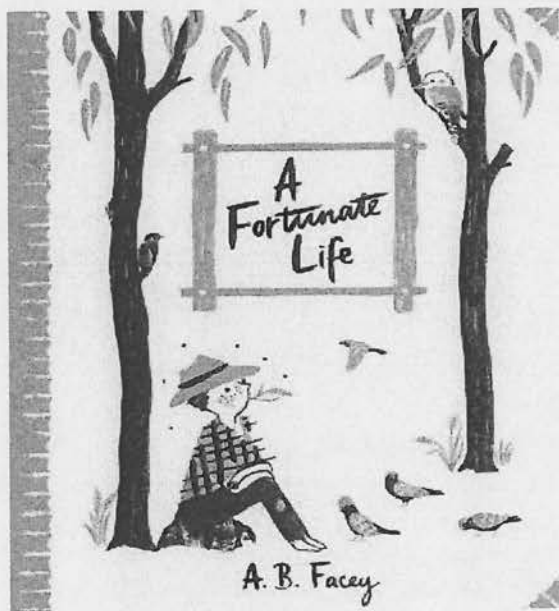

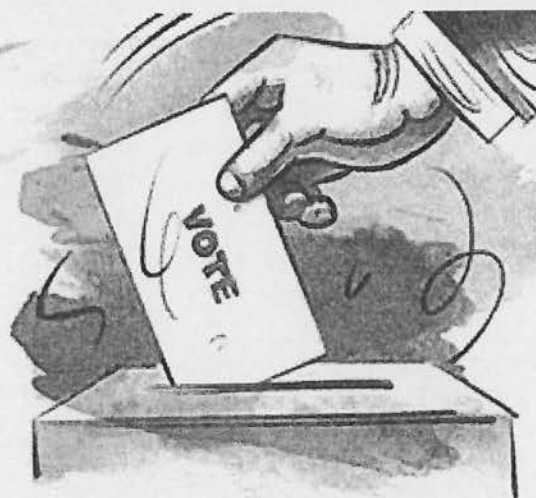

Commonwealth Day Monday 8th March.

What is "Commonwealth Day?"

Commonwealth Day is an annual celebration of the Commonwealth of Nations. It was formerly known as Empire Day.

It was first celebrated on 24th May 1902, on what would have been Queen Victoria's birthday the year after her death. It was officially recognised as an annual event in 1916.

It was renamed as Commonwealth Day in 1958, with the decline of the

British

Empire in the 1950's.

Commonwealth Day is mainly celebrated in the UK, Australia, Canada and Gibraltar.



8th March: International Women's Day:

- It's History: This day has been observed since the early 1900's - At this time in history women's oppression and inequality was spurring women to become more vocal and active in campaigning for change.
- 1908: 15000 women marched through New York City demanding shorter hours, better pay and voting rights.
- 1909: The first National Women's Day was observed across the US in Feb 28th.
- 1911: International Women's Day was honored the first time in Austria, Denmark, Germany and Switzerland on 19th March with more than one million men and women attending rallies campaigning for women's rights to work, vote, be trained, to hold office and end discrimination.
- 2021 and beyond: the world has witnessed a significant change and attitudinal shift in both women's and society's thoughts about women's equality and emancipation. Many from a younger generation may feel that "all the battles have been won for women" while many feminists from the 1970's know only too well the longevity and ingrained complexity of patriarchy.

These are the lids required:

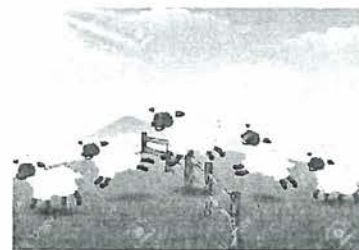
*milk bottle lids * UHT milk * water * soft drink

