

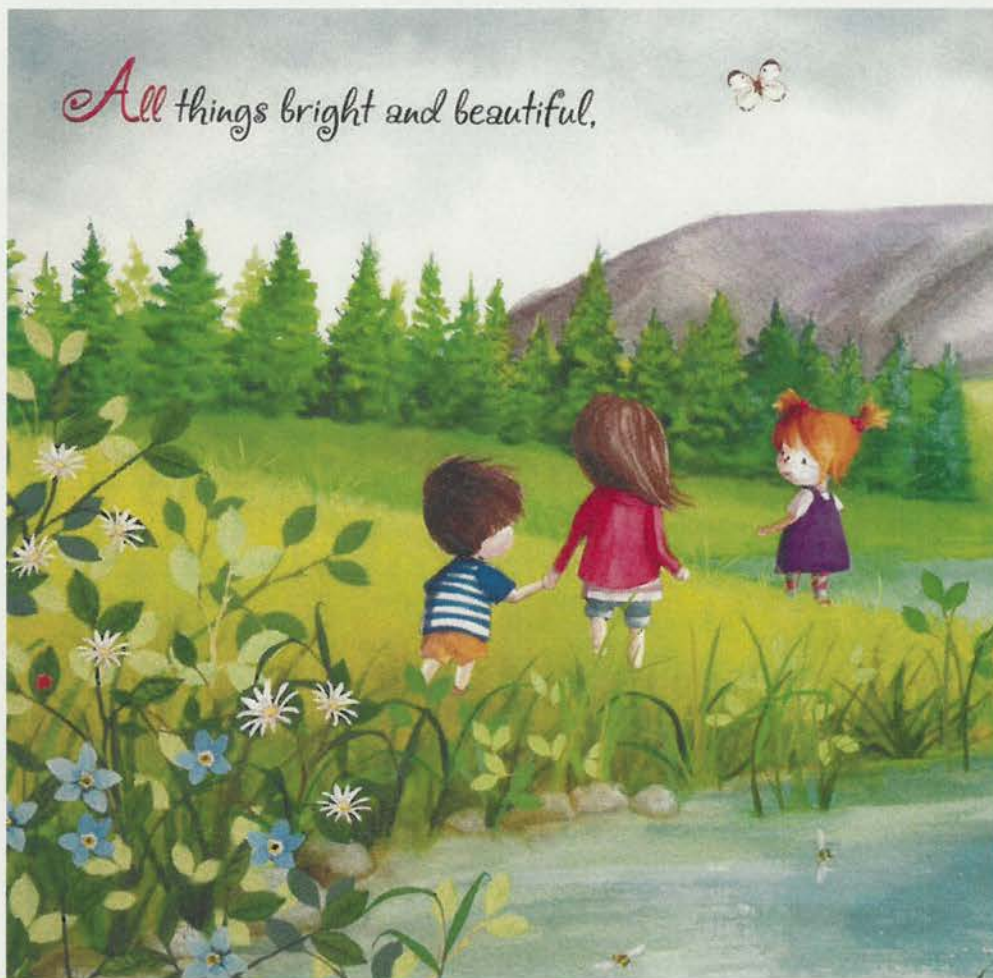

FIREBREAK NOTICE 2021/22

At its August meeting, council resolved to amend its annual firebreak notice to include the following:

That from the 15th October all harvesting and baling (including cutting and raking) operations, there shall be an operational mobile engine powered firefighting unit or units with a **minimum combined capacity of 1200 litres of available water**, located in or immediately adjacent to the paddock being harvested and/or baled. **The minimum capacity of any single firefighting unit shall be 600 litres of available water.** The responsibility to supply and operate the firefighting unit is that of the landowner/occupier.

A complete 2021/22 Firebreak Notice can be found on the next page of these council notes along with the current Bush Fire Season information.

Bush Fires Act 1954
Shire of Wickepin
Annual Firebreak Notice 2021/2022

Action is required by owners and/or occupiers of all land in the Shire of Wickepin. Please read this notice carefully. Any queries should be directed to the Shire of Wickepin Administration Centre or Local Shire Bush Fire Control Officer. Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, owners and occupiers of property within the Shire of Wickepin are hereby required on or before 1 October 2021 and thereafter to 14 April 2022 to plough, scarify or otherwise provide and maintain firebreaks clear of all inflammable material at least 2.5 metres wide as follows:

Rural Land

Inside the boundary of all land held by each owner or occupier, their firebreaks need not follow the perimeter of any paddock but will be acceptable following land contours in an endeavour to overcome water erosion;

- To subdivide each holding into lots of no greater than 400 hectares; and
- To surround the homestead, out buildings and fuel storages on any such land.
- That from the 15th October all harvesting and baling (including cutting and raking) operations, there shall be an operational mobile engine powered firefighting unit or units with a minimum combined capacity of 1200 litres of available water, located in or immediately adjacent to the paddock being harvested and/or baled. The minimum capacity of any single firefighting unit shall be 600 litres of available water. The responsibility to supply and operate the firefighting unit is that of the landowner/occupier.

