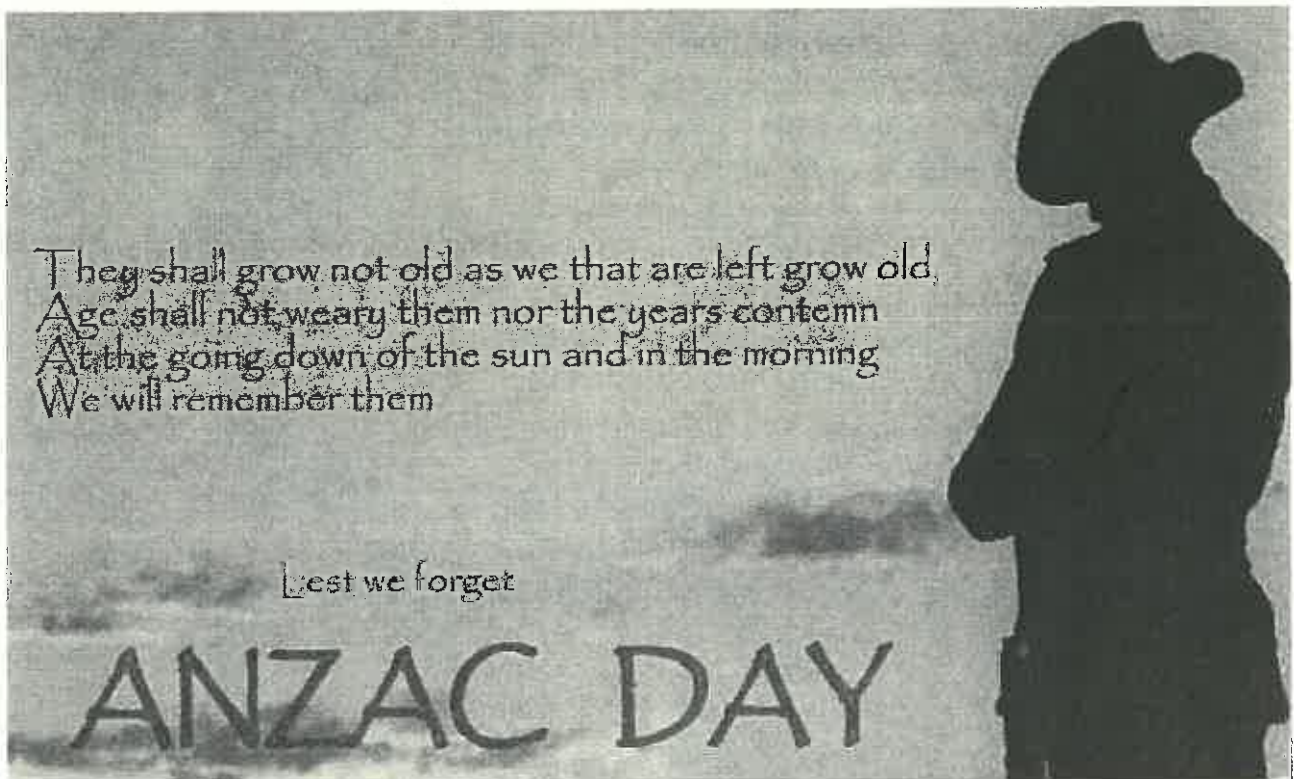

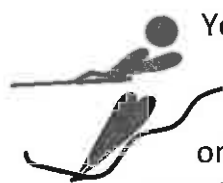

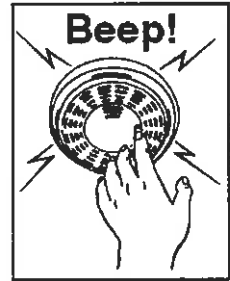

DON'T FORGET TO TEST YOUR SMOKE ALARMS THIS MONTH!

It is not enough to have a smoke alarm, they need to be tested and cleaned regularly and replaced after ten years.

Research has shown that the majority of people have smoke alarms installed but most do not realise that they need to clean and maintain their smoke alarms regularly. Last year there were 670 accidental or cause unknown house fires in WA and a number of people suffered serious injuries, with one death.

