



BUSH FIRE UNIFORMS

**Bush Fires Act 1954
Shire of Wickepin
Annual Firebreak Notice 2019/2020**

Action is required by owners and/or occupiers of all land in the Shire of Wickepin. Please read this notice carefully. Any queries should be directed to the Shire of Wickepin Administration Centre or Local Shire Bush Fire Control Officer. Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, owners and occupiers of property within the Shire of Wickepin are hereby required on or before 1 October 2019 and thereafter to 14 April 2020 to plough, scarify or otherwise provide and maintain firebreaks clear of all inflammable material at least 2.5 metres wide as follows:

Rural Land

Inside the boundary of all land held by each owner or occupier, their firebreaks need not follow the perimeter of any paddock but will be acceptable following land contours in an endeavour to overcome water erosion;

- To subdivide each holding into lots of no greater than 200 hectares; and
- To surround the homestead, out buildings and fuel storages on any such land.
- That from 15 October all harvesting and baling (including cutting and raking) operations, there shall be an operational mobile engine powered firefighting unit with a minimum capacity of 400 litres of water located in or immediately adjacent to the paddock being harvested and/or baled. The responsibility to supply the firefighting unit is that of the landowner/occupier.

Townsite Land

All lots within the townsites of Harrismith, Tincurrin, Toolibin, Wickepin and Yealering are required to be cleared and maintained free of all debris or inflammable material. Failure to comply with these requirements renders the owner or occupier liable to a penalty not more than \$400.

Clearing of Fence Lines

When clearing for new fence lines adjoining road reserves, you must have written approval from the Shire of Wickepin prior to commencement of clearing works. Landholders are asked to consider locating the fence three (3) metres inside their boundary to avoid any clearing on road reserves. Old fences should first be removed. If landholders wish to place their fence on the boundary, they may clear no more than one (1) metre beyond their boundary. This may be varied in special circumstances at the discretion of the CEO and Manager Works & Services. Any timber removed from the road reserve is to be pushed onto the owner's property.

Fencing of Road Reserves

Council encourages farmers to fence off road reserves running through their properties to protect trees on these reserves and to allow new growth of vegetation.

Burning on Roadsides

Should property owners wish to carry out burning of the road reserve adjacent to their property, it is necessary to obtain council approval prior to any burning taking place.

Burning Periods

Restricted Burning – 1 October 2019 to 13 November 2019
Prohibited Burning – 14 November 2019 to 7 February 2020
Restricted Burning – 8 February 2020 to 14 April 2020

Harvest and Fire Ban 2019/2020 Season

Harvesting is banned on Christmas Day and New Year's Day
Lighting of fires is banned on Good Friday and Easter Sunday.

Local news from...

WICKEPIN POLICE STATION

Wickepin Police have recently attended a series of burglaries in the area in both Wickepin and Yealering. Unfortunately Yealering was targeted a number of times and one business has suffered multiple incidents. The Police force is working hard at identifying the offenders and will continue to work at achieving a positive outcome.

This is however a very timely reminder to remember that our communities are no longer free from opportunistic criminals who seek easy targets. Please take this opportunity to walk around your own properties and wear a burglar's 'hat' (or any other face covering!) for a moment and see if you are able to identify weaknesses in your own security. The process is the start of **'target hardening'** whereby the community hardens itself against criminal behaviour. It is proven that locked doors, security grilles, alarms and quality CCTV cameras have played a significant role in firstly deterring and secondly capturing vital evidence that leads to arrests.

We are happy to give free advice on the state of your own security if you would like our experience and opinions of many years of attending burglary scenes.

Wickepin Police will continue to target **'hoon'** driving and irresponsible driver behaviour. It is simply not acceptable to "cut up" roads in this district. If we have sufficient evidence, rest assured you will be charged and your vehicle seized. So be warned, you have been told, the eyes of the community are assisting the Wickepin Police to take you off the road!

Which brings me to the next social media programme designed to do exactly that – reporting of suspicious behaviour! Please consider installing the newly developed phone app. called "EYES ON THE STREET".

EYES ON THE STREET, powered by Crime Stoppers WA, allows industry personnel to report suspicious activity quickly, easily and anonymously. Security guards, shire rangers, taxi & ride share drivers, couriers, hotel staff or mining workers, through the nature of their work, are the Eyes on the Street and may come across suspicious behaviour on a regular basis.

