Lake Yealering Foreshore Redevelopment Official Opening

The redevelopment of the Lake Yealering foreshore was officially opened on Saturday 12 September 2020 by Hon Stephen Dawson MLC.

Lake Yealering is highly valued for the recreational, environmental and economic opportunities that it provides. Lake Yealering is one of two lakes, selected as part of the Liberal-National Government's Royalties for Regions 'Living Lakes' which aims to enhance the existing lake system to create permanent and accessible water bodies in the Wheatbelt. It is intended the enhancements will aid in providing greater recreational amenity to the community, improve the environment for flora and fauna and attract people to the area.

The Lake Yealering Foreshore redevelopment compliments the Living Lakes Project. An important flow on effect from the project is to generate tourism and support the local economies of Yealering and the wider region.

Cheesy bacon and veggie rice slice

INGREDIENTS

1 tbs olive oil
1 small brown onion, chopped
4 short-cut bacon rashers, chopped
2 garlic cloves, crushed
250g pkt microwavable long-grain rice
200g **sweet potato**, peeled, coarsely grated

1 head broccoli, cut into florets, chopped
1 cup frozen peas
1 1/4 cups grated Cheddar Cheese
5 eggs, lightly whisked
Ground paprika, to serve (optional)
Green salad, to serve
Tomato chutney, to serve

METHOD

Preheat oven to 190°C. Line a 16cm x 26cm slice pan with baking paper, allowing the 2 long sides to overhang.

Heat the oil in a frying pan over medium heat. Cook the onion and bacon, stirring occasionally, for 5 mins or until light golden. Add garlic and cook, stirring, for 30 secs. Transfer to a large bowl. Set aside to cool slightly.

Heat the rice following packet directions. Add to the bacon mixture in the bowl with the sweet potato, broccoli, peas and 1 cup (120g) cheese. Stir until combined. Fold in the egg. Season.

Spoon the mixture into the prepared pan, pressing down firmly. Smooth the surface. Sprinkle with remaining cheese. Lightly sprinkle with paprika, if desired.

Bake for 30 mins or until set and golden brown. Set aside in the pan for 5 mins to cool slightly. Cut into pieces. Serve with salad and chutney.

Savoury mighty muffins

INGREDIENTS

1 1/2 cups self-raising flour
2 cups grated tasty cheese
100g mortadella, chopped
1 zucchini, grated



1/4 cup thinly sliced chives
3/4 cup milk
1 egg
1/4 cup fruit chutney

Preheat oven to 200°C. Grease a 6 x 3/4-cup capacity Texas muffin pan. Line with baking paper.

Sift flour into a large bowl. Add cheese, mortadella, zucchini and chives. Whisk milk, egg and chutney in a jug until well combined. Make a well in centre of dry ingredients. Pour in milk mixture. Using a large metal spoon, gently mix until just combined. Spoon into muffin holes.

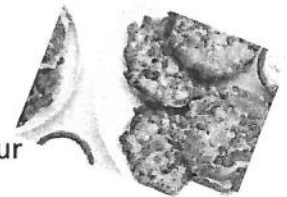
Bake for 15 to 20 minutes or until a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. Stand in pan for 3 minutes. Turn onto a wire rack to cool. Store in an airtight container at room temperature.

Zucchini corn fritters with bacon

INGREDIENTS

500g vine-ripened cherry tomatoes
8 bacon rashers
1 large zucchini, coarsely grated

420g can creamed corn
3/4 cup (110g) self-raising flour



METHOD

Preheat oven to 200°C. Line a baking tray with baking paper. Place the tomatoes on the lined tray. Spray with olive oil spray. Season. Bake for 10-15 mins or until the tomatoes begin to collapse.

Meanwhile, heat a large non-stick frying pan over high heat. Add the bacon and cook for 2 mins each side or until golden brown and crisp. Transfer to a plate. Cover with foil to keep warm.

Combine the zucchini, corn, and flour in a large bowl. Season.

Spray the frying pan with olive oil spray. Reduce heat to medium. Add four 1/4-cup portions of the zucchini mixture to pan. Cook for 2 mins each side or until golden brown and cooked through. Transfer to a plate and cover with foil to keep warm. Repeat, in 2 more batches, with the remaining zucchini mixture.

Divide the fritters, bacon, and tomatoes among serving plates.

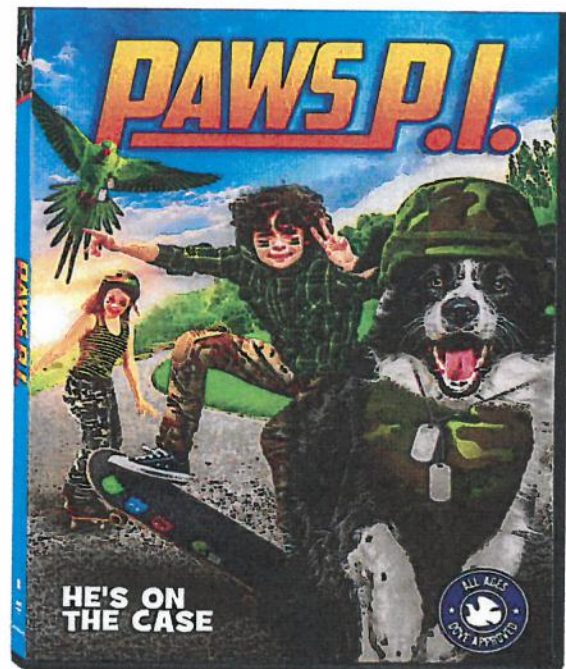

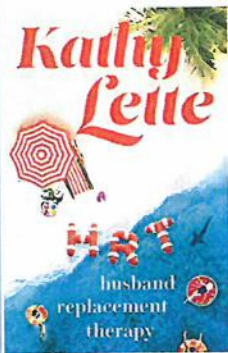

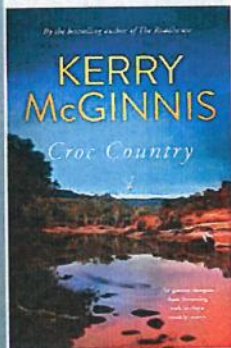


Husband Replacement Therapy—Kathy Lette

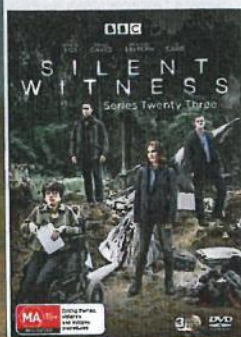


The Goldminer's Sister—Alison Stuart

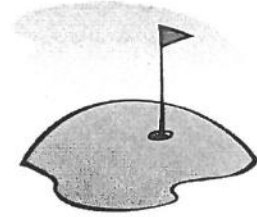
Lake Yealering Golf Club Open Day
