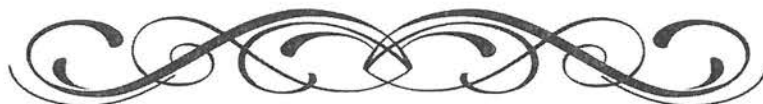

The terrible twos stretched into the threes for me. An only child whose mother was ill and hospitalized a good share of the time, I was watched by various relatives. But I missed my mama dreadfully, and acted accordingly. Apparently the only one who could cope with me was my grandmother in Wisconsin.

Grandma was a big strong Norwegian lady who raised eight children and milked nine cows the day after each child was born.

Once when she came to take care of me in our small home on the east side of St. Paul, I proceeded to make her life miserable. When she tried to take me for a walk, I'd scoot ahead of her at surprising speed, leaving her to chase me on her fifty-eight-year-old legs. When she devised an effective harness, I plunked down on the grass in our front yard and yelled. When she called me to eat lunch, I'd squeeze under my parents' iron bed, pulling down the chenille bedspread, or hid behind the brown overstuffed chair in the corner.

It all came to an end the day Grandma decided to soothe me once more in our old black wooden rocking chair. She had patience and lots of love, so she held me in her arms and sang songs from her childhood by the sea.

I was not impressed. I couldn't get away, and I still didn't like pulled tendrils of gray hair out of her neat bun, poked an inquisitive finger up her nose and jabbed her cheeks. Her blue eyes remained amazingly calm. Finally, I slipped my fingers into her mouth. Instantly the sipping stopped, and she wiggled her jaw in a funny way.

My hand came out holding her false teeth!

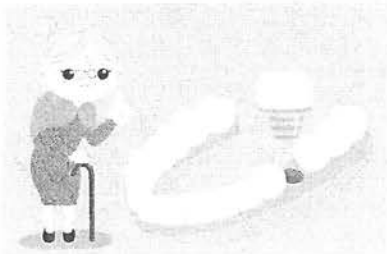
Shocked, I stared at the ugly things, dropped them and started screaming.

I cried for an hour. In between sobs I would hug her and ask if she was hurt. I kept hiccupping, "I'm sorry, I'm sorry." She rocked me contentedly.

My terrible threes ended that day.

They break into little pieces if you don't.



THE ANZAC ON THE WALL - Read by Irene Moore at the Wickepin ANZAC service 25/04/2021

I wandered thru a country town, 'cos I had some time to spare,
And went into an antique shop to see what was in there.
Old Bikes and pumps and kero lamps, but hidden by it all,
A photo of a soldier boy – an Anzac on the Wall.
'The Anzac have a name?' I asked. The old man answered 'No'.
The ones who could have told me mate, have passed on long ago.
The old man kept on talking and, according to his tale,
The photo was unwanted junk bought from a clearance sale.
'I asked around', the old man said, 'but no-one knows his face,
He's been on that wall twenty years... Deserves a better place.
For some-one must have loved him, so it seems a shame somehow.'
I nodded in agreement and then said, 'I'll take him now.'
My nameless digger's photo, well it was a sorry sight
A cracked glass pane and a broken frame - I had to make it right
To prise the photo from its frame I took care just in case,
Cause only sticky paper held the cardboard back in place.
I peeled away the faded screed and much to my surprise,
Two letters and a telegram appeared before my eyes
The first reveals my Anzac's name, and regiment of course
John Mathew Francis Stuart - of Australia's own Light Horse.
This letter written from the front... My interest now was keen
This note was dated August seventh, 1917
'Dear Mum, I'm at Khalasa Springs not far from the Red Sea
They say it's in the Bible - looks like a Billabong to me.
'My Kathy wrote I'm in her prayers... she's still my bride to be
I just can't wait to see you both, you're all the world to me.
And Mum you'll soon meet Bluey, last month they shipped him out
I told him to call on you when he's up and about.'
'That bluey is a larrikin, and we all thought it funny
He lobbed a Turkish hand grenade into the CO's dunny.
I told you how he dragged me wounded, in from no man's land
He stopped the bleeding, closed the wound, with only his bare hand.'
'Then he copped it at the front from some stray shrapnel blast
It was my turn to drag him in and I thought he wouldn't last.
He woke up in hospital, and nearly lost his mind
Cause out there on the battlefield he'd left one leg behind.'
'He's been in a bad way Mum, he knows he'll ride no more
Like me he loves a horse's back, he was a champ before.
So Please Mum can you take him in, he's been like my own brother
Raised in a Queensland orphanage he's never known a mother.'
But Struth, I miss Australia Mum, and in my mind each day,
I am a mountain cattleman on high plains far away.
I'm mustering white-faced cattle, with no camel's hump in sight
And I waltz my Matilda by a campfire every night
I wonder who rides Billy, I heard the pub burnt down
I'll always love you and please say hooroo to all in town'.
The second letter I could see, was in a lady's hand
An answer to her soldier son there in a foreign land.
Her copperplate was perfect, the pages neat and clean
It bore the date, November 3rd, 1917.
'T'was hard enough to lose your Dad, without you at the war
I'd hoped you would be home by now - each day I miss you more'
'Your Kathy calls around a lot since you have been away
To share with me her hopes and dreams about your wedding day.
And Bluey has arrived - and what a godsend he has been
We talked and laughed for days about the things you've done and seen'
'He really is a comfort, and works hard around the farm,
I read the same hope in his eyes that you won't come to harm.
McConnell's kids rode Billy, but suddenly that changed.
We had a violent lightning storm, and it was really strange.'
'Last Wednesday, just on midnight, not a single cloud in sight,
It raged for several minutes, it gave us all a fright.
It really spooked your Billy - and he screamed and bucked and reared

