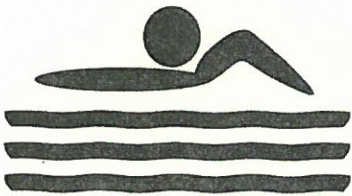

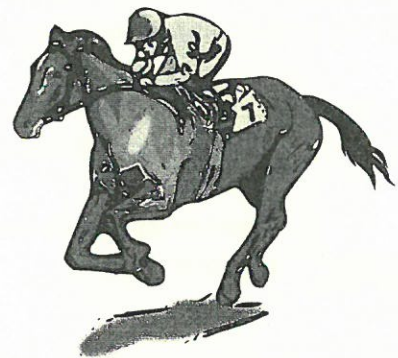

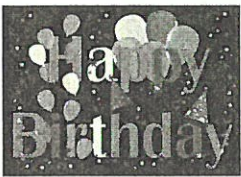

Everyone in the one place at the same time was a great opportunity for some family pictures to be taken.

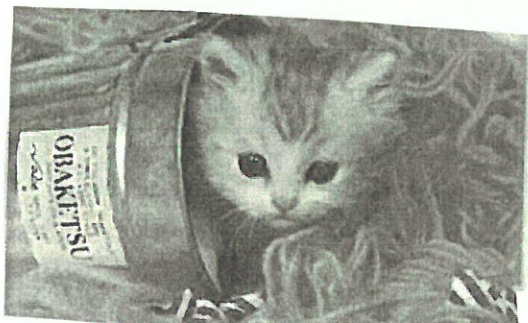
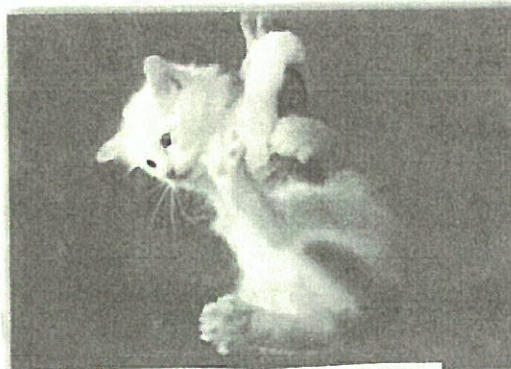

Greg, Philippa and Lucas would like to thank everyone for their love, kind thoughts and best wishes while Lucas has been undergoing treatment for t-cell acute lymphoblastic leukaemia. It has been just over 12 months since Lucas' diagnosis and he has now completed the most intensive phases of his treatment. The doctors at PMH have told us he is doing as well as can be expected for this stage of his treatment, but there remains a long journey ahead, with treatment ongoing until January 2019.

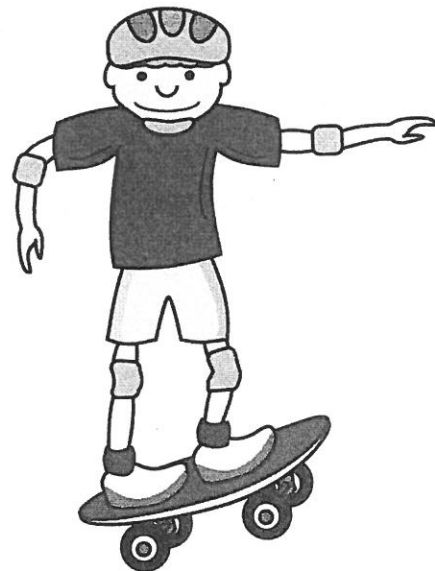

Drifting to Yealering

There was a homecoming of sorts at Yealering Hall on Thursday the 29th of September, as ex-local Anthea Hodgson officially launched her debut novel *The Drifter* in her home town.

A happy gathering of around 60 people from near and far heard excerpts from the story, bought a signed copy and had a celebratory champagne. Unfortunately due to excellent sales throughout WA there was a shortage of books but the orders will be on their way soon.

The Drifter tells the tale of Cate Christie, a party girl who comes to stay at her sweet old Aunt Ida's farm in Windstorm (the fictional town based on Yealering). Cate is escaping her Perth life where she was involved in a fatal car accident. She discovers a gorgeous and mysterious swagman named Henry, living in the old mudbrick house on the farm and so begins a slow burn romance. Despite being a rural romance book, the story captures the warmth of the community and rural life in the Wickepin Shire.

