CBH SITE AT WICKEPIN

On Friday morning 1st November, about 20 people met at the newly refurbished CBH site at Wickepin at 8:00am.

Sarah Hyde from the Facey Group organised area manager Brad Bootsma and the OIC for Wickepin, Craig Dicks to explain the new layout and traffic flow. This includes a new assembly/parking area for trucks, the relocation of the sampling shed, a new weigh bridge, 4 new bulk heads, and the relocation of the old



weighbridge. Trucks will now enter from one way over 1 weighbridge and leave over a different weighbridge in another direction. Please follow the signs and be mindful of people being "lost" for a while.

The new bulkheads are 350 metres long and 1.8 metres higher and have a capacity of 130,000 tonnes taking the new total to 210,000 tonnes at the site. The facility will be open 7 days a week.



The sampling hut has 2 automatic spears with provision for a third person to sample manually. There is a slight slope up to the new weigh bridge and drivers will work out how their outfit will handle this.

The new grids have a 540 tonnes per hour capacity and have had a fairly rigorous trial workout.

Canola will still be handled in the old section.

The site will be receiving 3 segregations of malting barley, 4 segregations of wheat and 1 segregation of canola.

Following the tour of the site Sarah invited everyone to the Facey Group for morning tea.

The mini village that Valmec built with five transportable units was removed on Tuesday. The units were used for offices, ablution blocks, and meals/rest areas. The staff mainly lived in rented accommodation in Narrogin and commuted daily.

There was a 37KVA generator which ran 24/7 for the time that they were here. This was a very quiet unit. It has now been replaced by the machinery shifting grain and the loaders and graders replaced by the sound of trucks.

Following the theft of copper wiring from the Noman's Lake CBH facility it will not be opening at all this season and that will mean the earlier than anticipated permanent closure of this site.



Garden Snippets...



Organic Potions...



If you are looking for an alternative to spraying toxic chemicals in the garden, try a Homemade Brew, where you don't have to don a spray suit or protective gear when getting rid of pests and fungal problems. Here we look at a small selection of safe and effective organic sprays that can easily be made at home. They are harmful to pests (that is the aim) but are safe for children, pets, wildlife and your soil.

The Residual in all of these recipes is very short-lived. Once in the soil they bio-degrade rapidly and harmlessly, which means they are only effective until heavy rain or irrigation occurs, after which they need to be re-applied. Give them a go!

<u>Vinegar Algaecide:</u> Kills green algae which forms on walls and paintwork from using "hose-on fertilisers". Make it by diluting one part white vinegar to three parts water. Spray onto affected areas until at "drip point". The acetic acid in vinegar will kill and bleach the algae and will inhibit further algae growth during dry weather.

<u>Coffee Snail Killer:</u> Lethal to snails and slugs. Make it by diluting one part expresso coffee with ten parts water (Use caffeine-rich expresso coffee, as Instant, De-caf or Re-used coffee grounds are too weak to be effective). Spray the brew onto foliage to "drip-point" and on the soil surface where snails and slugs travel. The pests absorb the caffeine through their mucous membrane and die.

Organic Fungicides: Fungal diseases such as powdery mildew and black spot are best treated by applying fungicides before any sign of the diseases. Chemical fungicides are easily washed off plants, and can harm beneficial fungi in the soil. Try instead the following two homemade fungicides, which can easily be made from household ingredients.

<u>Milk Fungicide:</u> Useful for preventing various types of mildew in vegetables, roses, grapes and begonias. Make it by diluting one part (Full cream un-homogenised or organic) milk with ten parts water. Apply using an atomiser or pump spray in the cool of the morning, and make sure to coat both sides of leaves and stems to "drip-point". It is the antibiotic quality of the whole milk that does the trick.

Bicarb Fungicide: Useful for preventing powdery mildew, black spot and rust on roses, and powdery mildew on peas. It is harmless to insects like predatory wasps and ladybirds that control aphids. Make it by adding two teaspoons bi-carb soda, one drop of horticultural or vegetable oil and a drop of bio-degradable washing up liquid to one litre of water. Shake well to dissolve to bi-carb soda. Apply as per above with the milk fungicide. The detergent helps to spread the mix for even coverage. As the mix dries the oil sticks the bi-carb to the leaf and makes the leaf surface alkaline, which deters the germination of spores.

Christmas Cookery- salads for the festive seasor

Mango and cabbage salad with lime and jalapeno dressing

Ingredients

1/2 red cabbage, shredded

200g snow peas, trimmed, thinly sliced

1 carrot, peeled, thinly sliced into matchsticks

3 green onions, thinly sliced diagonally

3/4 cup fresh coriander leaves

3/4 cup fresh mint leaves

2 mangoes sliced

Method

Make Lime and Jalapeño Dressing. Place oil, lime juice, jalapeño and sugar in a small bowl.

Season with salt and pepper. Whisk until sugar has dissolved.

Place the cabbage, snow peas, carrot, onion, coriander and mint in a large bowl. Toss to combine. Add mango and

dressing. Gently toss to combine. Serve immediately

Lime and Jalapeño Dressing

2 tablespoons rice bran oil

1/3 cup lime juice

1 tablespoon finely chopped pickled jalapeño

1 teaspoon caster sugar

Cranberry, chorizo and orange couscous salad **Ingredients**

150g fresh chorizo sausage, skin removed, diced

2 red onions, cut into wedges

2 cups Massel chicken style liquid stock

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1 teaspoon salt

1 1/4 cups orange juice

3 cups couscous

1 cup dried cranberries

1 cup pistachio kernels, lightly toasted, coarsely

chopped

1/3 cup chopped fresh coriander

1/4 cup extra virgin olive oil

Method

Heat a large non-stick frying pan over medium heat. Add the chorizo and cook, stirring often, for 2-3 minutes or until crisp and the oil is released. Use a slotted spoon to transfer to a large bowl. Add onion to the pan. Cook, stirring often, for 10 minutes or until soft. Add onion to chorizo.

Meanwhile, place the stock, cinnamon, salt and 1 cup of the orange juice in a saucepan. Bring to the boil. Add couscous, stir once, then remove from the heat. Cover and set aside for 10 minutes to soak. Use a fork to separate the grains. Add the couscous, cranberries, pistachio and coriander to the chorizo mixture. Mix until well combined. Whisk the oil and remaining orange juice in a small bowl. Add to couscous salad.

Toss gently to combine.

Shortbread

Ingredients 250g butter, softened 1 cup pure icing sugar 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Christmas Shortbread 2 1/4 cups plain flour 1/4 cup cornflour

1 eggwhite, lightly beaten

2 tablespoons white sugar

Method

Line 2 flat baking trays with baking paper. Draw an 18cm circle in the centre of each sheet of baking paper. Turn paper over so that markings face down.

Using an electric mixer, beat butter, icing sugar and vanilla until pale and creamy. Sift flour and cornflour over butter mixture. Stir until a soft dough forms. Turn onto a lightly floured surface. Knead dough until smooth.

Divide dough in half. Gently press each piece into a 10cm (diameter) disc. Place shortbread discs on baking trays. Using circles on paper as a guide, gently press shortbread out with your fingers to form a 1.5cm-thick, 18cm (diameter) round.


Pinch the edge of each round to form a frill. Score 8 triangles in each shortbread round (do not cut through dough). Refrigerate for 15 minutes or until firm.

Preheat oven to 160°C. Brush shortbread with eggwhite and sprinkle with sugar. Bake for 30 to 35 minutes, swapping trays after 15 minutes, or until shortbread is light golden and firm to the touch. Allow to cool completely on trays. To serve, use a sharp knife to cut through markings.