DFES recommends installing smoke alarms in all bedrooms, living areas and along the path to an exit. If you do not have a smoke alarm or are upgrading, DFES recommends installing mains powered photo electric smoke alarms.

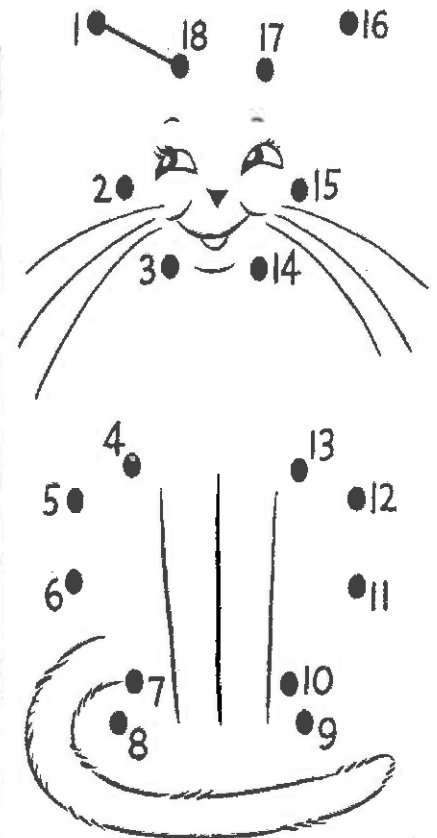
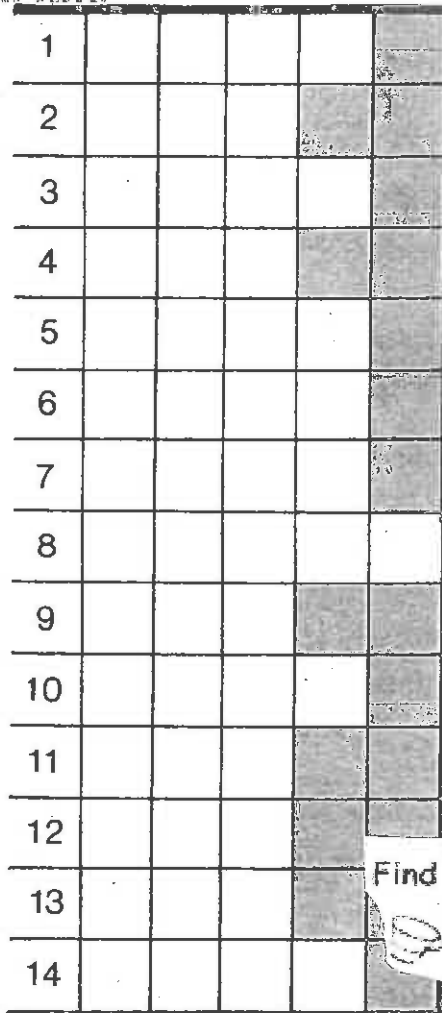

