


ADULT FICTION





Lemon Chicken

The secret to this lemon chicken recipe is the marinade: it offers the perfect balance of citrus and savoury flavours Ingredients

6 (about 120g each) free-range chicken breast 1 tablespoon fresh rosemary leaves 2 garlic cloves, chopped 1 eschallot (shallot), finely chopped Juice and zest of 1 lemon 1/2 cup extra virgin olive oil



Method

Place chicken in a shallow dish. In a separate bowl, combine rosemary, garlic, eschallot and lemon rind and juice.

Whisk in the olive oil, then pour over the chicken. Cover and leave to marinate in the fridge overnight.

Preheat the oven to 180°C.

Remove the chicken from the marinade, place on a lightly greased roasting tray and bake for 25 minutes or until cooked through.

Meanwhile, place marinade in a saucepan and whisk over low heat until slightly reduced and thickened. Serve chicken with the sauce, the herb garden salad and couscous salad.

Lemon Curd



Ingredients

2 eggs, plus 2 egg yolks 3/4 cup (165g) caster sugar 1/3 cup (80g) chilled unsalted butter Zest and juice of 2 lemons

Method

Whisk whole eggs, yolks and sugar in a saucepan until smooth, then place pan over a low heat. Add the butter, juice and zest and whisk continuously until thickened. Strain through a sieve into a sterilised jar. Lemon curd keeps, covered, in the fridge for 2 weeks.

A few tips for sustainable gardens.....

- Use deciduous plants to shade the westerly side of the house which can reduce the internal temperatures considerably. Grapevines are an ideal choice as they are fast growing and have the added bonus of fruit. If fruit is not required use the ornamental variety.
- Apply controlled-release fertilisers which release gradually through moisture and temperature. There is minimum wastage as the nutrients are absorbed by the plants as they are released.
- When deciding what to plant in your garden go to the Water-wise plants for WA list which is on the Water Corporations website.
- Improving soil is the most effective way to save water. Adding organic matter compost or soil improver will hold water around the plant roots, where it is needed