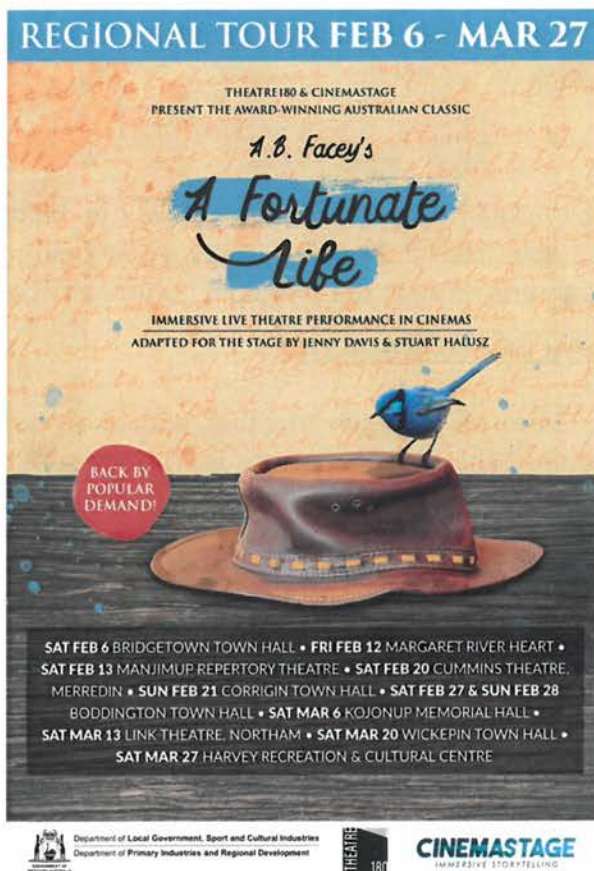

We would really like to see this type of service remain in the community to keep young families in the area plus also attract new families to the area.