Townsite Land

All lots within the townsites of Harrismith, Tincurrin, Toolibin, Wickepin and Yealering are required to be cleared and maintained free of all debris or inflammable material. Failure to comply with these requirements renders the owner or occupier liable to a penalty not more than \$400.

Clearing of Fence Lines

When clearing for new fence lines adjoining road reserves, you must have written approval from the Shire of Wickepin prior to commencement of clearing works. Landholders are asked to consider locating the fence three (3) metres inside their boundary to avoid any clearing on road reserves. Old fences should first be removed. If landholders wish to place their fence on the boundary, they may clear no more than one (1) metre beyond their boundary. This may be varied in special circumstances at the discretion of the CEO and Manager Works & Services. Any timber removed from the road reserve is to be pushed onto the owner's property.

Fencing of Road Reserves

Council encourages farmers to fence off road reserves running through their properties to protect trees on these reserves and to allow new growth of vegetation.

Burning on Roadsides

Should property owners wish to carry out burning of the road reserve adjacent to their property, it is necessary to obtain council approval prior to any burning taking place.

Burning Periods

Restricted Burning – 1 October 2021 to 13 November 2021
Prohibited Burning – 14 November 2021 to 7 February 2022
Restricted Burning – 8 February 2022 to 14 April 2022

Harvest and Fire Ban 2021/2022 Season

Harvesting is banned on Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day.
Lighting of fires is banned on Good Friday and Easter Sunday.

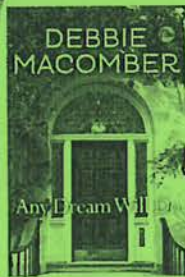
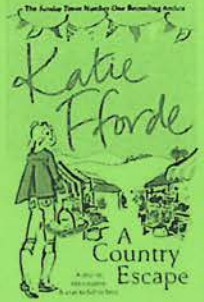


Adult Fiction *She lies in wait* by Gytha Lodge

Caramelised Nectarine Salad

Ingredients:

4 ripe nectarines, halved, stones removed
8 thin slices of prosciutto
150g bag baby rocket leaves
2 tablespoons caramelised balsamic vinegar

Method:

Preheat the BBQ to medium, Cook the nectarine halves for 2 minutes on each side or until golden. Add the prosciutto half way and cook until just crispy. When both are done place the nectarines on a serving platter with the rocket leaves and weave through the prosciutto, then drizzle with caramelised balsamic vinegar. Season with cracked pepper and serve immediately.

Garden Snippets....



.... Sensational SALVIAS ...

Salvias (Sage) are splendid and showy plants that can be used in formal and informal plantings, patio and terrace plantings and large pots. They are classified as annuals, biennials, perennials and herbaceous shrubs, and they are rugged plants which grow equally well in rubbly clay or friable loam, provided they are well drained. From the many species available, there will be a size to suit all gaps in the garden, from very small to 3 metres high, with flowering happening at best in Spring through to Autumn. The name "Salvia" comes from the Latin "salvare", a reference to the plant's ability to heal. Ancient herbalists used various species of sage to cure anything from snake bites to epilepsy, including improved vision; antiseptic; soothing tonic and intoxicating sage beer.

Planting and Care: Plant in a sunny position with well drained soil, but will also do well in part shade. They can be planted en masse or in pots – the choice is endless. They are tolerant of moderate droughts, although in poor soils, mulch will help to protect their roots during prolonged periods of hot and dry weather.

Annual and perennial varieties can be pruned after flowering to remove spent flowers and repropotion top heavy plants. Prune larger shrubby types to approximately 45cm from the ground in autumn, after which they will produce fresh new growth almost immediately.

Fertilise occasionally with whatever you have available, either organic or soluble fertiliser, although beware that too much nitrogenous food will result in excess foliage at the expense of the flowers.

Some Common Varieties: The most flamboyant and well known of all the salvias is the red flowering variety *Salvia splendens*, with many different cultivars and usually red to pink to cream in colour. They flower prolifically, and either self seed or can be propagated from cutting or division of clumps. Also this variety performs equally well in sun and shade.

Blue shades of *Salvia farinacea* are much more slender and discrete than the red salvias, so you will need about ten times as many plants for the same area. This group need cutting back to ground level in autumn after flowering has finished, and sometimes takes a few weeks to re-grow, so make sure you mark the clump with a stake so you remember where it is.

Finally, *Salvia dorisiana* "Fruity Sage" is a winter flowering variety with hot pink blooms which are relished by honeyeaters of all kinds. The perfume is emitted from the large, furry evergreen foliage and smells reminiscent of fruit salad (hence it's common name). This species is happiest in partial shade, with moist soil and needs pruning at the end of it's flowering season, after which it recovers quickly with lush new growth.

Salvias, as a whole, are splendid and showy plants that never stop flowering. They are great assets to the garden, and are also loved by small birds and bees throughout the year.
