

### KEITH BUSHBY'S TRIP TO CAPE YORK

Accompanying me in my Land Cruiser Ute was grandson Jamie Eggers and in a separate vehicle, grandson Morgan with his partner, Tara.

We had light rain all the way across and to Queensland. It was very cold at nights.

We left from Esperance lunchtime on Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> July. The first night we stopped at Balladonia, onto the border, Ceduna, Port Augusta, Peterborough. At Peterborough we went out to Magnetic Hill. Jamie can vouch that it truly works. i.e. Engine switched off at bottom of hill and vehicle travels uphill on its own. All of SA is very dry and short of water. We went to Canberra to visit Elaine's sister, but she wasn't home, but took in the sights including parliament house and the war memorial. This was Jamie's first visit out of the state and Morgan had been to Victoria once to purchase a car.

We headed for Brisbane then out of Brisbane we visited Australia Zoo then afterwards we drove through the Daintree Forest. We then carried on to Smithfield. We kept on driving around this area until we got to Cooktown. From Port Douglas to Cooktown we followed the coast.

After Cooktown we got to Archer River where the fuel was \$2.00litre, onto some very poor roads with 2ft corrugations. Every 25kms of dirt there was about 10kms of bitumen until we got to Cohen. We went up the Bamaga road to Bamaga where we had to do 34kms of really rough dirt again to get to the point, then we had to walk the last 3kms. We elected to walk up on the water side and when we got to the tip and had our photos taken, people said to come back across the top of the rock. We did this and thank goodness I had taken my walking stick. There were dozens of people there.

We stayed 2 days at Loyalty Beach. The others went for a 1 hour helicopter ride and saw a 15 metre croc. The Jardine ferry was \$150 to cross the ferry two ways and to camp up there. We came down through Mareeba to Ravenshoe – we couldn't get a spot at the park because the park has warm water running out of the ground, on to Garnet and that was all bitumen then. Some of it not so good. Through to Croydon on the Savannah Way to Normanton, heading south to the Burke &Wills roadhouse, on to Cloncurry and on the Barkley highway to Mt Isa. At Mt Isa we did a mine tour, fuelled up then headed off to Camooweal roadhouse then carried on to the Barkley homestead for the night. I have been to the Barkley Homestead caravan park several times, usually only half full but this time it was packed out.

On to Alice Springs where we stopped for another 2 nights and over half a day was spent at the truck museum. Fuelled up and early to bed. Went down through Marla and Coober Pedy, stayed a night at Coober Pedy, checked out 3 sites where they live underground. The boys and Tara slept in an underground motel but I chose to stay at the caravan park. The next day we got back up to Eridunda where we stayed the night, then on to Ayres Rock. The boys and Tara had a go at walking around the rock – I stayed at the camp site. Next morning we headed off – got to Warburton where the diesel was \$2.06. Next night we got to Leonora but couldn't get in at the park so had a unit instead. In the morning we checked out Gwalia where they are mining again and the hole is 3 times bigger than it used to be. On to Kalgoorlie, called in to Kookynie where Niagara dam is less than half full. Some light rain here and back to cold again.

Got back to Kalgoorlie and checked the super pit where Morgan and Tara headed off to Esperance – Jamie and I headed west. Turned south at Merredin, bought some fuel and had a meal at Narembeen and drove through to Lake Grace where I deposited Jamie then headed off for home where I arrived about 9.30pm.

Jamie slept in the back of the Land Cruiser ute and I had our off-road camper. Morgan had a cruiser wagon and a tent on the roof.

We didn't drive through much water - the deepest was about 2ft. Mileage travelled - 15,120kms in 5 weeks. Fuel used - \$2695.00.



### Securing a world of food...a flying trip to Canberra Sarah Hyde, Facey Group

The greatest challenges we face are those that we sometimes are not sure to take ourselves; but influenced and encouraged from our peers. Until a few months ago I personally had not understood what the Crawford Fund was, let alone what it did or the opportunities it could provide.

After being selected to represent W.A as a scholar and embark on a 2 day conference in Canberra with such amazing people, I wish that I had been informed of this great organization, and the work they do a decade ago when I was leaving university.

In saying that I am challenging myself, to ensure that I can get the message out to the next generation and expose them to the amazing opportunities that they can embark on in agriculture all over the world. I am not a scientist, but have been involved in research over my career. I have always been passionate in connecting people and in my career have invested much of my passion to on ground delivery of information and research to ensure farmers are getting the answers and issues they need addressed, to ensure continued growth and sustainability in feeding the world.

The Crawford Fund gave me the most amazing experience in meeting so many people from within Australia and throughout the globe, working in agriculture and of the same passion for feeding the world and remaining sustainable. The scholarship allowed for me to expand horizons and contacts in which I would not have traditionally come across in my day to day work; and I am hugely thankful for the opportunity.