And then he rushed the sliprail fence, which by a foot he cleared'
'They brought him back next afternoon, but something's changed I fear
It's like the day you brought him home, for no one can get near.
Remember when you caught him with his black and flowing mane?
Now Horse breakers fear the beast that only you can tame,'
'That's why we need you home son' - then the flow of ink went dry-
This letter was unfinished, and I couldn't work out why.
Until I started reading, the letter number three
A yellow telegram delivered news of tragedy,
Her son killed in action - oh - what pain that must have been
The same date as her letter - 3rd November 1917
This letter which was never sent, became then one of three
She sealed behind the photo's face - the face she longed to see.
And John's home town's old timers - children when he went to war
Would say no greater cattleman had left the town before.
They knew his widowed mother well - and with respect did tell
How when she lost her only boy she lost her mind as well.
She could not face the awful truth, to strangers she would speak
'My Johnny's at the war you know, he's coming home next week.'
They all remembered Bluey he stayed on to the end.
A younger man with wooden leg became her closest friend.
And he would go and find her when she wandered old and weak
And always softly say 'yes dear - John will be home next week.'
Then when she died Bluey moved on, to Queensland some did say.
I tried to find out where he went, but don't know to this day.
And Kathy never wed - a lonely spinster some found odd.
She wouldn't set foot in a church - she'd turned her back on God.
John's mother left no Will I learned on my detective trail.
This explains my photo's journey, of that clearance sale.
So I continued digging, cause I wanted to know more.
I found John's name with thousands, in the records of the war.
His last ride proved his courage - a ride you will acclaim
The Light Horse Charge at Beersheba of everlasting fame.
That last day in October, back in 1917
At 4pm our brave boys fell - that sad fact I did glean.
That's when John's life was sacrificed, the record's crystal clear
But 4pm in Beersheba is midnight over here.....
So as John's gallant spirit rose to cross the great divide,
Were lightning bolts back home, a signal from the other side?
Is that why Billy bolted and went racing as in pain?
Because he'd never feel his master on his back again?
Was it coincidental? same time - same day - same date?
Some proof of numerology, or just a quirk of fate?
I think it's more than that you know, as I've heard wiser men,
Acknowledge there are many things that go beyond our ken
Where craggy peaks guard secrets 'neath dark skies torn asunder,
Where hoof-beats are companions to the rolling waves of thunder
Where lightning cracks like 303's and ricochets again
Where howling moaning gusts of wind sound just like dying men.
Some Mountain cattlemen have sworn on lonely alpine track,
They've glimpsed a huge black stallion - Light Horseman on his back.
Yes Sceptics say, it's swirling clouds just forming apparitions
Oh no, my friend you can't dismiss all this as superstition.
The desert of Beersheba - or windswept Aussie range,
John Stuart rides on forever there - Now I don't find that strange.
Now some gaze upon this photo, and they often question me
And I tell them a small white lie, and say he's family.
'You must be proud of him.' they say - I tell them, one and all,
That's why he takes - the pride of place - my Anzac on the Wall.

