140 Years of Saving Lives In 1877, St John Ambulance (founded by the Oder of St John) started training the public in first-aid techniques and provided equipped ambulances in the UK. Ten years later, it became a voluntary organisation offering free medical care. During that year, on 20 June, 50 volunteers carried

out its first official public duty, attending Queen Victoria's Golden Jubilee. Fast forward 21 years to 1908, and they rolled out for the London Olympics, beginning the tradition of being on duty for major sporting events. They're always at Wimbledon - fitting, since the tennis tournament and the charity were both launched in the very same month, July, in 1877 - 71 years before the formation of the NHS in 1948.

Since then St John Ambulance (SJA) volunteers have dealt with everything from bombs (they were out in force during both World Wars and more recently, in the after math of the terror attacks. It was long before that, around 1070, that the Order of St John (dedicated to St John the Baptist) was founded in Jerusalem, to care for pilgrims. It later moved to Malta, and its emblem, seen on the uniform of SJA volunteers is an eight pointed Maltese Cross embellished with lions and unicorns. Today, the charity is active over 40 countries with a mission to prevent and relieve sickness and injury and to act to enhance the wellbeing of people anywhere in the world. IN THE KITCHEN

Peach Melba and strawberry upside-down cake

Preheat oven and prepare cake tin as per Step 2 of the passionfruit upside-down cake (see recipe, left). Drain 825g can sliced peaches and arrange over base of prepared tin (fresh sliced peaches can also be used, if preferred). Make cake batter as per Step 4 of passionfruit cake recipe using 170g butter, 3/4 cup caster sugar and 2 tsp vanilla extract. Add 2 eggs, 1 at a time, beating after each addition. Sift 2 cups self-raising flour over batter. Hull, chop and puree 125g strawberries. Add ½ cup milk and ½ of the pureed strawberries to batter, then stir to combine. Spoon onto peach slices in tin and bake for 50-55 minutes or until cooked when tested with a skewer. Turn out cake onto a serving plate. Arrange an extra 125g strawberries on top of cake and dust with a little icing sugar. Serve with freshly whipped cream or double-thick cream and remaining pureed stawberries on the side.

Grease six 1-cup capacity freezer-proof moulds and line base and side with plastic wrap. Spoon 1/2 cup softened store-bought berry sorbet into base of each mould and freeze for 30 minutes. Spoon 1/2 cup softened store-bought vanilla ice-cream in each mould, on top of sorbet. Freeze for 6 hours or overnight. Turn out onto serving plates, discarding plastic. Drizzle with combined 100g melted dark chocolate and 2 tsp vegetable oii. Top with fresh berries and dust with icing sugar to serve.



MAKE IT AHEAD Lime and coconut ice-cream balis

Roughly mash 1 kg softened goodquality vanilla ice-cream. Add 1 cup toasted shredded coconut and finely grated zest and juice of 2 limes. Stir to combine. Freeze for 2 hours, then form mixture into small balls and roll in extra toasted shredded coconut. Put on an even tray lined with baking paper and return to freezer for at least 4 hours or until firm. Serve.

Factsheet Movement of Agricultural Machinery

Introduction of the new heavy vehicle pilot licence does not change any requirements for the safe movement of agricultural machinery.

There has been some misleading information circulating recently regarding alleged impacts on the agricultural industry resulting from the introduction of the Heavy Vehicle Pilot Licence. The changes that take effect after 28 November 2017 will have no substantial impact on the agricultural industry as measures are in place to ensure continuance of the pragmatic approach to the movement of agricultural machinery which has been in place for a number of years.

The vast majority of the agricultural sector is aware there has never been a blanket exemption from the requirement for heavy vehicle pilots when moving agricultural machinery. There are, however, concessions whereby some machinery can be moved by a pilot (as opposed to an accredited pilot or heavy vehicle licensed pilot). The general rules around movement of agricultural machinery, which continue to be in place up to 28 November are summarised in the table below:

Pre November 2016 to 28 November 2017

Oversize Agricultural Vehicle	No Pilot Required	Pilot/s Required – Exemption from Pilot Accreditation	Accredited Pilot /s Required
≤3.7m Wide	X

Vehicles greater than 6m wide require additional safety measures which may include traffic escort wardens as stated on the relevant permits.

In November 2016, legislation was introduced requiring all pilots to be licensed. This change was introduced following consultation with the WA transport and Pilot industries to assist in

improving safety standards and the professional status of heavy vehicle pilots. A 12 month transition period was deployed to enable accredited pilots to become licensed with the transition period ending on 28 November 2017.

In order to ensure continuity of the practical approach adopted for movement of some agricultural machinery a Notice has been prepared and will be gazetted on 28 November. This Notice will authorise licensed drivers who are not licensed heavy vehicle pilots to drive pilot vehicles for the purpose of escorting some agricultural machinery.

The effect of the legislation relating to licensed heavy vehicle pilots combined with this Notice results in the general rules for movement of agricultural machinery as summarised in the table below:

From 29 November 2017

Oversize Agricultural Vehicle	No Pilot Required	Agricultural Pilot	Licenced Pilot Required
≤3.7m Wide >3.7m ≤6:0m Wide *Local Move Only	T. X	X	
>3.7m ≤6.0m Wide	Lifting		X

Vehicles greater than 6m wide still require additional safety measures which may include traffic escort wardens as stated on the relevant permits. There has therefore been no change in the requirements for safe movement of agricultural machinery.

*Local move: movement using primarily local government roads where the distance between he point of origin and the destination is no greater than 100km.
