






Welcome here today to celebrate the life of Konky Meir.

Hendricus Fransiscus Nicolaas Weterings

He was born on 12th October, 1936 in Rotterdam Holland and passed away in Narrogin on the 6th March, 2019 at 82½ years old.

Konk came to Australia in 1954 on a ship named "yhon Van Onder Barneveld" and he sailed to Australia with his Father who was the captain of the ship.

Konk got off the ship in South Australia and never returned to Holland. He made his way across to Western Australia and lived and worked in this area most of his life and there wouldn't be many around Wickepin, Yealering or Narrogin that wouldn't know of Konky.

He was a very good shearer and shore from Beverley to Albany. He worked sometimes for Bruce Wright in Mount Barker but mainly for Vilma and Phil Pauley who farmed East of Wickepin and Lake Biddy but mostly around Yealering and Wickepin was where he stayed.

Konk stayed in the Yealering Caravan Park for many years. He loved playing his guitar and singing, country music of course. He didn't mind a sip of wine or port and a good game of Jackpot, 50 cents was his limit. He didn't mind a punt on the horses too.

Konk called everyone Konk as well, how he came up with Konk or Konky, no one seems to know. He would say to Eric, you remember that bloke, Narrogin Konk? Eric would be scratching his head trying to think of which person Konky was referring to!

He loved dogs and little George here was his last dog and was his constant companion, on or off the gopher. Early days, Konk had a goat named Billy and would travel into town with Billy buckled up sitting on the front seat, confusing everyone who saw him and were trying to work out who was with him.

Konky was father to Tony, Harry, Richard, Nathan – deceased, Naomi, Lawrence.

Konk was fun loving, kind hearted, straight forward and said what he thought, a character, one of a kind. His friends have fond memories of Konk over the many years they knew him. They can honestly say that he lived his life to the fullest.

Harry was a real character; he could turn his hand to anything and was a willing worker.





Dukkah chicken and quinoa salad

- 1 cup quinoa, rinsed
- Olive oil cooking spray
- 2 medium carrots, peeled, diced
- 2 chicken breast fillets, trimmed, halved horizontally
- 2 tablespoons pistachio dukkah
- 1/3 cup orange juice
- 1/3 cup finely chopped fresh flat-leaf parsley leaves
- 1/4 cup shredded fresh mint leaves
- 2 green onions, finely sliced
- 2 teaspoons extra-virgin olive oil



Place quinoa and 2 cups cold water in a saucepan over high heat. Bring to the boil. Reduce heat to low. Simmer, covered, for 10 minutes or until water has absorbed and guinoa is tender. Rinse. Drain.

Meanwhile, lightly spray a frying pan with oil. Heat over medium-high heat. Cook carrot, stirring, for 5 minutes or until just tender. Transfer to a bowl.

Place chicken on a plate. Sprinkle both sides with dukkah. Cook chicken in pan over medium heat for 5 to 6 minutes each side or until golden and cooked through.

Combine quinoa, orange juice, parsley, mint, onion, oil and carrot in a bowl. Season with pepper. Toss to combine. Serve chicken with quinoa salad.

Apple and Fig tart

- 2 cups (300g) plain flour
- 1/4 cup (60g) caster sugar
- 150g butter, chopped
- 2 tablespoons iced water
- 3 Granny Smith apples, core removed
- 2 tablespoons caster sugar, extra

- 1 fig, quartered into wedges
- 2 tablespoons almond meal
- Extra fig slices, to decorate (optional)
- 3 teaspoons honey, plus extra to drizzle
- Reduced fat thickened cream, to serve

Mix flour, caster sugar and butter until coarse crumbs form. Add water. Process just until mixture starts to come together. Wrap the dough in plastic. Refrigerate for 30 minutes. Preheat oven to 180°C. Roll dough out on non-stick baking paper or on a lightly floured surface until 5mm thick. Use pastry to line a 20cm fluted flan tin with a removable base. Trim the edge and prick base with a fork. Line with non-stick baking paper and fill with rice or baking beans. Bake for 10 minutes. Remove paper and rice. Bake for another 8 minutes. (If base puffs up slightly, push down very gently with the end of a wooden spoon.) Thinly slice apples and toss with the extra caster sugar. Cut each fig quarter lengthways into three thin wedges. Sprinkle almond meal over the pastry base. Arrange the apple in a spiral to make two layers of apple. Reserve the smaller pieces to fill the space in the middle. Arrange figs evenly over the top layer by tucking them between the apples. Place extra fig slices in the middle section if desired. Drizzle apples and figs with the honey. Bake for 30 minutes. Drizzle with extra honey and brush over the fruit. Set aside to cool slightly. Serve with cream.



Things to do in the garden

Spring flowering bulbs should be planted now. Put tulips in crisper in the fridge and plant in May. Feed roses after a light pruning for winter flowers, a dose of Sulphate of Potash is beneficial.