They can easily share information via this mobile app, which will go directly to Crime Stoppers WA and then be directed to the WA Police Force or other law enforcement agencies for their intelligence-gathering and action where appropriate. Please note that this is an information-sharing tool and not to be used where police attendance is required at the time. Download from the Apple App Store or Google Play now.

Finally, Wickepin Police executed a drug search warrant and seized a substantial drug crop and various associated items. A 56 year old Wickepin male was charged with cultivate prohibited drug with intent to sell and supply along with other drug possession charges. He will face Perth Magistrates Court in November.

Please continue to report any suspected drug information to us as we are more than happy to pay people surprise visits to inhibit this lifestyle choice.

And all of it's happened before.



It's part of a cycle that earth has to go through

Who are helping us now to adjust.


So conserve all the energy, try to recycle,

St John First Responder

Help us find you in an emergency

Pinpointing your exact location can become difficult in an emergency situation. The St John First Responder App sends your GPS coordinates to the operator when you call Triple 000 for an ambulance, speeding up the time it takes to confirm your location and dispatch an ambulance.

Over 130,000 Western Australians have downloaded the app which also contains a number of other resources, including:

- **First aid instruction guides** – helping you to treat a range of injuries and illnesses.
- **Defibrillator (AED) locator** - showing all the defibrillator locations near you.
- **Upload the location of new defibrillator (AED) locations** that aren't currently appearing on the app.
- **Locate nearest medical centres and emergency departments** - including live ED waiting time information.
- **Patient transport services information.**
- **Your first aid course information** and refresher reminder notices
- **First aid tips and special offers** - keeping you up to date with handy first aid information.

Help others in an emergency situation

The St John First Responder app allows qualified first aiders in Western Australia to sign up and become a registered first responder. If a nearby emergency occurs (in a public place within 500 meters), you will be notified and given the opportunity to assist until the ambulance arrives.

To become a first responder you will need to provide evidence of having completed a first aid course within the last three years. Minimum qualification level of HLTAID001 Provide cardiopulmonary resuscitation. We now offer the ability to become a BASIC level first responder in the app, by uploading your Photo ID.





If you have opted to become a First Responder you will need to change the First Responder Status to 'On' to receive any notifications.


On this page you can access a number of features including First Aid Guides and Special Offers and Tips. These are also available if you have chosen to not become a First Responder.



If you push the More Info button you will see a brief description of the incident and a location of where the incident is. You also have the ability to Dismiss or Accept and then attend the incident.



When you are within 500m of an incident you will receive a pop-up notification. From this you can either dismiss the incident or access more information about the incident.




You will receive a pop-up message once the incident has been resolved. If you have attended the incident we encourage you to provide feedback.



Peach Melba and strawberry upside-down cake

Preheat oven and prepare cake tin as per Step 2 of the passionfruit upside-down cake (see recipe, left). Drain 825g can sliced peaches and arrange over base of prepared tin (fresh sliced peaches can also be used, if preferred). Make cake batter as per Step 4 of passionfruit cake recipe using 170g butter, $\frac{3}{4}$ cup caster sugar and 2 tsp vanilla extract. Add 2 eggs, 1 at a time, beating after each addition. Sift 2 cups self-raising flour over batter. Hull, chop and puree 125g strawberries. Add $\frac{1}{2}$ cup milk and $\frac{1}{2}$ of the pureed strawberries to batter, then stir to combine. Spoon onto peach slices in tin and bake for 50-55 minutes or until cooked when tested with a skewer. Turn out cake onto a serving plate. Arrange an extra 125g strawberries on top of cake and dust with a little icing sugar. Serve with freshly whipped cream or double-thick cream and remaining pureed strawberries on the side.



Grease six 1-cup capacity freezer-proof moulds and line base and side with plastic wrap. Spoon $\frac{1}{4}$ cup softened store-bought berry sorbet into base of each mould and freeze for 30 minutes. Spoon $\frac{1}{2}$ cup softened store-bought vanilla ice-cream in each mould, on top of sorbet. Freeze for 6 hours or overnight. Turn out onto serving plates, discarding plastic. Drizzle with combined 100g melted dark chocolate and 2 tsp vegetable oil. Top with fresh berries and dust with icing sugar to serve.



MAKE IT AHEAD

Lime and coconut ice-cream balls

Roughly mash 1kg softened good-quality vanilla ice-cream. Add 1 cup toasted shredded coconut and finely grated zest and juice of 2 limes. Stir to combine. Freeze for 2 hours, then form mixture into small balls and roll in extra toasted shredded coconut. Put on an oven tray lined with baking paper and return to freezer for at least 4 hours or until firm. Serve.
