


When Strangers Meet.

On the 17 of July Greg briefly met Mort in Narrogin and was able to pass the above story on.







In a Nutshell....

Plants for Free can be done at any time of the year, depending on the cutting you are working with.

In a Nutshell, It's not that hard to do.

- 1. Water your "Mother" plant the day before if possible
- 2. Select strong, disease free stems and each cutting should be long enough to have one "Node" above the ground and at least one, preferably more, "Nodes" below the ground when potted. (A "Node" is the growing point from where leaves and shoots originate)
- 3. Trim the top of the cutting to "just above a node" and trim the base to "just below a node".
- 4. Gently strip the cutting of leaves from lower half, and if the top leaves are large, then cut them in half to prevent moisture loss and force energy to the bottom to form shoots.
- 5. Dunk cuttings in a very weak solution of vinegar or bleach for 10-20 minutes before planting to kill fungal spores and reduce infections.
- 6. Dip base in honey or hormone powder to encourage faster root development.
- 7. Plant in pot with potting mix, using a stick to make a hole, thus preventing wounds (and infections) to the cutting by just "pushing" it in
- 8. Water in and cover with plastic bag, or a plastic water bottle with the neck cut off. This prevents drying out whilst the roots develop.
- 9. Watering should not be needed as long as mix stays "just moist". New growth should appear from 4-8 weeks (some take longer), when you can open the bag to reduce humidity and "harden off" your new plant, ready for potting on into a bigger pot, or into your garden.



500g linguine

2/3 cup white wine 3/4 cup chicken stock

Lemon Chicken with Basil and Linguine

grated zest of 1 large lemon

2 garlic cloves

2 tbsp basil flavoured extra olive oil

4 tbsp freshly chopped basil

salt and ground black pepper

500g skinless boneless chicken breast

1 onion, peeled finely chopped

3 celery stalks

1 1/2 cups mushrooms

Method

Blend the lemon zest and juice, garlic, 2tbsp basil and salt and pepper in a large bowl. Add the chicken, chopped in bite size pieces and toss well. Allow to stand for 1 hour, stir occasionally. Heat the remaining oil in a large non-stick frying pan, then add the onion and cook for 3-4 minutes until slightly softened. Using a slotted spoon, drain the chicken pieces and add to frying pan, reserve the marinade. Cook the chicken for 2-3 minutes until golden brown, then add the trimmed and thinly sliced celery, and halved mushrooms and cook for another 2-3 minutes.

Sprinkle in the flour and stir until chicken and vegetables are coated. Gradually stir in the wine until a sauce forms, then stir in the stock and reserved marinade. Bring to boil, stir constantly. Bring a large saucepan of lightly salted water to the boil, add linguine and simmer for 7-10 minutes until *al dente*. Drain well and turn into large serving bowl, pour over the sauce and garnish with lemon zest and fresh basil leaves. Serve immediately



Marinade Meat

If you have tough, chewy meat then you can marinade it in lemon juice overnight. The juice will break down muscle tissue, making the meat much more tender. The flavour enhancing lemon will also add to any meat dish, especially those using chicken or lamb. Try using a marinade of lemon juice, olive oil and oregano for barbecue meat.

Make sour milk

To make sour milk or sour cream, squeeze a little lemon into fresh milk or cream.

Whip Cream

When whipping cream just won't whip, add a few drops of lemon juice to solve the problem.

Soften Brown Sugar

Add lemon peel, making sure that all the pith and pulp have been removed to brown sugar. It will help keep the sugar moist and easier to use or blend.

Keep Lettuce Crisp

Lemon juice can be used to stop lettuce from going limp or browning after it has been cut. To revive lettuce drop it into a bowl of cold water that has had the juice of half a lemon added. Put the bowl onto the refrigerator for an hour and the lettuce will be fresh and crisp again.

Lemon Curd

Lemon curd is a useful addition to a number of recipes.

125g unsalted butter juice and zest of 3 lemons

ugar

1 cup caster sugar


6 egg yolks

Melt butter in a saucepan and whisk in lemon juice, zest and sugar.

Add the egg yolks and whisk until mixture is smooth.

Continue to heat and stir for up to 15 minutes until the consistency
