

Council received seven (7) submissions.

These submissions will be discussed by Council at the August Council Meeting before a decision in September.



### Could you be a future Shire Councillor?

Local Government ordinary elections are held on the third Saturday in October every two years. The next local government ordinary elections will be held on Saturday 21 October 2023.

As a Councillor you would be involved in running an organisation with the responsibility of making decisions that have a major impact on our lifestyle. As a representative of your community you will find the role enjoyable, challenging and stimulating with involvement in matters as diverse as recreation, the environment, town planning, health, roads and much more. Meeting fees, travel and IT expenses are paid.

Nominations open on 31 August to fill three (3) vacancies within the Shire of Wickepin.

Any person who is an Australian Citizen over the age of 18 years who is an elector of the district and is not disqualified under the Local Government Act 1995 may nominate for council.

Councillors are elected for terms of four years in Western Australia. Elections are held every two years for half of the council, and candidates are elected using operational preferential voting. If a vacancy occurs within a term, an extraordinary election is held.

Nominations close on 7 September 2023 and must be lodged with the Returning Officer at any time during the voting period at the offices of the Shire of Wickepin.

Full details about eligibility and nomination procedures for prospective candidates in the election for the Shire of Wickepin can be obtained by contacting the Shire Office.

On Monday 14 August 2023 from 6pm you can access a free webinar which will give you all the information you need to understand the role of being a local government councillor and how to become one.

During the webinar, you can also ask questions of representatives from the WAEC, WALGA and DLGSC.

The Minister for Local Government David Michael, a former local councillor, will open the webinar.

#### Speed Zone - Wickepin Townsite

#### **Bushfire Funding Recovery**


Estimated completion is 6 - 8 weeks (weather dependent).

### LOCAL GOVERNMENT ORDINARY ELECTION CLOSE OF ENROLMENTS Shire of Wickepin ROLL CLOSE: 5:00 PM Friday, 25 August 2023

You may be eligible to be enrolled to vote in the local government elections on 21 October 2023 if you live in or are an owner or occupier of rateable property in the Shire of Wickepin.

#### Residents

You are automatically enrolled to vote if you are on the State Electoral Roll as at 5:00 PM Friday, 25 August 2023. If you are not already on the State Electoral Roll and meet the eligibility criteria, or if you have changed address recently, you must complete an enrolment form.

#### **Enrolment Forms**

You can enrol or update your details online, or download an enrolment form, via the Western Australian Electoral Commission website (<a href="www.elections.wa.gov.au/enrol">www.elections.wa.gov.au/enrol</a>). Forms are also available from the Australian Electoral Commission (<a href="www.aec.gov.au">www.aec.gov.au</a>). Enrolments and updates must be completed and received by 5:00 PM Friday, 25 August 2023.

### Non-Resident Owners and Occupiers

If you are a non-resident owner or occupier of rateable property in the Shire of Wickepin and are on the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll, you are eligible to enrol to vote. If you are **not** on the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll and own or occupy rateable property in the Shire of Wickepin you may be eligible to enrol to vote. This applies if you were on the last electoral roll for the Shire of Wickepin prior to May 1996 and have owned or occupied rateable property in the district continuously since this time. Please contact your local government for details. Owners of land who were on the last Local Government roll continue to retain that status until they cease to own the rateable property to which the enrolment relates. Occupiers do not have continuous enrolment and should contact the Shire of Wickepin to confirm their enrolment status. To be eligible to enrol as an occupier, you will need to have a right of continuous occupation under a lease, tenancy agreement or other legal instrument for at least the next three months following the date of the application to enrol.

#### Joint Owners and Occupiers

If a rateable property is owned or occupied by more than two people, a majority of the owners/occupiers may nominate two persons from amongst themselves who are on either the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll, to enrol as owner/occupier electors.

#### Corporations

A body corporate that owns or occupies rateable property may nominate two people who are on either the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll to enrol as owner/occupier electors.

### **Enrolment Forms – Non-Resident Owners and Occupiers Only**

Enrolment forms can be obtained from local governments and must be lodged with the Chief Executive Officer by 5:00 PM Friday, 25 August 2023. Further information can be obtained from the Shire of Wickepin.


#### **School Voluntary Contributions Explanation**

#### To whom it may concern

On behalf of the Blazeaid teams, who came back to Wickepin, to complete the work on the farms that were affected by the fire in 2022, I would like to say thank you to the whole of the Wickepin community, who made us feel most welcome and supported us with all their donations, of food and their valuable time.

Each, and every member of our volunteers, were most appreciative of each donation. In our short time in your community, we were made to feel very much at home, so much so I, as the last coordinator of the camp, found it very hard to say goodbye, when we had finished our work here.

I arrived in late May, taking over the camp from the awesome team of Rhonda and Kevin. Jo and I [we both come from QLD], had travelled from a camp in Echuca in Victoria, to come and work here in Wickepin, where we both promptly came down with Covid, along with 9 other members of the crew. This reduced our number of volunteers dramatically, and although the camp numbers, never recovered to have the same number of Volunteers in the camp, those who did arrive, put in a fabulous effort, and we were able to finish as much we could. We also planted some salt bush and trees.