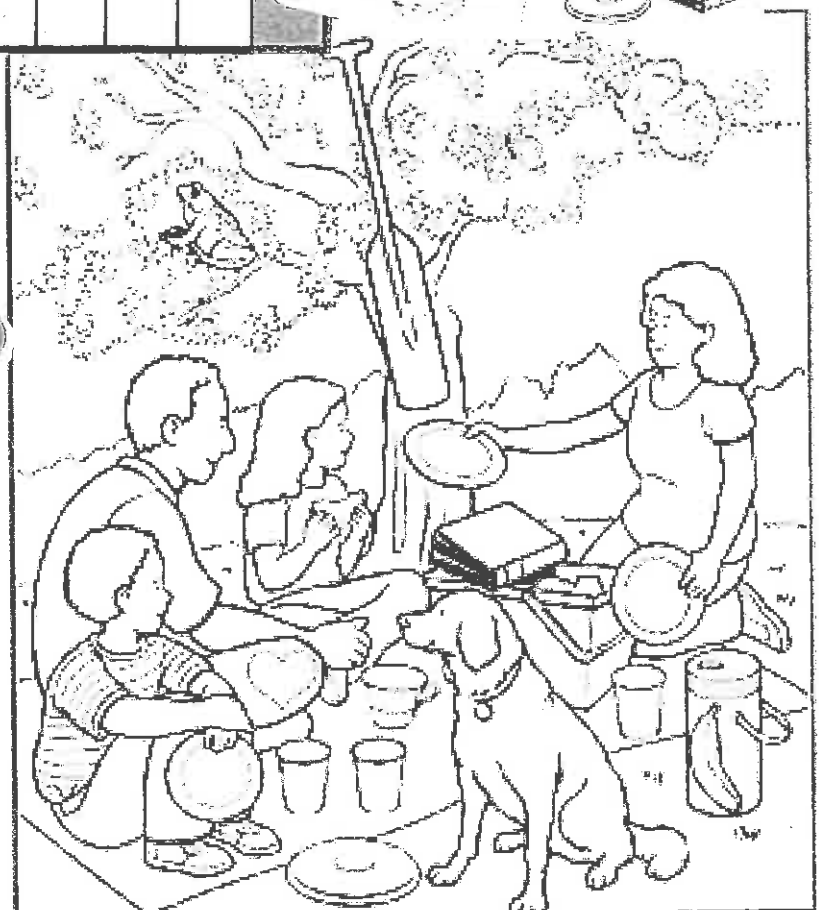

IN THE KITCHEN

Hoisin chicken stir-fry

500g chicken thigh fillets, fat trimmed
 1 tbs vegetable oil
 4 green shallots, cut into 4cm lengths
 1 yellow capsicum, chopped
 1 bunch broccolini, chopped
 225g can sliced bamboo shoots, drained
 ½ cup hoisin sauce
 2 tbs water
 1 tbs toasted sesame seeds

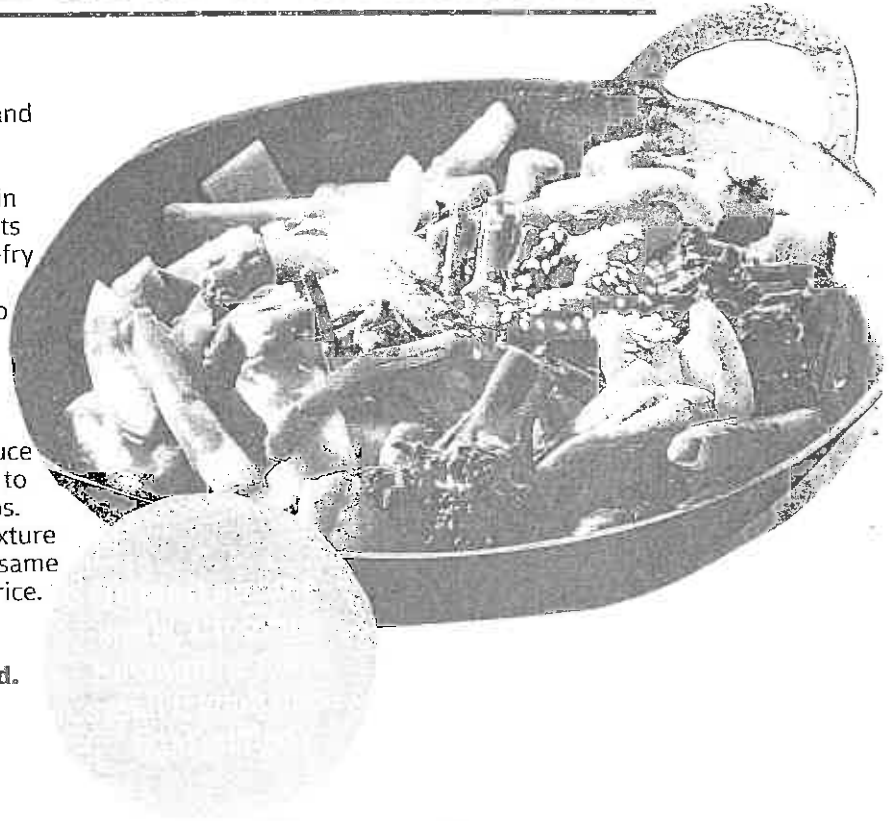
1 Cut chicken into strips. Heat half the oil in a wok or large frypan, add the chicken strips in batches and stir-fry until

they're well browned and just cooked through. Remove from wok.