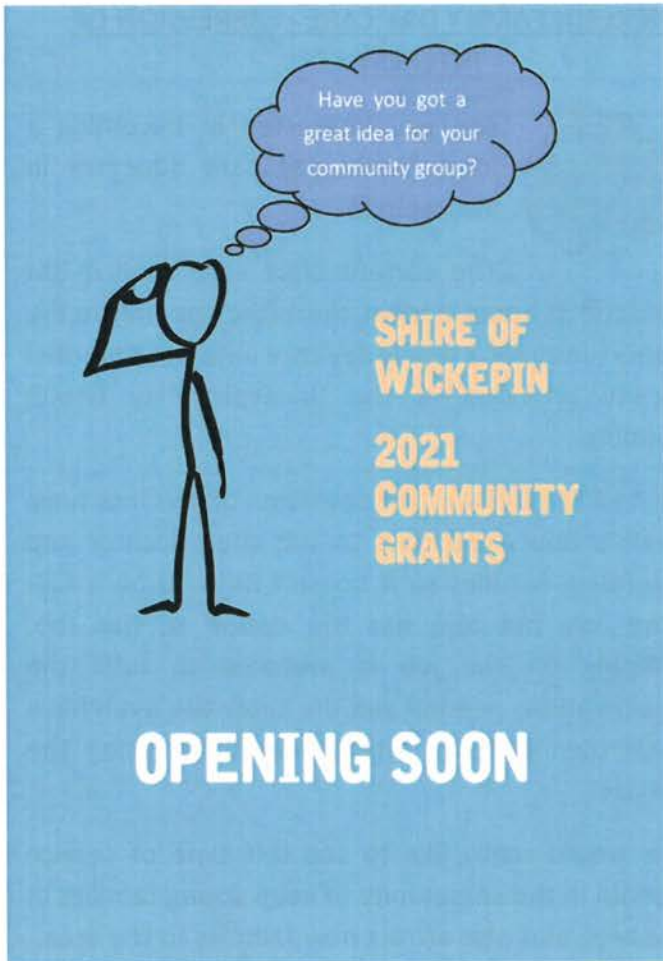

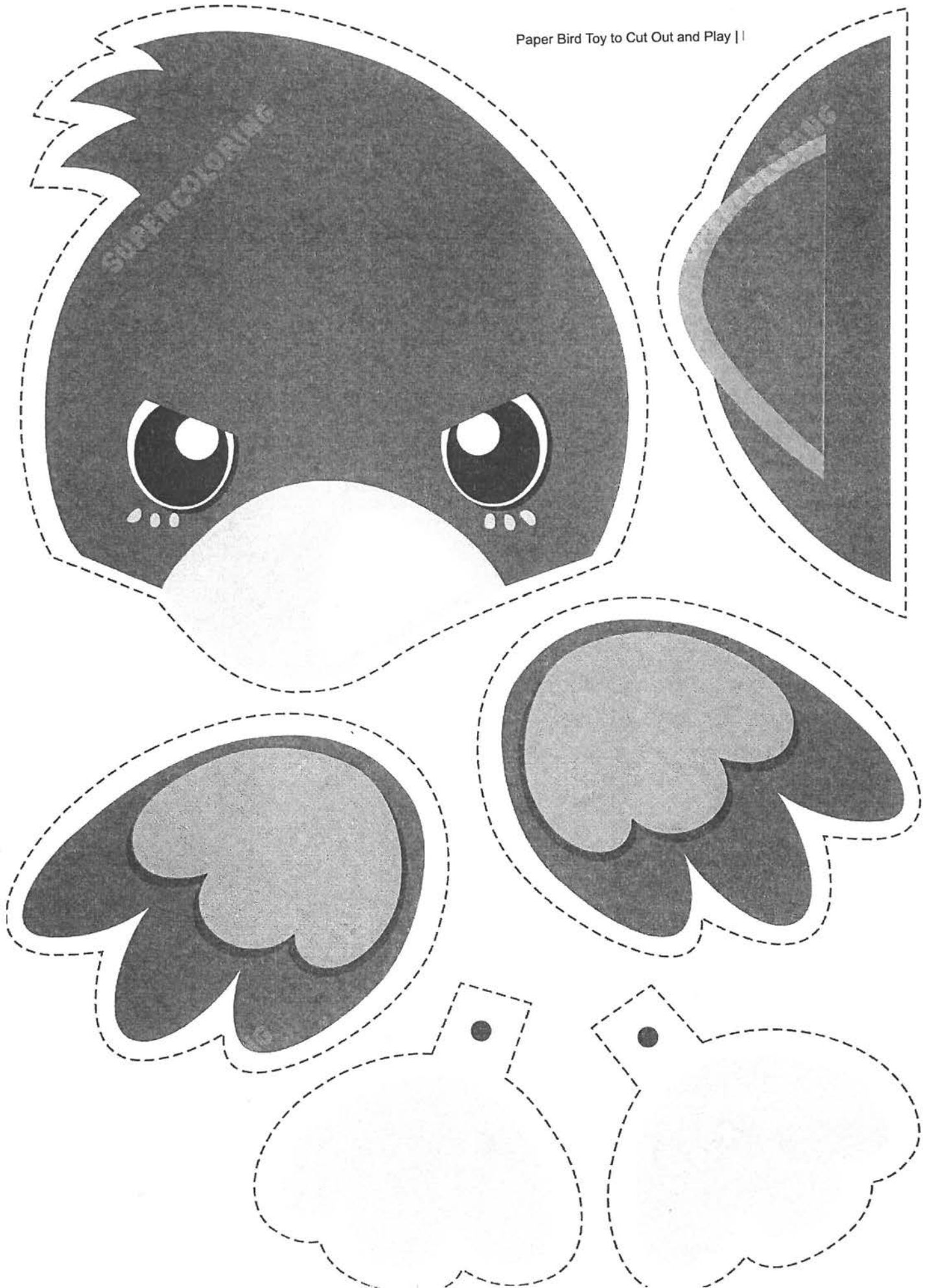

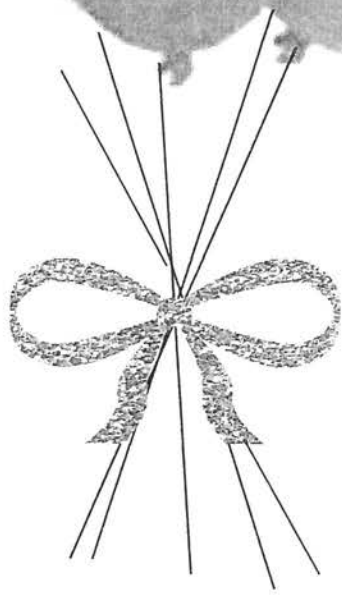

IN THE KITCHEN

APPLE *magic*

WANT A NO-STRESS
TART TOPPING? SKIP
FANCY APPLE PATTERNS AND
JUST SLICE, STACK AND BAKE.

SLICE 'N' STACK APPLE TART

Serves 16 Prep 25 mins (+ cooling,
5 mins standing & 1 hour resting time)
Cooking 55 mins

100g butter, softened
1 cup (220g) caster sugar
1 Coles Australian Free Range Egg
1 cup (120g) almond meal
¼ cup (35g) plain flour
1 tbs brandy (optional)
4 small red and green apples, cored
¼ cup (60ml) lemon juice
½ cup (80ml) orange juice
20g butter, extra
Pastry
1½ cups (225g) plain flour
½ cup (55g) icing sugar mixture
125g chilled butter, chopped
1 Coles Australian Free Range Egg yolk
2 tsp iced water