Locals will recognise references to Yealering lake, some locals' names and towns including Wickepin and Bullaring. Tissues are a must, even the description of the novel being an optimistic look at death can't prepare you for the beauty of the sadness.

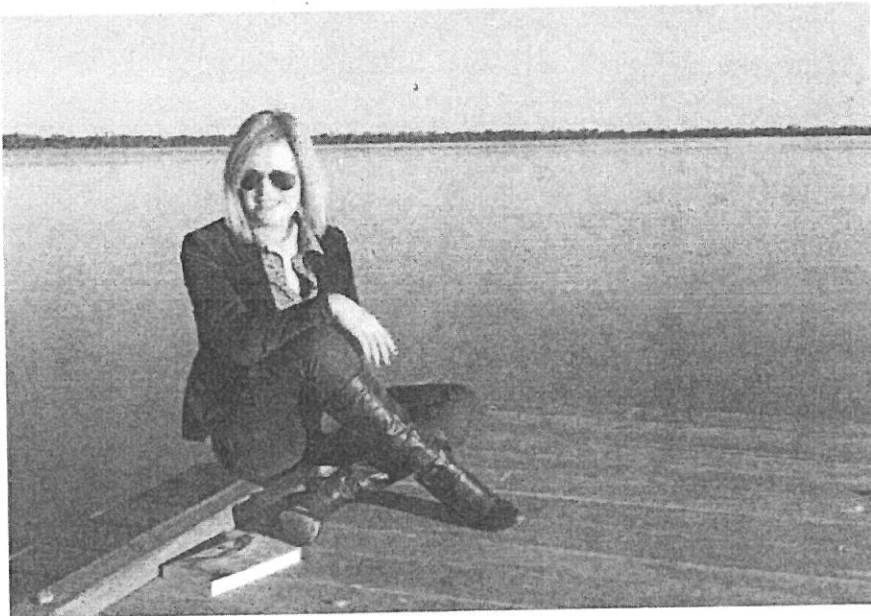

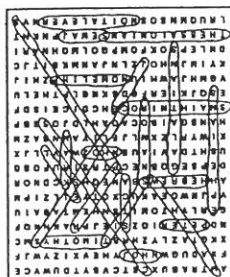

- If you rent your property, the property owner or landlord must agree to the replacement of the showerheads.

Having attended many a garden day at other towns, the people of the Wickepin Shire can be very proud of the way their towns are seen by the 'person who drives through'. This is not only due to the Shire gardeners who do a marvellous job but also the residents, schools and businesses.

The inclusion of art and a path through it makes this garden very interesting and definitely one I wanted to stop and wander through. I look forward to seeing it evolve as it grows.

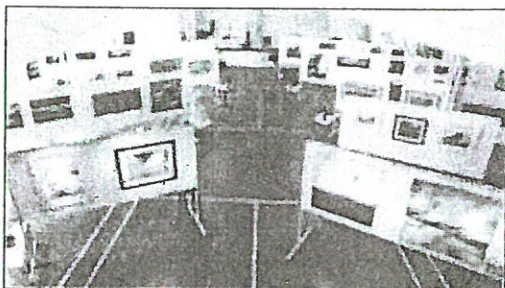
Best Kept Street – Wogolin Road Wickepin

Feast on Art long table lunch was enjoyed by around 50 people on Sunday.

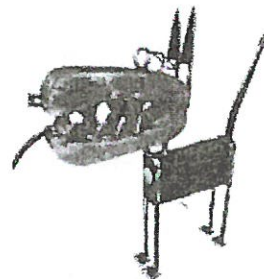
An Arthur Russell exhibition was held in the front room of the Wickepin Town Hall – which drew big crowds from the region and beyond.

IN THE KITCHEN

CRUNCHY TUNA SANDWICH

Ingredients

- ▲ 425g can tuna in springwater, drained
- ▲ 2 sticks celery, diced
- ▲ 1 spring onion, trimmed, chopped (including green tops)
- ▲ ½ teaspoon lemon pepper (optional)
- ▲ 2 tablespoons low-fat mayonnaise
- ▲ 8 slices wholegrain bread
- ▲ 4 Cos lettuce leaves
- ▲ Pepper, to taste

Method

Place tuna in a medium sized bowl and break up the large pieces with a fork. Stir the celery, spring onion and lemon pepper (optional) through the tuna, then add the mayonnaise and mix well to combine. Spread 4 slices of bread with ¼ of the tuna mixture each.

