The Western Australian Electoral Commission is seeking a Returning Officer to run the Shire of Wickepin Local Government Election, commencing in August and concluding end October 2023.





2023 Influenza Vaccines

Free adult influenza vaccines are now available at the Wickepin Health Service for eligible clients

Monday drop-in clinic 9:30am - 12:30pm

The following individuals in WA are eligible to receive government-funded vaccine:

- individuals 65 years or older
- pregnant women (any trimester)
- · Aboriginal people 6 months and older
- individuals with medical conditions that place them at risk for complications of influenza, including:
 - cardiac disease
 - o chronic respiratory conditions
 - o chronic neurological conditions
 - o impaired immunity
 - o diabetes and other metabolic disorders
 - renal disease
 - haematological disorders

Clients who do not fit the criteria for a free Health Department influenza vaccine are encouraged to see their GP or local Pharmacy

Garden Snippets...



Whether you own your home, or are just renting it, rejuvenating a tired, struggling garden bed is a task well worth undertaking to enable your lovely garden plants to grow and flourish to their best potential.

Combatting weeds is always a challenge, and the age old use of black plastic to smother them has proven that it also smothers the plant's ability to grow by blocking the rain, water and fertiliser from penetrating into the soil, thereby depriving the plants of much needed nourishment that enables good healthy growth. The soil underneath often becomes stale and sweaty as it is unable to breathe.

A far better way of weed control is by rejuvenating the garden bed, adding new soil and applying a good layer of mulch. This will inhibit and weaken weeds and allows water and air to circulate, roots will be healthier, micro-organisms will be more active and plants will flourish.

Here's How:

- 1. Use a hoe or metal rake to remove top surface layer of old bark, soil etc. and expose any old plastic sheeting.
- 2. Remove the plastic sheeting, cutting around any existing plants. Roots may have struggled along the surface searching for water, and the soil will look unhealthy.
- 3. Dig up and re-locate any plants that you think are worth keeping. These can either be transplanted or re-planted into pots, using good quality potting mix.
- 4. Remove any weeds by hand or with a spade, ensuring that any old roots are also dug out. Discard any old plants that are beyond redemption.
- 5. Remove the top layer of soil to at least a depth of 20cm. Some areas may need to be dug deeper, depending on the type and condition of the soil.
- 6. Test the remaining soil to check the pH. A pH of 7 is neutral, below this is "acidic", and above is "alkaline". The ideal level for most garden plants is about 5.5-6.5, making nutrients that are in the soil available to the plants. Many native plants plus citrus and azaleas suit 4.5-5.5; whereas the likes of wisteria and peas suit 6.5-7.5.
- 7. This will also be the appropriate time to change the size and shape of your garden bed if you wish.
- 8. Fill the garden bed with fresh soil. If it is clay based add some river sand, gypsum, humus and sawdust to break down the clay and promote good root growth.
- 9. Experiment using potted plants to see how the sizes and colours best fit together. Starting with the tallest (at the back of the bed) remove from the pots and plant into the garden bed.
- 10. Add a layer of fresh mulch at least 6cm deep to protect roots from heat, reduce moisture loss and suppress weed growth. Water in well, and when the plants are settled and you can see some new growth (a few weeks after planting), fertilise lightly and water well.
