwich with shortcake top. Dust with icing sugar. Serve.



Planting Bare-rooted Shrubs....

To buy bare-rooted roses and fruit trees is by far the most economical way of purchasing these plants, and they respond well to being planted during their dormant period when they have no foliage.

After purchasing your stock, soak the roots for a couple of hours or overnight in a bucket of water to make sure the roots are plump and moist at planting time, and also make sure the soil is slightly moist where you are to plant (this makes the transition less of a shock to the exposed plant roots) and always plant your bare-rooted stock as soon as possible after you purchase it.

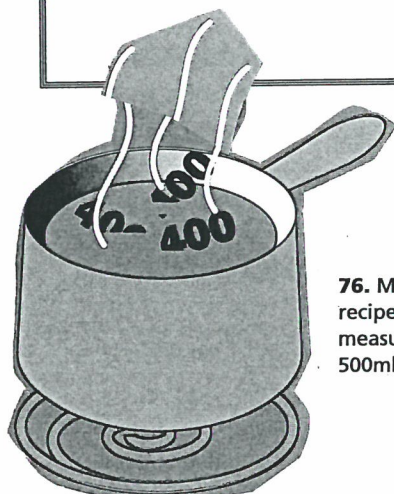
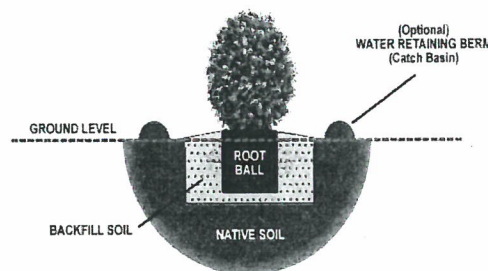
Excavate a hole 2-3 times as big as the pot your plant is in, and enrich the soil taken from the hole with homemade compost and/or aged manure. Create a "mound" in the centre of the hole to support the centre of the bare-rooted plant.

Centre your plant over the "mound", gently splaying the roots around it. If the plant requires a stake then now is the time to position it so as to avoid root damage by doing it after the hole is filled in.

Lay your shovel across the top of the hole to ensure your plant is at the correct depth, and adjust the depth if required (If it is planted too low the graft can be smothered. If it is too high then shoots can emerge from below the graft.)

Backfill around the plant's roots with the mixture of soil and compost. Press firmly to remove airpockets, but take care not to "compact" the soil around the roots, and then water well. Allow the water to settle in and then complete the backfill process to ground level, followed by more water.

Mulch with a 3cm layer of leaf litter, taking care not to pile it against the stem of the plant. Keep moist, and apply fertiliser when new shoots appear, usually a few weeks after planting.