2 Heat remaining oil in the wok, add shallots and capsicum and stir-fry for 1-2 minutes. Add broccolini and bamboo shoots, stir-fry for a further 1-2 minutes until vegetables are just tender.

3 Combine hoisin sauce and water and add to wok with chicken strips. Stir over heat until mixture boils. Sprinkle with sesame seeds and serve with rice.

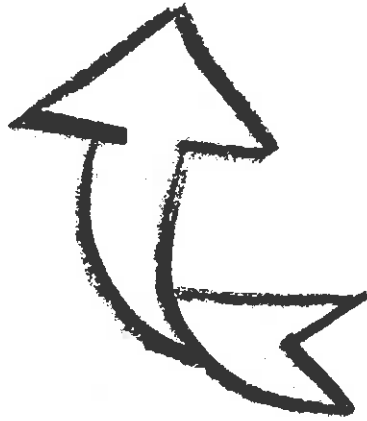
Prepare 250g of rice stick noodles according to packet directions. Rinse under cool water, set aside. Heat a little oil in a wok over high heat. Add 4 cloves crushed garlic and stir-fry 30 sec. Add 500g extra lean pork mince and stir, breaking up lumps, until browned. Add 6 sliced spring/green onions, ¾ cup honey & soy marinade and sauce and all the noodles. Toss for 2 min or until heated through. Top with chopped coriander and sliced red chilli. Drizzle with a little sesame oil if desired.

Darlene's tips

- ✓ Stir-fry vegies, add cooked soba noodles and a splash of soy sauce. Serve with sliced chilli if you like.
- ✓ Leftover noodles are perfect made into fresh spring rolls.
- ✓ Try a simple laksa with Singapore noodles, curry paste, coconut cream and vegies.
- ✓ For an easy noodle salad, combine leftover chicken, cooked vermicelli noodles, sliced cucumbers and carrots, mint leaves and splash of fish sauce.

Wickepin, home to Albert Facey and his 'Fortunate Life' Homestead, has more than just literature and wild-flowers to recommend it. A surprising number of talented artists and sculptors live within our shire boundaries. Fine Artists to Found Object Sculptors and most things in-between can be seen at the **Wickepin Town Hall** over the Mother's day weekend. Mesha Hall will be there as will Caroline Coate, Helen Warrilow and the She Shed He Shed sculpture display. Prema Sexton Photography, succulent art by Selina's Garden, wire jewellery-making demonstrations by Silvery Moon, floral art and food-to-go (or eat there) by Christine Hill Food will also be thrown into the mix. Saturday will be bustling with **Community Markets**.

An exciting new exhibition will be held at the heritage house '**Millbrook**' on the Albany Highway in the centre of Williams. Textile artist Bobbie Bates instigated 'Dare to Wear' which features the creations of more than 20 textile artists, each having been challenged to make a wearable art piece.

Whichever way you are travelling between Williams and Narrogin make sure you take the brief diversion to visit **Downderry Wines** This year the featured artist is Narrogin-based Michael Beckwith.

The **Town Hall Complex in Narrogin** will be buzzing with art, produce and wine in the main hall while an exhibition of work by the award winning artist Kirsten Sivyer will be in the **NEXIS Gallery**.

Catering in the Town Hall will be in the capable hands of The Quirky Cake Queen.

A new and unusual venue in Narrogin is the **Gnarrogin Community Garden** where 2D and 3D art will be found in the surrounds of the thriving vegetable beds. The café will be open and there will be plants and vegetables for sale along with activities for children of all ages.