Whilst I have worked in agriculture for close to 8 years, I must admit that my thought pattern had never previously expanded far from the farm gate, and the provisions for being successful were to produce more and ensure that markets were accessible. The Crawford Fund really opened my eyes to the need for looking further, globally and with more of a focus on actually feeding the world 'nutritionally' not just by quantity.

I am hugely excited to transfer this knowledge and inspiration onto the next generation and for those who are still working within the agricultural industry or would like to enter into it. There are so many experiences all over the world and through many different facets, and I encourage you all to ask the question and challenge yourself to do something for the industry that we all work in each and every day.

Whilst research is critical, the follow on from this is to ensure that it is adopted and that the extension is completed correctly for all involved to benefit. I am challenging myself moving forward to embark on opportunities to disseminate information from research not only locally but internationally and hope that grower groups can provide a key link to the delivery of programs and assist in the evaluation of adoption on a great scale; with experience in peer to peer learning and specialized programs.

I am very thankful to the fund for this support, I look forward to many opportunities moving forward and for the extension of knowledge of such a wonderful industry that feeds us all every day. There are many opportunities that we can embark on internationally and we sometimes don't realise how great we have it here in Australia and the advancements that we have in agriculture.

I am hugely thankful for the opportunity to travel to Canberra for this conference and have made some great connections that I hope that we can integrate with the Facey Group and the wider agricultural industry right here on our doorstep.

The Crawford Fund is a non-profit, non-row convent organisation that works to raise awareness of the benefits to Australia and developing countries from international agricultural research, commissions studies on research policy and practice, and arranges specialist training activities for all relicing country scientists.

Holding these workshops has increased our membership with interest coming from Kulin, Williams, Cuballing, Narrogin, Tincurrin and Yealering.

One of our new members, Laurie has miraculously resurrected our wood lathe and is now whipping it into submission with pieces of timber being transformed into

recognisable shapes.

Speaking of lathes, 'Phil the Lathe Whisperer' has now repaired the metal lathe and it is ready for action. We have been very pleased to have our apprentice Phil back with us and tackling the Case tractor again under the watchful eye of his mentor, Peter. It is certainly being a challenge for them with a lot of head shaking and chin scratching.

The Shed has had a major upgrade of power and new benches which makes our work space much improved. The Shedders are nothing if not diverse in their talents and skills. We still have plans for more improvements which we hope may happen soon.



New acquisitions now mean we have extended our wood working gear to include saws



and thicknesser/planers which means the possibilities are endless. Plans are afoot to make birdhouses to encourage some of the unusual species.

#### WHEATBELT FARMER INNOVATION TO REDUCE MACHINERY DOWNTIME

The Turner family of Wickepin are pleased to announce the release and pre-order availability of their Hosepatch hydraulic hose repair kit. Business owners Chris and Ricki Turner came up with the innovative idea from the vital need for farmers and industry to keep moving and reduce downtime. Chris stated, "many farmers and industrial operators express how frustrating it is being in a rural or remote area and the wait for hydraulic hose repairs in peak times, especially on weekends, where a machine can be down for days affecting businesses bottom line".

The Hosepatch can be used as temporary fix as either a low-pressure clamp, to move machinery back to the shed, or as a joiner to continue operation until a replacement hose can be acquired. Chris said that the Hosepatch has "can be used for hose pressure up to 6000psi, when used as a joiner". The innovation will allow farmers and industry to continue operations when faced with

downtime due to hydraulic hose issues.

The mechanically minded fourth generation farmers, who recently have welcomed the fifth generation in, also operate their clover rolling and spray-painting business around their farming operations. Hosepatch are currently taking pre-orders for September delivery, though interested customers are urged to get their orders in quickly as Chris said "we have been inundated with order requests since the release in mid-July. Word of mouth seems to have snowballed, and we are very impressed with peoples comments on the simplicity and ingenuity of the design. We aimed to make the design as basic as possible so growers could use their tools on hand to apply the patch, it's that basic even my 4 year old knows how it all goes together".

The Hosepatch kit contains 1/4", 3/8", 1/2", 3/4" and 1" clamps and joining barbs and is priced at \$550 GST inclusive. Individual sizes are also available, as well as replacement hydraulic hoses made to order. They can also supply quick release couplings and crimp tail fittings. The Hosepatch is designed to be re-useable, once a replacement hose is obtained, clean the clamps

and joining barb and place back in the kit for the next use.



#### **PLATES ON HOLD**

The Department of Transport has requested Council to ascertain the current status of held plates at the Shire as some have been on hold for a period exceeding 6 months.

If you have WK plates on hold (never been on a vehicle) can you please advise the Shire Office if you still require these plates, or they will be returned to the public stock.

#### **VENUE HIRE INFORMATION**

When hiring any of the Shire of Wickepin buildings; community and sporting groups are exempt from paying bonds but will incur a cost if anything is damaged or broken.

