IN THE KITCHEN

Amaretti biscuits

So simple and so effective, these soft biscuits could also be petits fours.

MAKES: 12

- 1 egg white
- 50g (1½0z) soft light brown sugar
- [♠] 75g (2½oz) golden icing sugar
- 225g (8oz) ground almonds
- Zest of 1 lemon
- 2tbsp Amaretto liqueur

Heat the oven to 180C/Gas 4. Whisk the egg white to stiff peaks, add a pinch of salt and the sugar a spoon at a time while whisking until the egg white is thick and glossy. Fold in 50g icing sugar, the ground almonds, lemon zest and Amaretto liqueur.

In your hands, roll the mixture \angle into 12 balls and roll in the remaining icing sugar. Leave in the icing sugar for 5 mins and then place on a baking tray, sprinkling over any remaining sugar.

3 Bake for 12 mins then cool on the baking tray.

1 Fry the chicken legs until they're well browned and almost cooked

through - about 10-12 mins a side, on a medium heat. Set aside to rest.

Try the spring onions, remove and set aside. Fry the onion for 10 mins until translucent. Add the garlic, cook for another min, then stir in the stock cube, cream and water.

Return the chicken to the) pan and cook for 15 mins to heat through and finish cooking the meat. Top with the spring onions to serve.
