



TIER 3 RAIL LINES RECOMMISSIONING STUDY - RESIDENTS SURVEY



Winter warmers

Easy shepherd's pie

Ingredients:

1 tbsp extra virgin olive oil

1 brown onion, finely chopped

2 garlic cloves, crushed

1 carrot, finely diced

1 celery stalk, finely diced

1 tsp fresh rosemary leaves, finely

chopped

500g lamb or beef mince

2 tbsp plain flour

1 tbsp worcestershire sauce

2 tbsp tomato paste

2 cups Massel beef stock

800g cream delight potatoes, peeled,

chopped

1/2 cup milk

50g butter

Method:

Heat oil in a frying pan over medium heat. Add onion, garlic, carrot and celery. Cook, stirring, for 10 minutes or until softened. Add rosemary. Cook for 1 minute or until fragrant. Increase heat to high. Add mince. Cook, stirring with a wooden spoon to break up mince, for 6 to 8 minutes or until browned.

Add flour. Cook, stirring for 2 minutes. Add worcestershire sauce and paste. Cook, stirring, for 1 minute. Add stock. Bring to the boil. Reduce heat to low. Cook, stirring occasionally, for 25 to 30 minutes or until thickened. Season with salt and pepper.

Meanwhile, place potato in a large saucepan. Cover with cold water. Bring to the boil over high heat. Cook for 10 to 12 minutes or until tender. Drain. Return to pan over low heat. Add milk and 25g butter. Mash until smooth.

Preheat oven to 200C/180C fan-forced. Spoon mince mixture into an 8 cup-capacity baking dish. Top with mash, using a fork to spread out over mince mixture. Dot with remaining 25g butter. Bake for 20 minutes or until golden. Serve. Recipe from www.taste.com.au

1 cup water


1 tablespoon butter

1 tablespoon golden syrup


1 cup sugar

Keep your wits when buying tickets

Live sport and music lovers will be spoilt for choice in the coming months, as Western Australia gets set to host to a slew of major international events.

Competition for tickets to the likes of the FIFA Women's World Cup, Coldplay and P!NK has been fierce, so it's never been more important for WA consumers to stay on the ball when trying to secure their own seat or spot.

We have no doubt ticket scalpers and scammers will come crawling out of the woodwork to offer tickets on resale sites or online classifieds that either don't exist or are at illegally inflated prices.

That's why your safest option is to always buy tickets through the authorised ticketing agent, or via its authorised resale site if you miss out.

Before snapping up tickets to any event, it's important to check whether they come with a 'resale restriction.' If they do, it means you cannot sell them for more than a 10 per cent mark-up and you may have issues transferring them into a different name should you no longer be able to attend.

When advertising tickets with resale restrictions, resellers must also remember to include the original ticket cost (including booking fees) and details of the seat row and number.

Event goers can rest assured that when major concerts or sporting competitions are advertised, our compliance officers proactively monitor resale sites and online classifieds for fake tickets and to ensure genuine resale tickets comply with the legislation, in addition to investigating complaints about misconduct.

Following one such investigation earlier this year, Consumer Protection issued five \$2000 infringement notices to scalpers who illegally advertised tickets to the Ultimate Fighting Championship (UFC 284) event for up to 430 per cent more than they originally paid for them.

We want consumers to help us stop ticket scalpers and scammers in their tracks. The first thing to do if you've bought a ticket that doesn't comply with the law is to ask for a refund from the supplier or individual seller. Failing this, you may be able to seek a chargeback from your bank if you paid by credit card.



A house perched impossibly on a cliff overlooking the stunning Bluebird Beach. Prime real estate, yet The Lodge is, like those who live in it, falling apart.







The War Nurses by Anthea Hodgson from Yealering

Inspiration comes in many forms, and for Anthea Hodgson it was photos of her Great Aunt with other brave Australian Army War Nurses looking down on her as she researched and wrote their incredible story.

The massacre of twenty one Australian Nurses by Japanese Soldiers during World War II on Bangka Island in now, Indonesia, is not a well known story but for Anthea and her family it is one they have grown up with.

Minnie Hodgson, who is listed at the top of the Yealering War Memorial, signed up as Australian Army Nurses to serve in Singapore 1941. One year later they had to quickly evacuate in a small cargo ship as the Japanese advanced to occupy Singapore.

The ship with the Nurses, their patients and civilians was bombed and sunk by the Japanese and the survivors made it to shore on Bangka Island where most were taken Prisoners of War. The Nurses who were waiting to surrender on Radji Beach were marched into the sea and brutally machine gunned down by Japanese Soldiers and Minnie was

one of them. Fortunately, one survived to tell the tale and this is the only reason the families know what happened to their daughters, sisters and aunts.

The War Nurses tells the shocking reality the remaining Nurses and civilians faced as Prisoners of War, the daily struggle to survive is so horrific you will want to believe it is fiction.

Anthea, who is from Yealering and grew up on the same farm as Minnie, felt a strong connection to this story and after the success of her first two books, The Drifter and The Cowgirl, she felt compelled to write a book to ensure this story was not forgotten. It is in a fictionalised form which means that Anthea can 'take you into their hearts' and 'walk in their shoes'. It is a story of friendship, love and incredible resilience told with such passion, brutality but respectful and incredible detail making it a very hard book to put down.

Anthea's research took her to The Australian War Memorial in Canberra, through many personal accounts, including books written by two of the Nurses who survived the Camps, School archives at Minnie's school in Perth and the WA Medical Museum.

It has been reviewed as "Moving and inspiring of enduring friendship and boundless courage" and has been in top 10 book lists soon after its launch in April.

In May, the Town of Cambridge renamed one of their parks Minnie Hodgson Park in honour of Minnie, a very proud occasion for the Hodgson family who attended.


Anthea has had speaking engagements around Australia, including radio interviews but none more important than speaking to a group of ex Yealeringites who joined with her family in Perth at Margaret, her mother's home, where

she proudly presented in her 1970's Lake Yealering T-shirt.

The photos of the Nurses in the book, including her Aunty Minnie's, are still on her office board looking down on her and there they will stay for a little longer yet.

Anthea will be speaking at the Facey Group's, Women in Agriculture Day and will have books for sale.

The Wickepin Playgroup is co-ordinating a picture plate project as a fundraiser for some new educational toys for our local small kids to enjoy.