For corporate or private function use of the Shire of Wickepin buildings; bonds will need to be paid at time of booking. An application form should be completed also. Bonds can be paid by cash, card or cheque. When refunding bonds, the Shire of Wickepin can only refund by EFT or cheque.

All keys are to be returned to the Shire of Wickepin at the end the end of each season or function. Failing to do so will incur a replacement cost.

#### LICENSING YOUR TRACTOR OR SELF PROPELLED HEADER

So you've bought a tractor and need to licence it. There are a few details and documents required to complete your licensing request.

You will need to bring in your proof of ownership such as a detailed receipt. You will also need the details of your machine *including weight and width* to be able to process your application.

All the details required can be found on the Application for Agricultural Machinery Form VL18. Forms are available at the Shire Office or on the Department of Transport website. http://www.transport.wa.qov.au/licensing/licensing-resources.asp

These forms are considered a statutory declaration and your signature needs to be witnessed by a person such as the CEO, Police Officer or Post Office Manager.

#### **LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTION NOMINATIONS 2017**

Local government nominations will open on Thursday 7 September 2017 and will close on Thursday 14 September 2017 at 4.00pm.

Nominations must be lodged with the Returning Officer, Mark Hook, at any time during the above period at the offices of the Shire of Wickepin, 77 Wogolin Road, Wickepin.

The Returning Officer, Mark Hook, will have the nomination form as well as other relevant information for candidates. In order to nominate a person must:

- Complete the nomination form available from the Shire of Wickepin office
- Complete a Candidate's Profile
- Pay the deposit fee of \$80 where the Returning Officer is able to ensure that the amount is credited to the Council before nominations close; and
- Ensure that the nomination has been properly authorised by the candidate where it has been lodged by an agent on behalf on the candidate.

The documentation can be lodged by hand, post, fax or electronic means so long as it is printed in hard copy by the Returning Officer prior to the close of nominations and the deposit fee is received as cleared funds by that time.

Any person may nominate for council who is on the local government electoral roll. Or any person who has had their claim for enrolment as an elector on the local government, State and Commonwealth Government rolls, accepted prior to nominating unless he or she is a nominee of a body corporate owner or occupier or is otherwise disqualified.







# IN THE KITCHEN

### Vanilla & Lemon Panna Cotta with Raspberry Sauce

#### Serves 6

900 mi/1½ pints/3¾ cups double cream
1 vanilla pod, split
100 g/3½ oz/½ cup caster/superfine sugar
zest of 1 lemon
3 sheets gelatine
5 tbsp milk
450 g/1 lb/3 cups raspberries
3—4 tbsp icing/confectioners' sugar, to taste
1 tbsp iemon juice
extra iemon zest, to decorate




- 1 Put the cream, vanilla pod and sugar into a saucepan. Bring to the boil, then simmer for 10 minutes until slightly reduced, stirring to prevent scalding. Remove from the heat, stir in the lemon zest and remove the vanilla pod.
- 2 Soak the gelatine in the milk for 5 minutes, or until softened. Squeeze out any excess milk and add to the hot cream. Stir well until dissolved.
- 3 Pour the cream mixture into six ramekins or mini pudding moulds and leave in the refrigerator for 4 hours, or until set.
- 4 Meanwhile, put 175 g/6 oz/1/½ cups of the raspberries in a food processor with the icing/confectioners' sugar and lemon juice. Blend to a purée then pass the mixture through a sieve. Fold in the remaining raspberries with a metal spoon or rubber spatula and chill in the refrigerator until ready to serve.
- 5 To serve, dip each of the moulds into hot water for a few seconds, then turn out on to six individual serving plates. Spoon some of the raspberry sauce over and around the panna cotta, decorate with extra lemon zest and serve.



Injury Matters is taking their flagship program Stay On Your Feet® to the Wheatbelt to launch their Build Your Balance campaign aimed at keeping older adults healthy and independent by preventing falls.

The Stay On Your Feet® Build Your Balance campaign launch will demonstrate tips to help maintain and improve balance in older adults, which is essential for everyday tasks including walking, getting out of a chair and shopping. "We want people to know that falls are preventable, and that by improving your balance and leg strength, and removing trip hazards from your home, people can prevent falls and stay independent."

"1 in 3 people over 65 will fall each year, but falls don't have to be a part of getting older"

Stay Active volunteer leader, 80 year old Lindsay Rowley from Narrogin, said he enjoyed leading the fitness classes and had clocked up about 13 years' service. He started out accompanying his wife, and later learnt to be an instructor.

"It keeps me active physically, as well as mentally, because I'm always learning new movements and meeting people. I know that helps me stay independent and healthy,"

"We include a lot of balance exercises in our classes, and we often have 40 people take part. The oldest amongst us is 88 years old,"