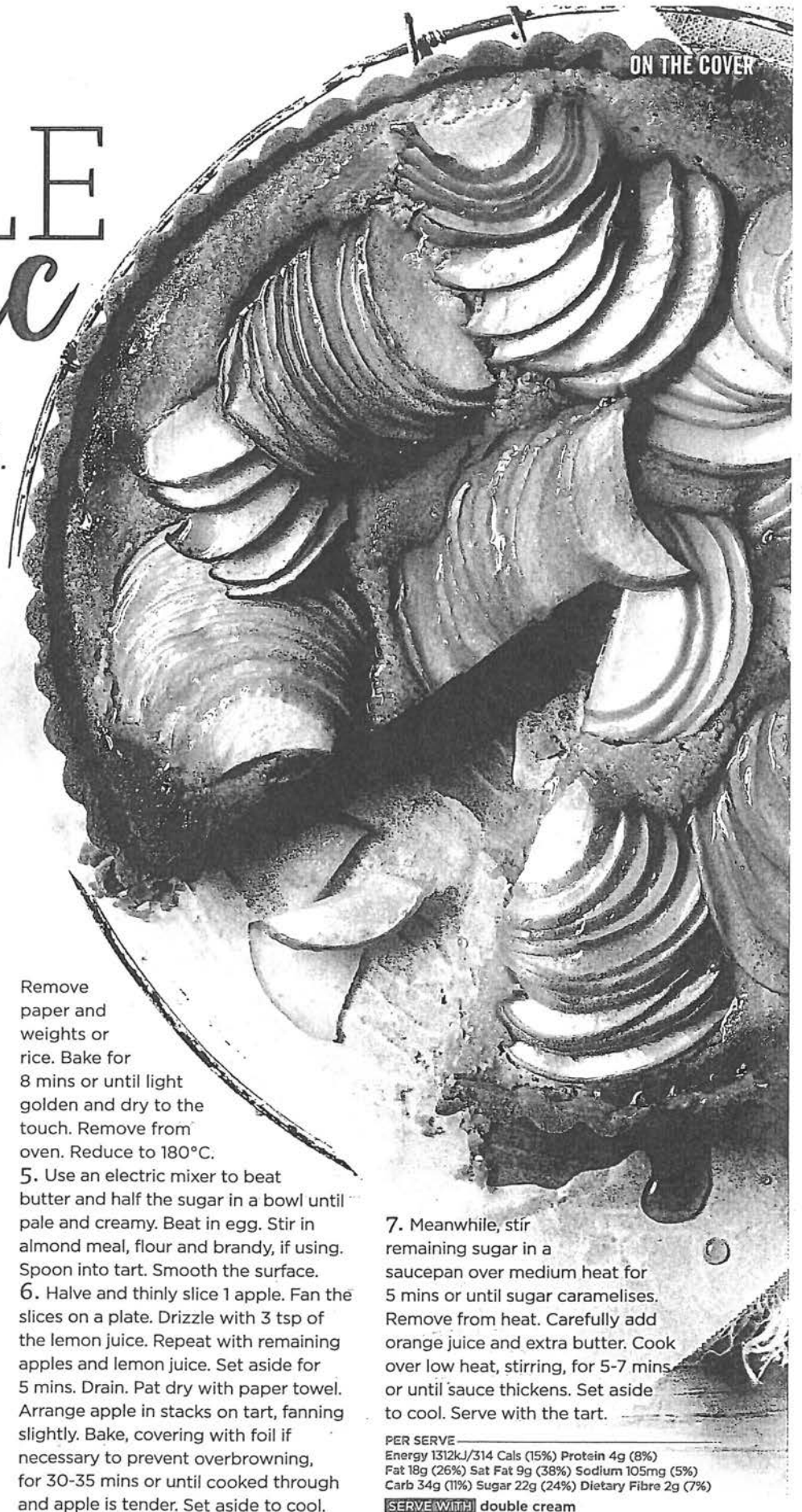
1. To make the pastry, place the flour, icing sugar and butter in a food processor and process until mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs. Add the egg yolk and water and process until dough just comes together.
2. Turn onto a lightly floured surface and gently knead until just smooth. Shape into a disc. Wrap in plastic wrap. Place in the fridge for 30 mins to rest.
3. Roll out the pastry on a lightly floured surface to a 3mm-thick disc. Line a 22cm (base measurement) fluted tart tin with removable base with the pastry. Trim the edge. Place in the fridge for 30 mins to rest.
4. Preheat oven to 200°C. Line pastry with baking paper and fill with pastry weights or rice. Bake for 10 mins.

