





the beaten yolks of the eggs, and beat and stir well; then the milk and flour, and lastly the beaten whites of the eggs.

Have the oven less hot for cake than for bread, but hotter for thin cake than for loaf cake. A cake is baked when a clean broom straw may be passed through the thickest part without any dough adhering to it. If it is necessary to move the cake about after putting it in the oven, it should be done carefully, as jarring it in any way is liable to make it fall and become heavy.

A tube cake pan, as shown in the accompanying cut, is very good for baking ordinary cakes, as the tube causes the cake to bake more evenly, and renders it less liable to fall.

To prevent cake from sticking to the pan, rub the pan with cold butter, and sprinkle with flour before turning in the batter.

If raisins or dried currants are used, they should first be carefully looked over, washed, and dried, and then dusted with flour. The raisins should also be seeded. A good way to wash these fruits is to put them into a colander, set the colander in a pan of warm water for a short time until they become plump, which will loosen the sand and grit, and then rinse by dipping the colander in and out of clean water several times. Then spread the fruit on a clean cloth to dry. The raisins may easily be seeded just after being washed in this way.

#### Local news from...

#### MICKEPIN POLICE

#### STATION

Wickepin Police have recently had the pleasure to have participated in a number of small presentations involving the Wickepin Primary School.

Firstly we were lucky to witness a Constable Care show that delivered a great message through a show called "fun scary" that teaches students the difference between scary things that are fun (like rollercoasters) and those scary secrets that we need to tell a trusted adult about. An excellent presentation regarding protective behaviours which was well received by the students. Afterwards they viewed a challenging two-actor drama for the older children that explored the ability of young people to channel violent and destructive behaviours into creative pursuits.

Later that afternoon, we gave Constable Care a special escort to Yealering Primary School for another performance covering similar content.

Returning to Wickepin Primary on another day, Sergeant Huggins and I delivered two important sessions on cyber and internet safety to the years 3/4 and 5/6 classes. We certainly hope that the students took something away from the presentations and learned a little more about being cyber aware.

WPS teacher Ms Roper, allowed us to return to conduct a basic bike safety workshop where I put the kids through a short safety briefing before they were unleashed onto the quadrangle to put their new skills into practice. Well done to all the involved students as everyone remembered their helmets which was a very positive outcome. I also took the opportunity to challenge the children to a bit of foursquare, cricket and footy during the breaks which was pretty hard work given their enthusiasm!

Wickepin Police have attended a couple of crashes recently where seatbelts were at the centre of attention. In one of the cases, a motorist lost control on a slippery unsealed road and collided heavily into a large tree. The impact was such that the vehicle caught fire. Thankfully only very minor injuries were received by the driver and his injuries were kept to a minimum due to his seatbelt use.

A few weeks earlier, a truck versus ute incident just outside of town saw the un restrained driver receive additional serious injuries due to not being restrained and containing his body during the impact. Thankfully the driver will recover from the injuries sustained in the crash however a split second decision not to wear a seatbelt resulted in unnecessary further injury.

It goes without saying, please always wear your seat belt, you just never know who or what is around the corner.

#### Caramelised chicken and rice noodle stir-fry

#### Ingredients

1 bunch choy sum

70g rice vermicelli noodles

1 tablespoon peanut oil

600g chicken thigh fillets, cut into 3cm pieces

3 teaspoons finely grated fresh ginger

3 garlic cloves, crushed

1/4 cup tomato paste

1/4 cup, brown sugar

1 tablespoon light soy sauce

1 tablespoon Chinese cooking wine

1/4 cup chopped fresh coriander leaves, plus extra leaves, to serve

2 green shallots, trimmed, thinly sliced

#### Method

Remove the stems from the choy sum and coarsely chop. Set aside. Cut the leaves into thirds. Place the leaves and the noodles in a heatproof bowl. Pour over enough boiling water to cover. Set aside for 7 minutes to soak. Drain and set aside.

Meanwhile, heat the oil in a wok over high heat. Add half the chicken. Cook, turning halfway, for 5 minutes or until golden. Use tongs to transfer to a plate. Repeat with remaining chicken.

Add the choy sum stems, ginger and garlic to the wok. Stir-fry for 1 minute or until aromatic. Add the tomato paste and cook, stirring often, for 1 minute. Add 80ml (1/3 cup) water and stir to combine. Add the brown sugar and simmer for 5 minutes or until thickened slightly.

Return the chicken to the wok along with the soy sauce and wine. Simmer, stirring often, for 20 minutes or until the sauce is thick and syrupy. Add the drained noodles and leaves. Use tongs to toss until well combined. Toss through the chopped coriander and half the shallot. Place on a serving platter and sprinkle with remaining shallot and extra coriander leaves to serve.



#### Blueberry Buckle

Blueberry Buckle is a deliciously tender lemon kissed cake studded with fresh blueberries and topped with a sweet buttery streusel topping. This old fashioned recipe is a favourite to serve with coffee, tea or for dessert.

#### **Ingredients**

3/4 cup white sugar

1/4 cup butter

1 egg

2 teaspoons lemon zest

1 1/2 cups flour

**Topping** 

1/4 cup + 1 tablespoon butter softened

1/4 cup brown sugar

1/4 cup white sugar

2 teaspoons baking powder

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/2 cup milk

1 tablespoon flour

1 1/2 cups fresh blueberries

1/3 cup all-purpose flour

1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon

#### **Instructions**

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease an 8x8 pan.

In a large bowl, cream sugar, butter, egg & lemon zest until fluffy.

In a separate bowl combine flour, baking powder, and salt. Add to sugar mixture, alternating with mikl mixing just until combined.

Toss blueberries with 1 tablespoon flour. Fold into batter and spread in prepared pan.

Combine all topping ingredients in a small bowl until crumbly. Sprinkle over batter and bake 40-45 minutes or until a toothpick comes out clean.

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


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