ANZAC DAY SERVICE

Our community were fortunate to be able to proceed with our ANZAC Day service even though some very last minute changes were required due to the COVID lockdown. Thank you to Emma Graf who made herself available to play the Last Post at such short notice, to Sergeant Phil Huggins for The Ode of Remembrance, and to all the community members who helped in the organising of and attended the service.

Cr Julie Russell introduced and address the Service which read:

Good Morning Ladies & Gentlemen, Girls & Boys, and welcome to our ANZAC Day Ceremony for 2021.

For over a Century, Australians have served in conflict and in peace around the world, protecting Values of Freedom and Democracy.

Each year on ANZAC Day, we commemorate this service and the great debt we owe to the Men, Women and Animals of our Australian Defence Force for their courage and sacrifice.

In World War 1 the ANZAC Spirit was forged at Gallipoli, and then in the many battles of the Western Front.

In particular, this year we are commemorating 105 years since the battles of Pozieres and Fromelles.

The battle of Pozieres took place in Northern France from 23rd July to 3rd September 1916, and in this time the Australian Imperial Forces (AIF) lost as many men over a few weeks as it did over the 8 months on Gallipoli.

The Battle of Fromelles took place over the 24 hours of 19th July and 20th July 1916, where it is believed to be the greatest loss by a single division in 24 hours during the entire First World War, with over 5,500 Australian casualties. Almost 2,000 of them were killed in action or died of wounds, and some 400 were captured.

Eighty years ago in 1941, the stoicism of Australian soldiers was again on display when the Rats of Tobruk of the 9th and 7th Divisions held firm while besieged by German and Italian forces, thus denying the vital Libyan Port of Tobruk to the enemy.

Ten years later in 1951, our soldiers succeeded in Operation Commando in Korea; and then in 1966 Australia made a significant contribution to the Vietnam War at the Battle of Long Tan.

Australians continue to serve with distinction around the world and this ANZAC Day we commemorate more than a Century of Service.

We gather to Remember the Sacrifices of the Original ANZAC's, and to Pay Respect, and Give Thanks, to our Service Men, Women and Animals who have served, and continue to serve Our Nation;

And we take this opportunity to Remember Those Who are No Longer With Us.





Irene Morre then followed with the Prayer of Remembrance.

The Wickepin Primary School was represented by Hannah Green who recited "Sir" by Damian Morgan followed by Diggah Martin and Kate Bennier laying the wreath.

Dale Hill represented the Yealering Primary School and recited "ANZAC Day" by D Hunter (A Veteran of Shaggy Ridge with the 2/12 Battalion in WW2). Dale accompanied by his sister, Jorja Hill then laid the wreath together, followed by CEO Mark Hook, CR Julie Russell and Cr Nathan Astbury representing the Shire of Wickepin and OIC Sergeant Phil Huggins representing the Wickepin Police.

Irene Moore then recited "The ANZAC On The Wall" by Jim Brown.

The Service was closed by CR Julie Russell and all attendees enjoyed a morning tea held in the Hall.


Adult Fiction Gretel Killeen - My Daughters Wedding



Adult Fiction Denise Hunter - Carolina Breeze




A jilted bride. A struggling innkeeper. And a romantic mountain getaway that changes everything. Rising Hollywood star Mia Emerson is looking for a safe place to land in the wake of a public breakup and scandal, and she finds it in the lake town of Bluebell, North Carolina—the location of her canceled honeymoon. She wants nothing more than to hide and wait for the tabloids to die down. Soon after her arrival at the Bluebell Inn, Mia meets Levi Bennett, who runs the inn along with his two younger sisters. Drawn to one another from the start, Mia trusts Levi to keep her location from the press, and Levi confides in Mia about the financial state of the inn—a secret he's been keeping from his sisters. IN THE KITCHEN

LEMON-STRAWBERRY MUG CAKE

Ingredients

- 3 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 3 tablespoons sugar
- ¼ teaspoon baking powder
- 1 egg
- 2 tablespoons canola oil
- 1 teaspoon grated lemon zest
- 2 teaspoons lemon juice
- 1 strawberry, finely chopped
- Sliced strawberries, optional
- Icing sugar, optional

