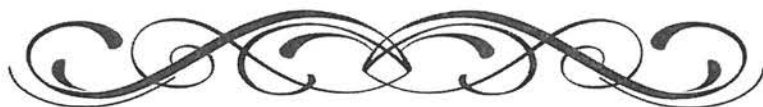

## LIGHTS, PROJECTOR, A FORTUNATE LIFE – ACTION

On a very warm Saturday evening, 20 March 2021, the Wickepin Town Hall was transformed into a live theatre complete with actors, projector and movie screen and a sold out crowd, all ready to be immersed in a performance of Albert Facey's A Fortunate Life.

The AB Facey's A Fortunate Life journey commenced many months ago with representatives from Theatre 180 visiting Wickepin to meet with the Shire, Albert Facey Homestead Committee and Facey family. They returned shortly after to record the sights and sounds of the unique Wickepin flavour and Wheatbelt authenticity that was prevalent throughout the production.

This is an exciting development for theatre which incorporates a full cinema sized screen behind the 3 actors who remain on stage for the full 1 ¾ hour performance. The screen played an integral part in showing different locations or situations in a video or photo format which added a whole new dimension to the show. It could indicate the route the family took from Victoria to Fremantle and then in an instant became the window of a moving train complete with trees rushing by. The most famous and well known part of the story which takes place at Cave Rock situated in the Pingelly Shire gave the story authenticity and transported the audience to that time with ease. The three performers took on over 80 roles with a switch of a hat or just a change in stance and voice within seconds to take the audience through the life and incredible times of Albert Facey.

A question and answer session after the show gave an insight into the background of creating the show that has been seen at cinemas throughout the metropolitan area and also in halls in regional areas. The audience came from Kulin, Narrogin, Perth and beyond and included the Chairman of the Theatre 180 board who chose to come to the Wickepin performance especially.

The cast and crew stated many times how much they had been looking forward to this performance, as a kind of homecoming not only for Albert but for them also, such is their connection to the story.