Season with pepper then top each with a lettuce leaf and the remaining slices of bread then cut the sandwich in half.

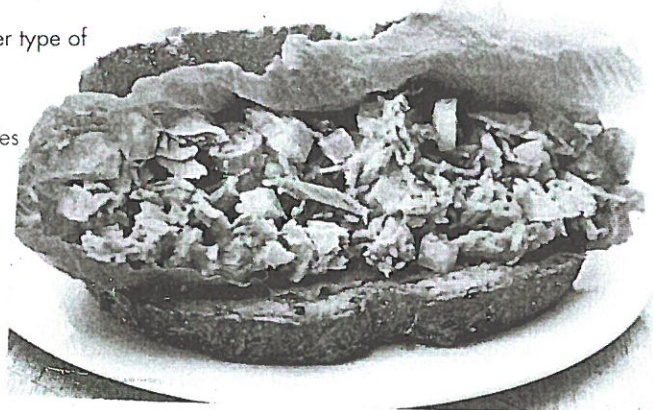
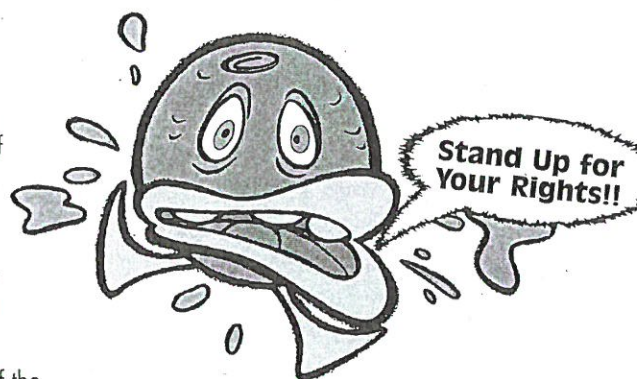
Add 1 tablespoon of grated reduced-fat cheese to each sandwich and toast in a sandwich maker until crisp and brown.

Add a squeeze of lemon juice instead of the lemon pepper for extra flavour.

Replace Cos lettuce with any other type of lettuce or salad leaves.

Preparation time: 10 minutes

Serves: 4



Banoffee pie

Serves 8

crust

- ◆ 280 grams Marie or digestive biscuits
 - ◆ 150 grams butter, melted
- ### toffee sauce
- ◆ ½ cup (packed) dark brown sugar

- ◆ One 395-gram can sweetened condensed milk

- ◆ 125 grams butter

filling

- ◆ 1¼ cups cream
- ◆ 5 small ripe bananas (about 750 grams total)

1. To make the crust: Line the bottom of a 22–23cm springform pan with baking paper. Chop the biscuits in a food processor until they are finely ground. Pour the melted butter over the crumbs and process to blend well. The crumbs should stick together when pressed. Press the crumb mixture over the bottom and 3½cm up the sides of the springform pan. Refrigerate.

2. To make the toffee sauce: Combine the brown sugar and 2 tablespoons water in a medium-size heavy saucepan. Stir over medium heat until the sugar dissolves. Raise the heat and boil without stirring, occasionally swirling the pan and brushing down the sides with a pastry brush dipped into water, until the syrup is a deep amber colour, about 5 minutes. Stir in the condensed milk and butter. Continue stirring for 5 minutes or until the sauce thickens slightly.

3. Remove the toffee sauce from the heat and spread 1 cup of the sauce over the prepared crust. Refrigerate for about 1 hour or until the toffee is semi-firm. Keep the remaining toffee sauce at room temperature.