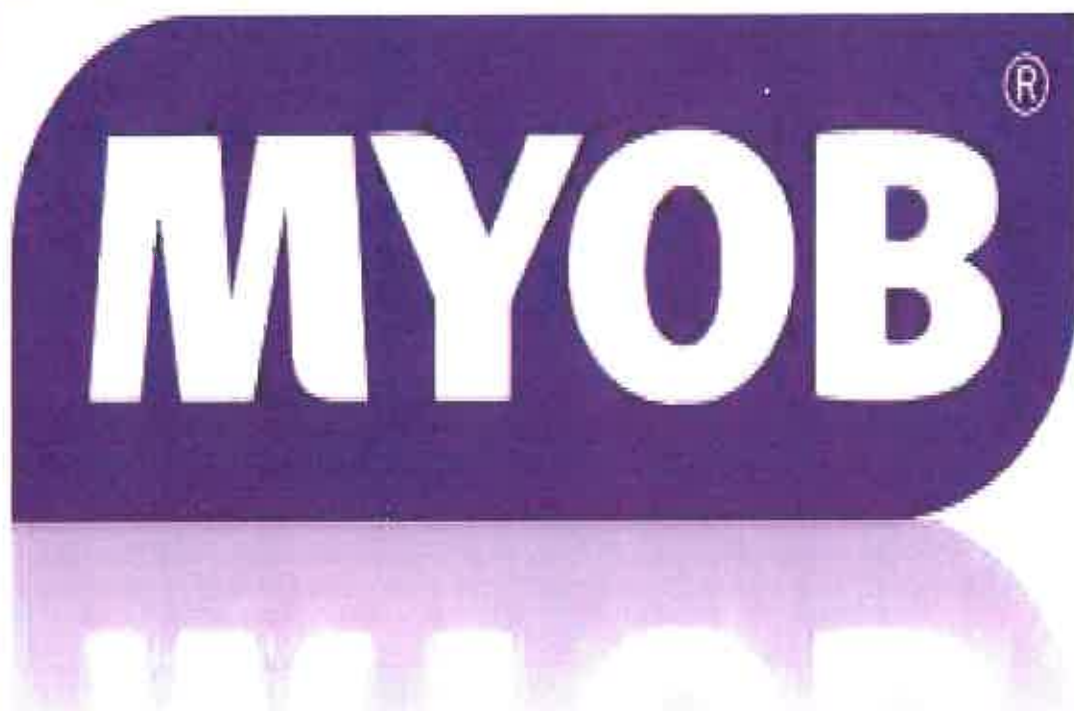

The Spirit of Gallipoli - by Patrick Lindsay ~ Patrick writes for those who would never wade through a full-fledged history book but who want to understand the remarkable spirit that emerged from a doomed campaign. He digs deep into the bedrock of the Australian character and examines the spirit that sets Australians apart and enables them to so often fight above their weight on the international stage.

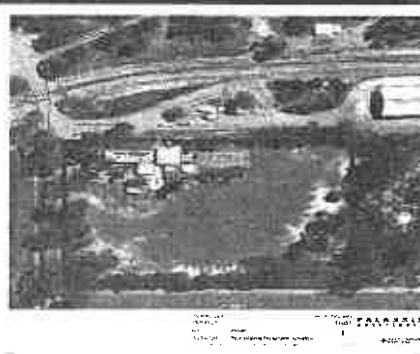
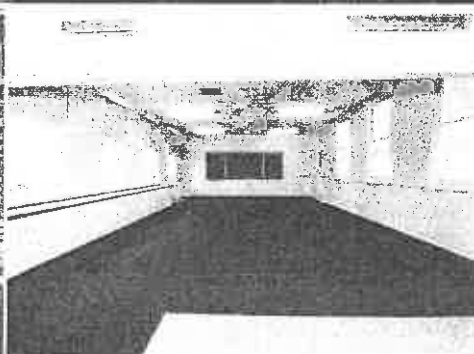

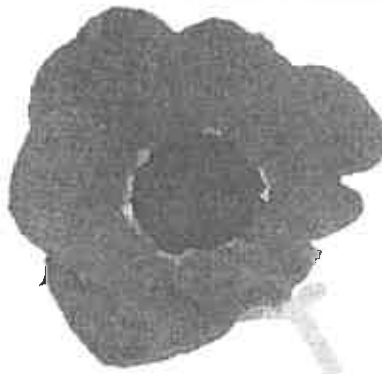


In Flanders Fields John McCrae

In Flanders fields.



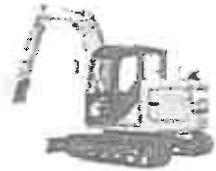