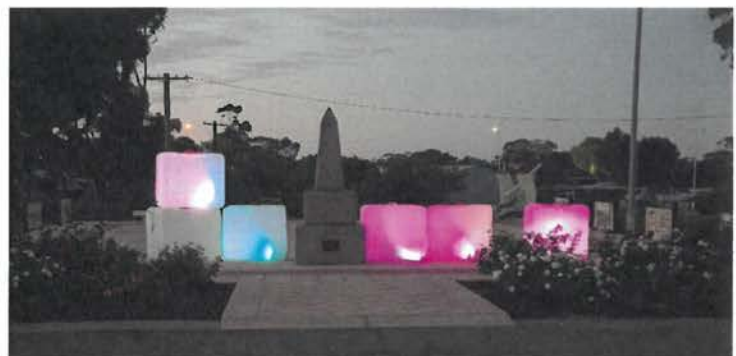

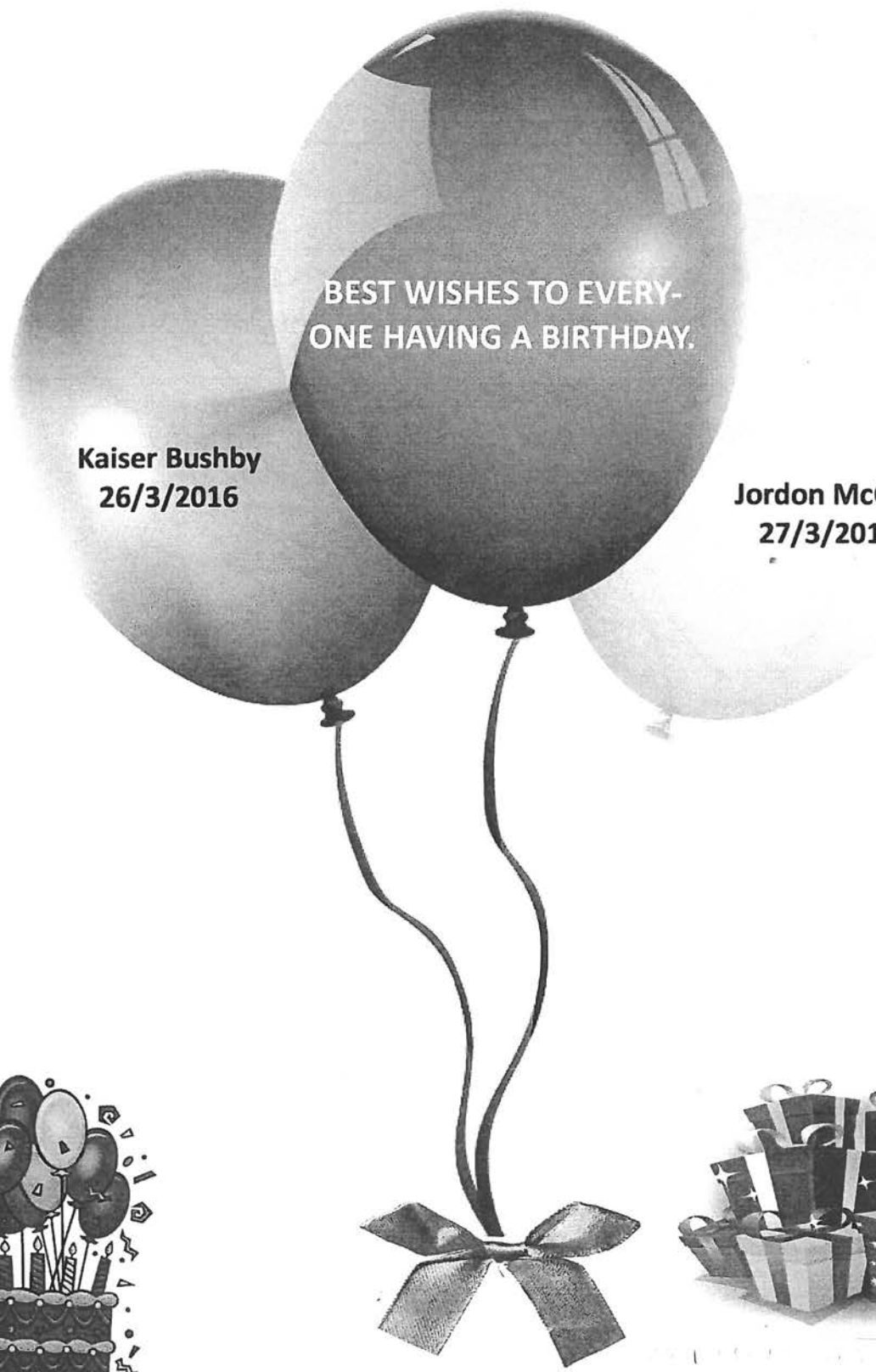

## *Autumn Plants for Free....*

*Autumn is the season to start Planting. Gardeners love this time of year as it is all about Renewal and Regeneration. With soil that is still warm, you will just need to water plants well, to get them off to a good start.*

*Also, with the passing of Summer, now is a great time to grow your own plants from cuttings. There is less risk of them drying out, but temperatures are still warm enough to encourage root formation and the establishment of new plants before Winter.*

*Cuttings taken now generally use Semi-hardwood (or new season growth that has partially hardened) or Hardwood (older growth that has not fully hardened). Don't be too worried about getting it exactly right. Just look for material that seems to have "toughened up" a little, and isn't super-soft or bendy.*

### *Step-by-Step Guide to Planting Cuttings*

1. Water the mother plants thoroughly the day before to ensure cuttings will be fully turgid when taken.
2. Select strong stems that have no signs of pests or diseases. Cut 10-20cm long pieces, ensuring each piece has at least one node under the ground, and one node above the ground. The top of the cutting should be trimmed to just above a node, and the base trimmed to just below the node (the node being the growing point from where the "roots and shoots" will develop).
3. Prepare the cutting by gently stripping off all leaves, except for a few at the top. If the remaining leaves are large, they can be cut in half to reduce moisture loss.
4. You can use honey or commercial hormone powder in which to dip the base end in to encourage faster root development.
5. Poke a hole into the potting mix with your finger, or a stick to avoid damage to the cutting stem, then insert the cutting into the hole (bottom, "dipped" end down.)
6. Water well, cover with a plastic bag and keep "just moist" until roots develop – commonly 4 to 8 weeks, but some plants take much longer, so be patient, and resist the urge to pull at the cutting to "check" if the roots are forming Also, due to their nature- deciduous plants won't show any "growth" until Spring.
7. Open the bag to reduce humidity and "harden off" the cuttings. Water and fertilise as required, and when the cutting is big enough in spring, you will be able to plant it out in the greater garden.

*Easy plants to try:* Abelia; Azalea, Geranium, Hydrangea, Hebe, Indian Hawthorn, Rhododendron; Cordyline, Correa, Eriostemon; LillyPilly; TeaTree; Westringia; Lavendar, Rosemary, Citrus, Passionfruit.

## ZUCCHINI & BACON FRITTERS

SERVES 4  
PREP 20 MIN  
COOK 15 MIN

- 2 medium zucchinis, grated
- 1 medium potato, peeled and grated
- 4 shortcut bacon rashers, trimmed and finely chopped
- ½ cup plain flour
- 1 egg, lightly beaten
- 2 tablespoons each chopped basil and chopped spring/green onions
- ½ teaspoon lemon pepper seasoning

1 Using your hands, squeeze excess moisture from zucchini then place on paper towel to drain.  
2 Combine zucchini, potato, bacon, flour, egg, herbs and lemon pepper. Heat 2 tablespoons vegetable oil in a large frying pan over medium heat. Spoon tablespoon measures of mixture into pan, pressing down lightly.  
3 Cook for 3-4 min each side or until lightly golden and cooked through. Drain on paper towel and keep warm. Repeat with rest of mixture. Serve fritters with beetroot and tzatziki dips and a fresh garden salad. Garnish with basil leaves.

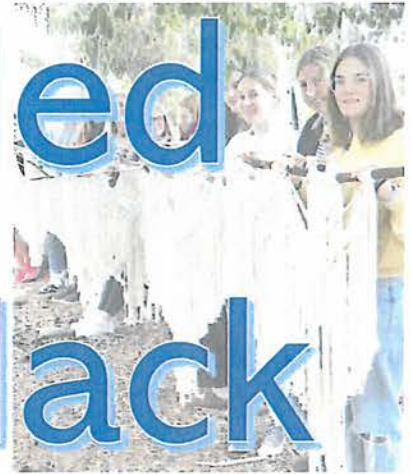

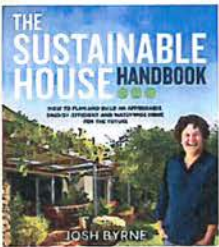


## Adult Fiction Tarryn Fisher - *The Wrong Family*