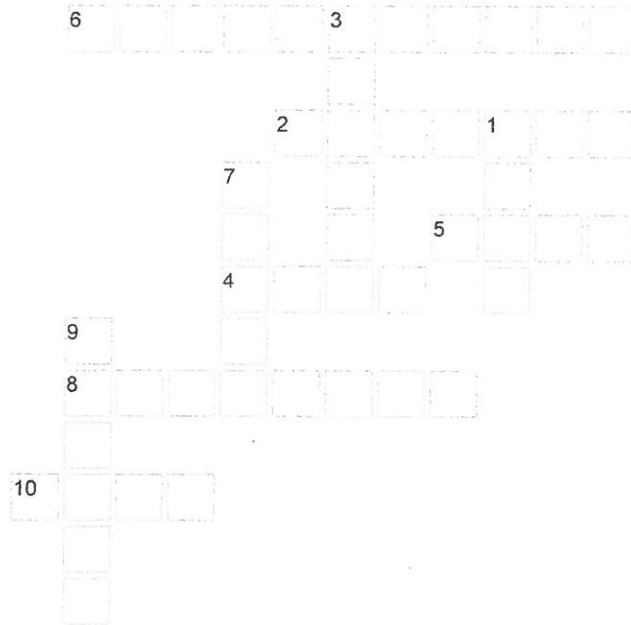
4. To fill the pie: Using an electric mixer, beat the cream in a large bowl until thick and very soft billowy peaks form. Slice 3 of the bananas into very thin disks. Fold the sliced bananas into the softly whipped cream, and spoon the filling into the prepared pie crust.

5. Slice the remaining 2 bananas, and arrange the slices decoratively across the pie. Rewarm the remaining toffee sauce gently on low heat. Drizzle some of the sauce decoratively over the pie. (If the sauce has thickened too much to drizzle, stir a few tablespoons of milk into it.) Cut the pie into wedges, and transfer them to plates. Drizzle each pie wedge with more sauce, and serve.

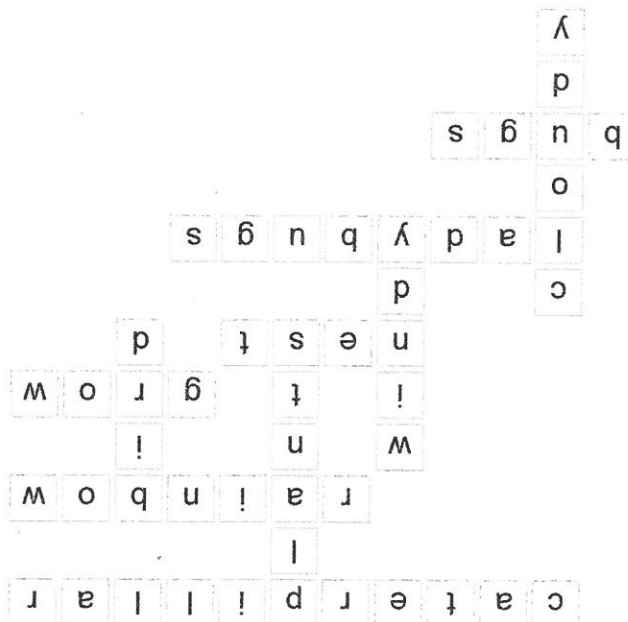

Sunsmart School



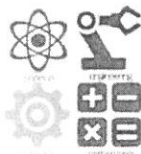

Digital Technologies



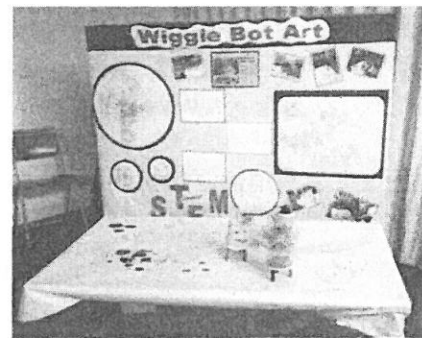
Last week we received our long awaited Digital Technologies Kit from the Department of Education that will assist and support our teachers with the implementation of the Western Australian Curriculum: Digital Technologies curriculum.

The content of the kits represent a world class standard of classroom resourcing for STEM education, in particular coding. The resources support early childhood learning as well as learning in the middle and upper primary years. The kits encourage pattern

matching, collaboration and problem solving. They include simple programmable base robots which can be extended with common items such as building blocks, through to code-driven robots, controlled using student-developed code. The kits are designed to connect theoretical coding with real life applications. We are very excited to play with our new toys with teachers beginning to familiarise and trial these new products in classrooms later this term.

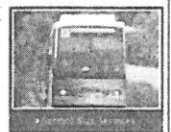
Wickepin Art Prize Weekend
