

"See that can of axle grease over there? Coat your gun with it."


The young man smeared some of the grease on the barrel of his gun.

Slow Cooker Corn Chowder. (Yummy)

Ingredients:

1 tbl Vegetable Oil

1/2 cup finely chopped celery (1 stalk)

3 cups peeled and cubed potatoes (500 gm)

1 bay leaf

3/4 tsp salt

4 cups frozen whole kernel corn.

2 tbl white wine

1 tbl fresh thyme

1 cup Finely chopped carrots (2 medium)

1/3 cup finely chopped onion (1small)

3 cups chicken broth

3/4 tsp dried thyme, crushed.

1/8 tsp paprika

2 cups milk

3 tbl Cornflour

4 rashers bacon (cooked and crumbled)

Directions:

1. Heat oil, add carrots, celery and onion, cook until tender, stirring occasionally. Transfer into slow cooker. Stir in potatoes, broth, bay leaf, salt, dried thyme and paprika.

2. Cook on low setting about 3 hrs or until potatoes are tender. Stir in corn and milk. Cover and cook about

1 hr until heated through.

3. Mix wine and cornflour and stir in, along with fresh thyme, cook 10 mins.

4. Mash potatoes until soup is slightly thickened. Sprinkle each serving with crumbled bacon and cracked pepper.

Chicken & Asparagus Skillet Supper. (Quick & Easy)

Ingredients:

8 Skinless, boned chicken thighs.

1/2 cup chicken stock.

1 small yellow squash, cut in strips.

3 Rashers bacon, coarsely chopped.

500gm asparagus spears, trimmed.

4 spring onions cut in 2 inch pieces.

Directions:

Sprinkle chicken with salt and pepper, and fry with bacon until browned. Add broth, cover and cook a further 5 mins.

Meanwhile, microwave asparagus, squash with 2 tabs water for 3 to 5 mins, until vegies are crisp-tender, stirring once. Serve all together. Makes 4 servings.

GARDENING TIPS.

Garden jobs to do now:

Prune back geraniums and spray for fungal diseases after pruning.

Finish hydrangea pruning. This month start blueing tonic for blue flowers.

Lightly prune fuchsia plants, renew soil if growing in pots or hanging baskets.


ONE MEAL BETWEEN TWO
