



EOI Organic Soil Ameliorants

Just to give a heads up on another project planned to start this year that is aimed at lifting the productivity in poor performing sandy soils by finding the most cost-effective organic soil ameliorant, rate of application and incorporation method.

What we're looking for is a grower to help out with providing a suitable site for undertaking this research trial over the next three years. Ideally the site will have low standing stubble and be intended to grow a cereal crop this year and to be cropped through until 2023. The types of ameliorants to be looked at are a combination of straw, hay and manure incorporated by either Speed tiller, Plozza plough, Mouldboard or Spader.

During the course of the trial all relevant biotic and abiotic factors will be monitored and tested, and a full economic analysis conducted to gauge the most cost-effective method for improving soil health and productivity in these targeted areas.

Above all we want these trials to be relevant and practical and would welcome any input at this development stage that would be beneficial for our growers, please feel free to get in touch or bring your ideas to our next grower group meeting and if you've got a patch of dirt on your property that you feel would be ideal for hosting this trial, please contact Chris Hetherington on 0409 868 514.


WICKEPIN RUBBISH TIP

SMOKING RESTRICTIONS IN PUBLIC SPACES



FENCE LINE CLEARING

Can I Clear Native Vegetation Along My Fence Line?

If you are the owner of the property, you may clear a strip along a fence line within your property to the width necessary to provide access to construct or maintain a fence, provided that the clearing, combined with other limited exempt clearing (under the Regulations) on the property, does not exceed five hectares in the financial year in which the clearing takes place.

A separate exemption exists for clearing between private property and Crown land (e.g. a road reserve), provided that the clearing on the Crown land is no more than 1.5 metres from the fence and is required to enable access to construct or maintain a fence. This exemption applies to the owner of the land on which the clearing is to take place or with the prior authority of the owner, therefore in the case of a road reserve, written approval from your local Shire must be obtained prior to undertaking the clearing.

These exemptions do not apply in environmentally sensitive areas.

The onus is on the land owner and any other person carrying out the clearing on their behalf, to ensure compliance with the Environmental Protection Act 1986 (EP Act), regardless of any advice given by the Shire.

It is important to read the exemption as a whole which is made up of the following requirements or elements:

- 1. It authorises the clearing of native vegetation on Crown land along a fence line; and
- 2. The clearing can only be for the purpose of providing access to construct or maintain a fence between private property and Crown land; and
- 3. (as a limitation to these first two parts of the exemption) -the clearing can be no more than 1.5 metres from the fence line.

If the intended clearing does not satisfy all of these requirements then the exemption does not apply, and a clearing permit is required.

The following images provide examples of this exemption:



- 1. The cleared tree pictured above is within Crown land and is along a fence line;
- 2. The cleared tree was preventing the property owner from being able to access and construct the new fence:
- 3. The cleared tree is less than 1.5 metres away from the fence line.

Although a tree may have limbs that overhang a fence and there is a possibility that a tree limb could fall and damage the fence at a later point in time, the tree cannot be cleared under this exemption unless all three requirements are met. If the limbs do not impede access to the area to construct or maintain the fence (the second requirement) the exemption would not apply and a **clearing permit** issued by the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation (DWER) would be required. The limb itself could be removed (pruned) as it would not constitute 'clearing' as defined

under the EP Act if the removal of this limb does not cause substantial damage to the tree and the trunk of the tree is not severed.

This exemption does not authorise the wholesale clearing of all native vegetation on the Crown land within 1.5 metres of the fence line, it only authorises the clearing of as much vegetation as is necessary "to provide access to construct or maintain a fence".

Any clearing undertaken must be done in such a way to limit damage to neighbouring vegetation.

Unauthorised Clearing of Native Vegetation

The clearing of native vegetation in Western Australia without authorisation is an offence under the Environmental Protection Act 1986. Unlawful clearing by individuals can result in fines of up to \$250,000. Guide lines on clearing exemptions and applications for clearing permits are available on the DWER website www.dwer.wa.gov.au





And as more notes - and more bodies - start appearing, Cross is determined to put an end to this case once and for all.





Recipes for school lunchboxes (continued)

BREAKFAST BARS

INTRODUCTION



From Nigella: I am addicted to these, and so is everyone I give them to. Although they're quick to throw together, they do take nearly an hour to bake, so what I suggest is, make a batch at the weekend and then you will have the oaty, chewy bars ready and waiting for those days when you have to snatch breakfast on the hoof.

Mind you, they are just like milk and cereal in bar form, so there's nothing to stop you nibbling at one with your morning coffee at home every day. If you are not a morning person, believe me, they will make your life easier. They also store well; indeed, they seem to get better and better. So just stash a tin with them and remove as and when you want.

INGREDIENTS - Makes: 16 bars

1 x 14 ounces can sweetened condensed milk

2½ cups quick-cooking oats (not instant)

1 cup shredded coconut

1 cup dried cranberries

1 cup mixed seeds (pumpkin, sunflower, sesame)

1 cup natural unsalted peanuts

METHOD

Preheat the oven to 130° C/ 110° C Fan/gas mark ½/ 250° F, and oil a 23 x 33 x 4cm / 9 x 13 inch baking tin, or use a throwaway foil one.

Warm the sweetened condensed milk in a large pan.

Meanwhile, mix together all the other ingredients and then add the warmed sweetened condensed milk, using a rubber or wooden spatula to fold and distribute.

Spread the mixture into the tin and press down with the spatula or, better still, your hands (wearing disposable vinyl gloves to stop you sticking), to even the surface.


Bake for 1 hour, then remove from the oven and, after about 15 minutes, cut into four across, and four down to make 16 chunky bars. Let cool completely.

Garden Snippets...



A-Hoya There!...Heavenly Hoyas...

With their large scented pendulous blooms, Hoyas (Wax Flowers) are a hardy evergreen flowering favourite for many gardeners. Their small root requirements make them perfect for pots or in the ground. Either way, be sure to provide them with a trellis or climbing vessel along which they will happily trail. Hoyas are not fussy, and will flourish in very bright light, dappled shade areas and under patios. In warmer weather they require regular watering to maintain their beautiful blooms throughout summer.

Here's what they need:

Location: Hoyas grow in most parts of Australia, where winter is mild. They are epiphytic, which means they get their moisture and nutrients from the air or small pools of water that collect on the support plant. Hoyas have small roots, traditionally living and trailing along in high trees for support and feeding from rotting leaf matter. They are not parasitic, and their small root requirements make them perfect for pots. They don't mind at all being root bound, as long as the growing media is free draining.


Lighting: Hoyas thrive in bright light, dappled shade and under patios in warmer areas, but need protection from harsh summer sunlight and severe winter frosts. In cooler areas they will tolerate more sun exposure in winter. They do require some sunlight to flower well, so morning sun or dappled shade are ideal positions for flowering.

Watering: Originating from the tropics, Hoyas flourish with watering well in the warmer months and a little less in the winter months.

Fertilising: Feeding hoyas before their flowering season and during flowering using soluble plant food or orchid fertiliser will greatly encourage more blooms.

Flowering: Occurs during the warmer months. Flowers are produced from penduncles protruding from the same stem junction each year, so it is important not to cut the flowers off after they have finished flowering. They will drop off on their own. In addition to older flower heads, new growth will form every year, creating new penduncles.

Propagation: Hoyas are easily propagated from cuttings with stem nodes, or by leaf cuttings, taken at any time.
