HOISIN-GLAZED TOFU AND GREEN BEANS

Ingredients

- 3 Tablespoons water
- 2 Tablespoons hoisin sauce
- 1 Tablespoon soy sauce or tamari sauce
- 1 Tablespoon freshly grated ginger
- ¼ teaspoon chilli powder (optional)
- 2 Tablespoons vegetable oil
- 450g firm tofu, drained, pressed and cut into 2cm pieces
- 3 cloves garlic, thinly sliced

200g green beans, trimmed and/or fresh snow peas trimmed

Hot cooked rice noodles or rice

Lime Wedges



Method

- 1. For sauce, in a small bowl combine first five ingredients (through chilli powder)
- 2. In a large frying pan heat 1 Tablespoon of the oil over medium-high. Add tofu. Cook, without stirring, 4 minutes or until tofu begins to brown. Turn and cook 4 minutes more or until tofu is golden on all sides.
- Remove from pan.
- 3. Add remaining 1 Tablespoon oil to pan. Add garlic, cook and stir 30 seconds. Add beans, cook 4 minutes more or until nearly tender, stirring occasionally. Return tofu to pan; add sauce. Bring to boiling, stirring to coat. Serve with noodles and lime wedges.

ORANGE & CRANBERRY MUFFINS

Ingredients

200g SR Flour

110g Wholemeal Flour

110g Raw Sugar

65g dried Cranberries, chopped

185ml Orange Juice

2 eggs whisked

125ml olive oil

Icing sugar, to dust

Orange Zest, to serve





Preheat oven to 180C. Line 8 holes of a 12 hole muffin pan with paper cases. Place the combined flour, sugar and cranberries in a large bowl and stir to combine.

Whisk the orange juice, egg and oil in a large jug. Add to the flour mixture and stir until just combined (Don't overmix)

Spoon the mixture evenly among paper cases. Bake for 20 minutes or until a skewer inserted in the centre comes out clean. Cool slightly

Dust the muffins with icing sugar and sprinkle with orange zest.