Remove paper and weights or rice. Bake for 8 mins or until light golden and dry to the touch. Remove from oven. Reduce to 180°C.

5. Use an electric mixer to beat butter and half the sugar in a bowl until pale and creamy. Beat in egg. Stir in almond meal, flour and brandy, if using. Spoon into tart. Smooth the surface.
6. Halve and thinly slice 1 apple. Fan the slices on a plate. Drizzle with 3 tsp of the lemon juice. Repeat with remaining apples and lemon juice. Set aside for 5 mins. Drain. Pat dry with paper towel. Arrange apple in stacks on tart, fanning slightly. Bake, covering with foil if necessary to prevent overbrowning, for 30-35 mins or until cooked through and apple is tender. Set aside to cool.

7. Meanwhile, stir remaining sugar in a saucepan over medium heat for 5 mins or until sugar caramelises. Remove from heat. Carefully add orange juice and extra butter. Cook over low heat, stirring, for 5-7 mins or until sauce thickens. Set aside to cool. Serve with the tart.

Plant & Grow Bromeliads....

Originating from the tropical Americas, bromeliads come in an array of fascinating fluorescent colours, leaf characteristics and growing habits, bringing an instant touch of the tropics to any garden.

Many are epiphytes, and use other plants as a non parasitic host, growing happily in a fork of a tree or on a log. Most bromeliads will die after flowering, but new pups form before it dies, awarding you new plant and bracts for the next season. The pups can also be gently removed and transplanted elsewhere. Like orchids, bromeliads use the soil they grow in more for anchorage than for sustenance. They grow very well in pots with a light, open potting mix, and also do well tied to boughs of trees. This can create extra 'levels' of interest in your garden, but make sure you don't forget to water them in dry periods.

Bromeliads come from the tropical Americas where they grow as forest under-storey plants and tree-dwelling epiphytes. Most are shade lovers and need shelter from frost in very cold areas a despite their tropical origins, they grow happily in all but the coldest and driest of climates.

Watering tips for bromeliads

Most bromeliads form a 'well' structure in their centre where water pools and acts as a reservoir which can help sustain them during dry periods. It is often a heavenly poolside retreat for frogs. Whenever this "well" dries up, it's time to water them again. Although bromeliads don't necessarily need feeding, this "well" is the place to apply fertilisers if you wish – however, never drop slow release fertiliser pellets into the reservoir as they will quickly dissolve and overdose your plants

Some types of Bromeliads:

Aechmea

There are 250 species of aechmea known to gardeners, displaying spike-like bracts extending from a centre cup. Most have broad rosettes and arching low-shaped leaves often with spiky margins. Aechmeas are relatively easy to grow, enjoy warmer temperatures and their colourful bracts last for many months.

Vriesea

Vriesea are easily distinguished by their sword shaped flowering spikes, with Vriesea splendens the showiest and most popular variety for indoor displays. Vrieseas flourish in bright indirect sunlight and enjoy high humidity, warm temperatures and can tolerate cool climates as well

Guzmania

Naturally epiphytic Guzmanias are a popular bromeliad due to their inflorescent fountain forming bracts, often mistaken for the flower, sitting proud from its centre. Bracts and flowers will last for many months. Its foliage is mostly dark green creating the perfect contrasting backdrop to their luminous bracts. If anchoring on a tree, secure the roots firmly around the host as the bracts can be top heavy. Water guzmanias through their centre 'tank', the area where the leaves form a cup at the base of the plant to preserve the life of the bract.

Neoregelias

Have showy and varying foliage colours and markings, and distinctive open vase-shaped central wells which are a haven for frogs. Their flowers are insignificant, barely sitting above the well of water, but they are generally grown for their foliage attributes and easy care nature.

Given plenty of bright light, young green pups gradually change foliage colour and display their signature bright colours as they mature.

Keep water in their 'well' and flush out the well periodically to remove stagnant water and bacteria.

Billbergia

Identified by their narrow channelling of foliage from the centre, the short-lived flower spike extends from the middle in a pendulous form with often spotted or banded rosette foliage patterns. Billbergia easily clump well at the base of trees and are easy to grow for all gardeners. Their inflorescence and flowers can grow in varying colours from red and pinks to purples and blues. Billbergias tolerate most Australian climates where strong frosts are not present.
