

### **Who can apply?**

Not-for-profit community groups based in the electorate of Central Wheatbelt (see attached electorate map). Groups do not need to be incorporated, but must have been in operation for a minimum of 12 months.

### **How often can a group apply?**

Eligible groups can submit one application per round. Applicants that are successful cannot apply again within the same year.

### **How much can a group apply for?**

Grants will be up to \$250, inclusive of GST. There will be a limit on the number of grants allocated in each round so get creative and wow me with your application!

### **Grant dates**

This grant round will open on Tuesday, 1 June 2021 and close Friday, 18 June 2021 at 4:00pm.





## **AUDIOBOOK - THE WIFE UPSTAIRS BY RACHEL HAWKINS**



## Winter Warmer Recipe Ideas:

### LEMONY CHICKEN

#### Ingredients

- 3 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 kg (2 lb) chicken drumsticks, seasoned
- 1 large leek, halved, washed and thinly sliced
- 4 large strips lemon rind, white pith removed
- ½ cup (125 ml/4 fl oz) fresh lemon juice
- 1 cup (250 ml/8 fl oz) dry white wine
- 500 g (1 lb) baby carrots, trimmed

#### Method

1. In a large heavy-based frying pan, heat the oil and sauté the chicken in two batches, for 6–8 minutes each batch, or until brown and crispy. Return all the chicken to the pan, add the leek and cook until the leek is just wilted. Add the lemon rind and cook for 1–2 minutes.
2. Pour the lemon juice and wine into the pan and allow the flavours to combine for a few seconds. Stir, add the carrots, then cover and cook for 30–35 minutes, stirring occasionally, until the chicken is cooked. Remove the rind, then taste and adjust the seasoning if necessary.



### LEMON SAGO PUDDING

#### Ingredients

- ¾ cup sago
- ½ cup lemon juice
- 2 tbs sugar
- 1 tbs honey

#### Method

- Bring 2 cups water to the boil. Add sago and stir until the mixture boils, then simmer for 15-20 minutes until cooked. Add lemon juice, sugar and honey or golden syrup, cook for 2 more minutes. Put into serving dish and allow to cool. Serve with cream, custard or ice-cream. Keep in the fridge, well covered.



Try hot liquids like this **honey lemon drink**.

## *Garden Snippets...*



### *...Hydrangea Happiness...*

*Neglected Hydrangeas that produce only poor-quality small blooms can be easily transformed in a year to a tidy, vigorous, happy bush by having a proper prune.*

*Pruning Hydrangeas is a simple task, yet many plants are still spoilt for the following season by being given an "overall trim".*

*For a good display, new unflowered canes must be left intact, or only lightly tipped.*

*Early Winter (May/June) is the best time to prune the Old Type of Hydrangea seen in most gardens. The newer, more colourful hybrids should be pruned immediately after flowers fade in Autumn. This is because next season's flowers are produced from growths made this year, so drastic cutting of the hybrids during winter result in a mass of young spring growth that often fails to flower.*

Otherwise the basic rules of pruning apply to both types:

1. Remove all old, weak and spindly wood as close to the base of the plant as possible, to leave evenly spaced canes that give a balanced shape to the plant when you look at it. If there are insufficient new flowering canes available, then cut the old wood back to a healthy bud, which will encourage new growth from the bud.

2. Retain strong, unflowered growths – If these are left alone then they will produce a big, single head of bloom. If the tips are cut back to two flowering buds, the canes will produce more than one head of blooms, but they will flower a little later, and may be slightly smaller in size.

3. Remove old foliage at pruning time to show the canes to be bare – Although this is not essential, it helps to keep down diseases such as mildew and gives the plant a tidy appearance.

4. Feed Hydrangeas with a generous dressing of complete fertiliser or manure, and decayed compost applied as a mulch.

5. To encourage Blue Hydrangea Flowers, the soil needs to have a pH of 5.2 to 5.5. If your soil is more alkaline, you can lower the pH by applying Soil Acidifier (Aluminium Sulphate) at the specified rate on the package, or at a more gradual pace by using an acidic organic mulch such as pine needles or pine bark.

## “Wild About Wickepin”

Giant Red Velvet Mite seen scurrying over sheoak ‘needles’  
(May 7th).

On the morning after our 70mm rain event in Autumn, I saw several of these creatures running over leaf litter, each in an awful hurry !

They were most probably after their first meal in a long time, ..ideally some termites.  
And to find themselves a mate.

Red Velvet Mites, also called “rain bugs”, are a worldwide family of the mightiest of mites.

Our Giant Velvet Mites are from either the Austrothrombium or Dinothrombium genus. Despite our mite being so big, bright & hairy, it does not yet have a scientific name.

One reason for this is that Velvet Mites have a lengthy and complicated lifecycle, spent mostly below ground. They only breed once a year.

This all makes the studying of them very tricky !

The red, velvety adults emerge from their burrows after ‘first’ heavy rains and spend a short period above-ground; enough time to eat a big meal and reproduce.

Their bright red colour alerts would-be predators to their bad taste, so nothing ever eats them.

In a fascinating mating “dance”, the male lays down sperm along a branch and then crafts a silken trail, so as to entice females to come and sit down on his sperm.


### **Imagine,...**

*A Spider no bigger than a Tic-Tac and looking very much like a Tick ! Then paint it a bright iridescent orange-red.*


Although they are related to Ticks, Velvet Mites are far more beneficial, than pesky !

In an around-about way, they benefit the life of fungi, integral to the decomposition process and so, to the health of the soil.

I understand that in their larval stage, they are being considered for use in biological control of certain insect pests.