Instructions

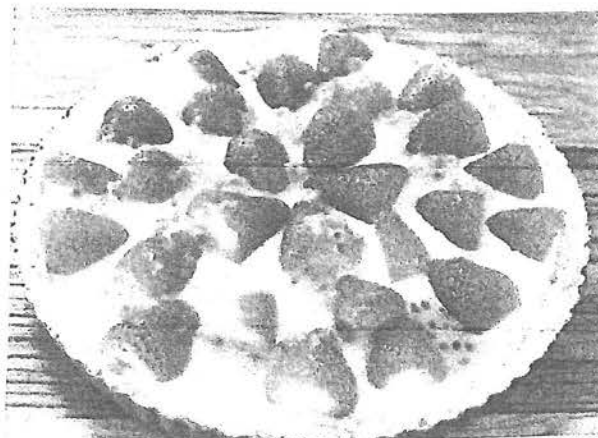
- 1 Spray a large microwave-safe mug with oil
- 2 Combine flour with sugar and baking powder in a small bowl. Stir in egg, oil, lemon-zest and juice. Gently fold in chopped strawberries. Scrape into prepared mug.
- 3 Microwave on high for 2 minutes. Remove and let stand for 5 minutes. Garnish with strawberry slices and sifted icing sugar, if desired.



Method

No-bake fruit tart

1. In a large bowl mix together 250g crushed arrowroot biscuits and 150g melted butter until it forms a wet, crumbly cookie dough consistency. You should be able to ball it together in your fist without it breaking apart.
2. Press the biscuit base mix into a fluted tart tin with removable base. Use the base of a glass to press the mixture into the sides of the tin.
3. Put the base into the fridge while you make the custard.
4. Pour 750ml milk into a large bowl, then sprinkle the 150g pudding mix over, whisking briskly and continuously until the pudding mix starts to set.
5. Pour the custard into the tin and put it in the fridge to set for about 15 minutes.
6. Hull and halve 250g fresh strawberries and spread them over the top of the tart. Drizzle with passionfruit pulp.



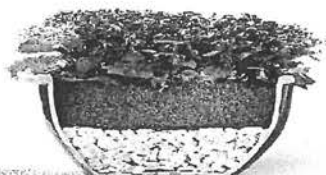
Garden Snippets...



...Simple Watering

With changing seasons, watering of the garden plants – both in pots and in the garden beds – can become a challenge to keep the plants healthily hydrated without overdoing it and drowning them. Here are some simple watering tips to keep in mind for better plant performance.

- **Water when appropriate** - Don't overwater your plants. If you are unsure if your plant needs watering, just stick your finger into the soil to see how moist it is.
- **Timing** - The most effective times to water are early in the mornings and later in the afternoons, so that the heat of the day doesn't evaporate the water you've just used.
- **Soil Hydration** - Ensure that the soil around your plants hasn't dried out. This especially refers to the soil in potted plants, as pots easily heat up and dry the soil quicker than in the garden bed, but is also relevant to plants in hotter parts of the garden beds. If your pots are drying out too quickly, then try moving them to a cooler spot.
- **Pot Drainage** - Check that the holes in your pots are large enough for the water to seep through, and that they are not blocked. Also check that the soil hasn't fallen out through the holes, leaving the plant with no soil around the rootzone. Placing larger pieces of stone or bark in the bottom of the pot before filling with potting mix will assist with keeping soil from falling through the drain holes, whilst still ensuring good drainage of water. Perching the pot on a flat surface like a slab or bricks will ensure the holes don't get blocked from directly sitting on the ground soil.
- **Add Mulch** – A Layer of mulch will help to keep the soils evenly moist - both on pots and on garden beds - but make sure the soil is moist before applying the mulch, so that the mulch doesn't absorb all the water first and have the soil remaining dry.
- **Watering Methods** – If watering by hand with a hose, use a trigger nozzle with a multitude of holes to evenly spread out the water coverage, to prevent the topsoil or mulch from being blasted away. If the soil has become hard and compact from long dry periods, and the water is being repelled instead of absorbed, then aerate with a fork or shovel, incorporating some organic matter as you go, then use wetting granules which will encourage the water to incorporate and soak back into the soil. Utilising drip irrigation systems can be an effective method of watering as it allows plants to be watered at regular intervals and receive water over a longer period of time.