In the time we were here, we put in 388 hours in the field. [This does not include the hours that our volunteers, put in, in the kitchen, to keep our troops fed] We had 11 properties, that needed assistance and completed as much as we could, on all 11 properties, with the volunteers that were available.

We built nearly 20Km of fences, pulled down nearly 7Km of fences that were fire damaged and planted 20,300 saltbush and trees.

Once again, Wickepin, and all the Farmers in the Yilliminning area we would like to say we loved our time here, so thank you.

### Sensational citrus!!

### Orange and poppyseed cupcakes

### Ingredients:

125 grams butter, softened

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1 1/4 cups caster sugar

3 eggs

34 cup plain flour

34 cup self-raising flour

½ cup milk

2 teaspoons finely grated orange rind

¼ cup poppy seeds

1 medium orange



#### **Orange frosting:**

150 grams cream cheese, softened

75 grams butter, softened

2 cups icing sugar

2 teaspoons finely grated orange rind

#### Method:

Preheat oven to 180°C. Line a 12-hole (1/3-cup/80ml) muffin pan with paper cases.

Beat ingredients, except for the whole orange, in a medium bowl on low speed with an electric mixer until just combined. Increase speed to medium, beat until mixture is smooth and changed to a paler colour. Spoon mixture into cases.

Bake cakes for 25 minutes or until a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. Stand cakes in pan for 2 minutes before turning, top-side up, onto a wire rack to cool.

Make orange frosting. Beat cream cheese and butter in a small bowl with an electric mixer until smooth. Gradually beat in sifted icing sugar; stir in rind.

Peel large pieces of rind from orange, remove any white pith from rind. Cut rind into long, thin strips. Spread frosting onto cooled cakes; top with strips of rind and, if you like, sprinkle with extra poppy seeds.

### Lemon lime tart

#### Base

1 1/2 cups plain flour 1/4 cup self-raising flour pinch salt 1/2 cup icing sugar 100g butter 1 egg



### **Filling**

1/2 cup lemon juice (about 2 lemons) 1/4 cup lime juice (about 2 limes) 1 cup caster sugar 2/3 cup thickened cream 5 eggs, lightly beaten

#### Method:

Preheat the oven to 180°C (160°C fan-forced). Grease a 25cm fluted loose-based flan tin.

To make the base, place flours, salt, icing sugar and butter into a food processor. Process in short bursts until it looks like breadcrumbs. Add egg and process again until the dough comes together in a ball. Turn out onto a board. If the dough seems very dry and crumbly, add a teaspoon of cold water and briefly knead it in. Wrap in plastic wrap and refrigerate for 15 minutes.

Roll pastry out to about 5mm thick. As the pastry is very short, you will need to tear pieces from the pastry and, bit by bit, cover the base and sides of the flan tin. Press the edges of the pastry pieces together, taking care to keep it the same thickness throughout. Put a sheet of baking paper into flan tin and fill with baking weights or rice. Bake 10 minutes, then remove baking paper and weights and bake for a further 10 minutes, or until lightly golden brown. In a bowl, combine juices, sugar and cream. Whisk in beaten eggs a bit at a time until they are mixed in. Pour mixture into pastry case and bake 25 minutes or until set. Serve at room temperature or refrigerate until needed and serve chilled.





### Adult Fiction: Over My Dead Body - Jeffrey Archer


In London, the Metropolitan Police set up a new Unsolved Murders Unit to catch criminals nobody else can.

In Geneva, art collector Miles Faulkner died two months ago. Why is his unscrupulous lawyer still representing a dead client?


On a luxury liner enroute to New York, the battle for power within a wealthy dynasty is about to turn to murder.

### In a Nutshell....

Plants for Free can be done at any time of the year, depending on the cutting you are working with.

In a Nutshell, it's not that hard to do.

- 10. Water your "Mother" plant the day before if possible
- 11. Select strong, disease-free stems and each cutting should be long enough to have one "Node" above the ground and at least one, preferably more, "Nodes" below the ground when potted. (A "Node" is the growing point from where leaves and shoots originate)
- 12. Trim the top of the cutting to "just above a node" and trim the base to "just below a node".
- 13. Gently strip the cutting of leaves from lower half, and if the top leaves are large, then cut them in half to prevent moisture loss and force energy to the bottom to form shoots.
- 14. Dunk cuttings in a very weak solution of vinegar or bleach for 10-20 minutes before planting to kill fungal spores and reduce infections.
- 15. Dip base in honey or hormone powder to encourage faster root development.
- 16. Plant in pot with potting mix, using a stick to make a hole, thus preventing wounds (and infections) to the cutting by just "pushing" it in.
- 17. Water in and cover with plastic bag, or a plastic water bottle with the neck cut off. This prevents drying out whilst the roots develop.
- 18. Watering should not be needed as long as mix stays "just moist". New growth should appear from 4-8 weeks (some take longer), when you can open the bag to reduce humidity and "harden off" your new plant, ready for Potting On into a bigger pot, or into your garden.
